14	NAC 385B.750 Requirements for pupils; imposition of stricter requirements by
15	school. (NRS 385B.060) To be eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, a pupil must
16	comply with the academic requirements set forth in <u>NAC 385B.750</u> to <u>385B.770</u> ,
47	inclusive. A

- 2. When interscholastic events sanctioned by the Association are scheduled prior 1 to the

- 4 sanctioned events are scheduled after the conclusion of classes for a school year, a pupil's
- enrollment in the just concluded grading period is the basis for determining eligibility 5
- 6 accordance with this section.

8 (NEW) NAC 385B.756 Posting of grades; determination of eligibility.

- Eligibility under the provisions of NAC 385B.754 is determined when grades are 9
- posted. Grades are "posted" when the school registrar, or other person(s) responsible 10 to do so.
- enter all grades electronically and those grades are available to pupils, parents and 11 teachers.
- In no case may the posting date be more than five school days following the last day of 12
- grading period. Except as provided in subsection 2 and NAC 385B.764, grade changes 13
- the posting date shall not restore lost eligibility. 14
- 15 2. For the purposes of meeting the requirements set forth in NAC 385B.754, a grade of
- 16 "incomplete" (I), "no credit" (NC), or "no grade" (NG) is not a passing grade and is to
- considered as a failing grade until made up. Even if a grading system does not count 17
- grades as part of a G.P.A., these grades are to be included in calculating a pupil's 18 G.P.A. for
- the purposes of eligibility until the grade is made up. Once the grade is made up, the 19
- 20 grade earned replaces the I, NC, or NG grade and the G.P.A. is to be recalculated using the
- 21 new grade.

- (NEW) NAC 385B.758 Duration of ineligibility for failure to meet 23 minimum
- academic requirements; Outside credit 24
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a pupil who fails to meet the 25

- minimum
- requirements set forth in NAC 385B.750 to 385B.770, inclusive, shall be ineligible to
- 27 participate in an interscholastic event sanctioned by the Association, including, without
- 28 limitation, a scrimmage, game, meet or contest, throughout the next grading period.
- 29 <u>2. A pupil described in subsection 1 may regain eligibility prior to the conclusion</u> of the
- 30 next grading period if at an interim progress review conducted in accordance with NAC
- 31 <u>385B.760 the pupil meets the requirements for eligibility of that progress review. A pupil who</u>
- 32 <u>regains eligibility pursuant to this subsection and then fails to meet the requirements</u> for
- 33 <u>eligibility in a subsequent interim progress review during the grading period shall be</u> ineligible
- 34 <u>until the student meets the requirements of an interim progress review at a subsequent</u> review
- 35 <u>or until the posting of grades for the grading period, whichever occurs first. A pupil</u> <u>described</u>
- in subsection 1 is not entitled to a probationary week pursuant to NAC 385B.760.
- 37 3. A pupil may apply as much as one unit of credit earned by the pupil in a
- 38 <u>correspondence course, summer school, night school or any other school, including,</u> without
- 39 <u>limitation, a postsecondary educational institution, toward the satisfaction of the</u> requirements
- 40 set forth in NAC 385B.754 if the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled
- 41 indicates in writing that the course qualifies for credit for the pupil's requirements for
- 42 graduation and the credit was earned during or following the grading period in which the

- 1 <u>pupil was deficient. In calculating G.P.A., for the purposes of eligibility, grades earned</u> in the
- 2 <u>same subject area may replace those earned previously. When not replacing a grade,</u> the new
- 3 grade will be considered as an additional class with all others in the grading period.
 When
- 4 <u>replacing a failing grade, the new grade must be in the same subject area.</u>
- 5 <u>4. Any course taken, or unit of credit received by a pupil pursuant to subsection 3</u>
- 6 <u>becomes a part of the pupil's academic record and, after the grade for the course or unit of</u>
- 7 <u>credit is recorded on his or her transcript, applies to the requirements for academic eligibility</u>
- 8 to participate in a sanctioned sport.
- 9 <u>5. A school shall ensure that each course or unit of credit in which a pupil who</u>
- 10 participates in a sanctioned sport is enrolled is reviewed in accordance with the provisions
- 11 <u>of NAC 385B.754 and NAC 385B.760 to determine academic eligibility to participate in a</u>
- 12 *sanctioned sport.*

- 14 (NEW) NAC 385B.760 Continual review of academic progress; interim progress
- 15 *reviews*.
- 16 <u>1. NIAA Member schools shall, for the period during which a pupil participates in a</u>
- 17 <u>sanctioned sport, continually review the academic progress of that pupil in accordance</u> with
- 18 *the provisions of this section.*
- 19 <u>2. Each pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at an NIAA member school</u> must
- 20 <u>maintain a passing grade for each course he or she takes during the season. The school</u> shall,
- 21 in accordance with this section, review the pupil's progress in each course at an interim
- 22 <u>progress review. An interim progress review shall be conducted at intervals as set forth</u> <u>in</u>
- 23 <u>subsection 11. The interim progress review shall include, in addition to courses taken</u> at the
- 24 <u>school, review of any vocational, magnet, on-line, college, night or other courses taken</u> for
- 25 credit toward graduation by the pupil at a school other than the school where the pupil
- 26 participates in a sanctioned sport.
- 27 <u>3. Each interim progress review must indicate the pupil's academic status for the period</u>

