Alzheimer's Disease Supportive Services Programs (ADSSP)





ADSSP

- Federally-funded program
- Expand the availability of diagnostic and support services for persons with Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders (ADRD) and their families
- Improve the responsiveness of the home and community-based care system
- Focuses on service for hard-to-reach and underserviced persons

- Focus on high stress caregivers
- Special emphasis on:
 - Those with low income
 - Minority and rural communities
 - Limited English speaking proficiency



- 1. The Alzheimer's Association- Northern Nevada Northern California
 - Teamed up with Nevada Hispanic Services (NHS) to expand services to Latino/Hispanic families



Services Include:

- Outreach
- Respite vouchers
- Information and advocacy
- Support groups
- Training for professionals and caregivers

- 2. The Alzheimer's Association- Desert Southwest
- Services Include:
 - Respite vouchers to Alzheimer's/dementia caregivers
 - Helpline- 24/7 for information and referral
 - Support groups for caregivers
 - Education for community, families and professionals
 - Safe return program

The University of Nevada Reno Caregiver Support Center Partnership

Services Include:

- Training in evidence based dementia care

Volunteer Programs

- Senior Companions provide supportive services and companionship for seniors
- Supportive Services include:
 - Grocery shopping
 - Meal preparation
 - Assistance with light chores
 - Transportation
 - Bill paying
 - Socialization activities
 - Respite for caregivers

Home and Community Based Service Programs

- For individuals at risk of being placed or currently living in a facility for long-term care
- Services provided to keep individuals in their homes to age in place
- Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) Medicaid waiver services

Long Term Care Ombudsmen Program

- Investigate and resolve complaints made by or on behalf of older individuals who are residents of long term care facilities
- Advocating on behalf of the residents
- Valuable resource for residents, families and community members

Out-of-State Task Force on Long Term Care

 Concerned with placement of elderly and fragile Nevadans in nursing homes located out of state

 Few long term beds are available in Nevada for individuals with behavioral problems
