LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS AS REQUIRED BY NRS 233B.066

LCB FILE R067-17

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 640A.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The need for the adopted regulations is to protect the public health, safety and welfare by ensuring that only qualified and competent occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants are licensed in the state.

The purpose of the adopted regulation is to provide clarity for the public, individuals and licensees through regulations.

The adopted regulation revises certain provisions relating to the licensing of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants; revises provisions relating to continuing education requirements for occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants; revises provisions relating to payments made to the Board of Occupational Therapy; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Copies of the proposed regulation, notice of workshop and notice of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by e-mail and U.S. mail to persons who were known to have an interest in occupational therapy as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. A Workshop was held to solicit comments on the proposed regulations on **August 12, 2017**. There were five (5) individuals from the public in attendance at the workshop, and one (1) written comment was received. Thereafter, on or about **February 20**, 2018 a Notice of Intent to Act Upon Regulations was issued.

A Public Hearing was held on **March 24, 2018.** There were three (3) written comments received and there were twenty-four (24) interested parties in attendance; eleven (11) individuals provided oral comments at the Public Hearing.

The Board of Occupational Therapy adopted the regulation on **March 24, 2018**. Public Comments received at the public workshop and public hearing where considered and revisions were made and adopted in the regulation.

The adopted regulations will benefit the occupational therapy practitioners and the public by providing clarifications to the regulations.

Immediate effect will be improved administration through clarification of existing law and regulatory requirements. Long-term effect will be clarity and consistency in regulation and licensing of occupational therapy practitioners in Nevada.

8. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the adopted regulations.

There are no additional costs involved in the enforcement of these adopted regulations.

A description of any regulations of other state or government agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. If the regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, the name of the regulating federal agency.

The Board of Occupational Therapy is not aware of any similar regulations of other state or government agencies that the adopted regulations overlap or duplicate.

The Board of Occupational Therapy is not aware of any similar federal regulations of the same activity in which the adopted regulations are more stringent.

The regulation does not provide for any new or increased fees. The regulation does revise the term of a standard license to 2 years, effectively decreasing renewal fees for licensees as a result.