- 28 <u>beginning on the first day of the semester or equivalent or on the first day of the</u> grading
- 29 <u>period and ending on the date on which the review is conducted and must be</u> <u>determined in</u>
- 30 accordance with the regulations of the school district in which the school is located.
- 31 <u>4. If an interim progress review demonstrates that an otherwise eligible pupil is</u> failing a
- 32 <u>class, the school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation for 1</u> week. A
- 33 <u>pupil who is placed on probation remains eligible to participate in the sanctioned sport</u> in
- 34 which he or she participates during the probationary week and must be reviewed on the last
- 35 <u>school day of the probationary week.</u>
- 5. If a pupil who is placed on probation pursuant to subsection 4 has a failing grade at
- 37 the review conducted on the last school day of the probationary week, the school that
- 38 <u>conducted the review shall declare the pupil to be ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport</u>
- 39 <u>for the period beginning on the Monday after the review and concluding at the end of</u> the day
- 40 on the first Saturday after that Monday.
- 41 <u>6. If a pupil is declared ineligible after the probationary week, the school shall conduct a</u>
- 42 <u>review of the pupil each week until the pupil becomes eligible, regardless of whether</u> that

- 1 period extends beyond the next scheduled interim progress review. If the pupil becomes
- 2 <u>eligible, the pupil must be reviewed at the next regularly scheduled interim progress</u> <u>review</u>
- 3 and is entitled to another probationary week of eligibility.
- 4 7. If a review is scheduled pursuant to this section for the day before a holiday or
- 5 <u>vacation for the school, and if a pupil has received a failing grade at the time the review is</u>
- 6 *conducted*:
- 7 <u>(a) The pupil remains eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport during the holiday or</u>
- 8 *vacation; and*
- 9 <u>(b) The school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation beginning on</u>
- 10 the first school day after the holiday or vacation.
- 11 <u>8. A pupil who is placed on probation for the week before a school holiday or vacation is</u>
- eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport if the school determines that the pupil has
- 13 <u>maintained passing grades in all classes at the review conducted on the last school day</u> of the
- 14 <u>probationary week and immediately before the holiday or vacation. If the school</u> determines
- 15 <u>that the pupil has not maintained passing grades in all classes after that review is conducted,</u>
- 16 the pupil is ineligible during the holiday or vacation.
- 17 <u>9. A pupil who is declared ineligible not more than 2 weeks before a school</u> holiday or
- 18 <u>vacation remains ineligible to participate in the sanctioned sport until achieving a</u> passing
- 19 grade as determined by each weekly review conducted pursuant to this section.
- 20 <u>10. If a pupil withdraws or is excluded from a class because he or she received a failing</u>
- 21 grade during a grading period, the school shall, immediately after the record of the
- 22 <u>withdrawal or exclusion becomes available, declare the pupil ineligible to participate in</u> the
- 23 <u>sanctioned sport for the period beginning on the Monday after he or she withdraws or</u> is
- 24 <u>excluded and concluding at the end of the day on the first Saturday after that Monday.</u>
 The
- 25 <u>provisions of this subsection do not exempt a pupil from complying with the requirement set</u>
- 26 forth in subsection 1 of NAC 385B.754.
- 27 <u>11. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 12 and 13, each school district or school</u>

- 28 <u>that is not part of a school district, shall establish the dates for conducting the interim progress</u>
- 29 <u>reviews required pursuant to this section based on its academic calendar for each school year.</u>
- 30 The dates shall be:
- 31 (a) The last school day in a week; and
- 32 (b) Separated from either the beginning or conclusion of a grading period by
- 33 approximately 15 school days or the equivalent; and
- 34 (c) Separated from another interim progress review by approximately 15 school days or the
- 35 *equivalent*; and
- 36 (d) Conducted no less than two times during a grading period of approximately 45 school
- 37 <u>days or the equivalent and no less than three times during a grading period of approximately</u>
- 38 <u>60 school days or the equivalent.</u>
- 12. If approved by the Executive Director, a school district may establish a date for
- 40 <u>conducting a review pursuant to this section that occurs not more than 1 week before or after</u>
- 41 any date that the school district must establish pursuant to subsection 11.

- 1 13. A school shall not conduct the first review during a school year until after the first date
- 2 on which an interscholastic game, meet or contest may be scheduled as set forth by the
- 3 schedule of activities established by the Association for that purpose.

