## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of Regulations of the Private Investigator's Licensing Board

The Private Investigator's Licensing Board will hold a public hearing at 1:00pm., on the 20th of June of 2014 at the Grant Sawyer State Office Building, 555 E. Washington Ave., Attorney General Conference Room, Suite 4500, Las Vegas, NV 89703 and will be video conferenced at the Office of the Attorney General, 100 North Carson Street, Mock Courtroom, Carson City, NV 89701. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulations that pertain to chapter 648 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

- 1. This regulation is needed to provide clarification for the term "principal place of business." The purpose of this proposed regulation is to provide interpretation of the meaning of "principal place of business" for licensees of the Board; prohibiting the use of a home as a principal place of business in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- 3. There is no estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public. There are no estimated adverse effects of this regulation. The regulation will benefit licensees by clarifying that a licensee can maintain a principal place of business at his or her home, if the home is located in this state, or may maintain one through a shared office approach. It will also enable the Board to audit out-of-state licensees in an efficient and cost saving measure. Immediate effects are that licensees will have clarification of what a principal place of business means, long-term effects are that licensees, whether in-state or out-of-state will have options available to them of where they may maintain a principal place of business.
- 4. Staff reviewed the proposed regulation and potential economic effect to **businesses** and found no adverse impact. Staff found that this proposed regulation will provide benefits, both immediate and in the long-term, by providing licensees with options for their principal place of business. Staff reviewed the regulation and potential economic effect to the **public** and found no adverse impact. - 5. This proposed regulation was reviewed and discussed with Board staff and the Office of the Attorney General, Board Counsel in determining the impact on small businesses.
- There is no estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

- 7. There are no regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates.
- 8. This proposed regulation is not required pursuant to federal law.
- 9. This proposed regulation does not include provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, a summary of such provisions.
- 10. This proposed regulation does not establish a new fee or increase in existing fees.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Private Investigator's Licensing Board may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to the Private Investigators Licensing Board, Attention: Kevin Ingram, 3110 S. Durango Drive, Suite 202, Las Vegas, Nevada 89117. Written submissions must be received by the Private Investigator's Licensing Board on or before June 18, 2014. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Private Investigator's Licensing Board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