- 5 (NEW) NAC 385B.762 Grading Period
- 6 1. For the purposes of eligibility in NIAA sanctioned sports, grading periods:
- 7 <u>(a) Shall be determined by a school district or a school if the school is not part of a</u> 8 district; and
- 9 (b) Shall not include more than one third of a school year; and
- 10 (c) May be a portion of a period over which credit is earned by a pupil; and
- 11 (d) Shall be approximately equal in length as measured by the number of school days in
- 12 <u>each grading period throughout a school year.</u>
- 2. As an example, a grading period in a semester credit system would likely consist of
- 14 <u>approximately a 45 school-day quarter and would use formative or progress grades in</u> quarters
- 15 <u>1 and 3 and summative or final grades in quarters 2 and 4. In a trimester credit system</u> it
- 16 <u>would likely be approximately a 60 school-day trimester and use all summative grades.</u>
- 17 <u>Equivalents of these in other credit systems that meet the requirements of subsection 1</u> <u>may be</u>
- 18 *used*.
- 19 3. The grades issued for a grading period may be either formative or summative.

 Except
- 20 <u>as provided in subsection 3 of NAC 385B.758, the grade point average calculated for the</u>
- 21 <u>purposes of eligibility shall only use the grades issued for the grading period in which</u> they
- 22 were obtained.

- NAC 385B.764 Change in recorded grade for pupil; completion of extra work to
- 25 improve pupil's grade. (NRS 385B.060)
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if a school records a grade for a pupil for
- 27 a [semester or any 9-week] grading period, the school or pupil shall not, after the grade is
- recorded, change the grade in a manner which establishes the academic eligibility of the pupil to

- 29 participate in a sanctioned sport at the school. The school may change a grade specified in this
- 30 subsection if the school submits evidence satisfactory to the Executive Director that the grade
- 31 was issued incorrectly.
- 2. A school shall not allow a pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at the school to
- complete any extra work to improve the pupil's grade in a course of instruction unless the school
- 34 allows all pupils in that course of instruction to complete extra work for that course of
- instruction. If a school allows a pupil to complete extra work pursuant to this subsection, the
- school shall ensure that the extra work is graded and included in the grade for the course of
- instruction *prior to the posting of grades* for the [semester or any 9-week] *grading* period. [for
- 38 the semester.

2 NAC 385B.766 Pupil who qualifies for special education services. (NRS

- 3 385B.060, 385B.090)
- 1. A pupil who qualifies for special education services pursuant to the Individuals With
- 5 Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400, et seq., or NRS 388.417 to 388.453, inclusive,
- and chapter 388 of NAC must comply with the requirements for academic eligibility that are
- 7 applicable to a pupil who is not qualified for those services.
- Any exception to the academic requirements of the Association for eligibility for participation in a sanctioned sport set forth in the individual education plan of a pupil who
- qualifies for special education services pursuant to subsection 1 may be considered by the
- Association pursuant to the provisions for appealing a pupil hardship set forth in <u>NAC</u>
- 12 <u>385B.900</u> to <u>385B.924</u>, inclusive, if the exception is based on the disability of the pupil.
- 3. Any exception specified in subsection 2 that is included in the individual education plan
- of the pupil after he or she is declared academically ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport
- may not be appealed pursuant to the provisions of <u>NAC 385B.900</u> to <u>385B.924</u>, inclusive, until
- the beginning of the next period for conducting reviews.

NAC 385B.768 Homeschooled children. (NRS 385B.060)

- 1. If a homeschooled child enrolls in a school and wishes to become eligible to participate
- in a sanctioned sport at that school, a parent or legal guardian of the homeschooled child must
- submit written evidence satisfactory to the school indicating that the homeschooled child
- received the instruction required by <u>NAC 392.035</u> and maintained a grade point average of not
- less than 2.0 for the period in which he or she was a homeschooled child.
- 2. The written evidence required pursuant to subsection 1 may consist of a statement signed
- by a parent or legal guardian of the homeschooled child attesting to the written evidence.

NAC 385B.770 Incorrect determination of grade of pupil; date of eligibility of ineligible pupil who is allowed to practice with team. (NRS 385B.060)

- 1. If a teacher of a school incorrectly determines the grade of a pupil and, because of that
- determination, the pupil becomes ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport as determined by
- 35 the principal of the school or a designee thereof, the school shall declare the pupil eligible to
- participate in the sanctioned sport immediately after the discovery of the incorrect determination.
- 2. A pupil who becomes academically ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport at a
- school during a [semester] grading period and practices with a team at that school after receiving
- approval from the principal of the school to do so becomes academically eligible to participate in
- a sanctioned sport beginning on the day the grades of the pupil are submitted to the computer

- system of the school if, on that day, the pupil is otherwise [academically] eligible to participate
- 2 in the sanctioned sport in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

NAC 385B.754 Courses and units of credit. (NRS 385B.060)

- 1. For each semester a pupil participates in a sanctioned sport, the pupil must enroll in a
- course of at least two units of credit consisting of at least four classes and regularly attend a
- school. The pupil must successfully complete a course of at least two units of credit for the
- immediately preceding semester. If a pupil fails to complete successfully the course for that
- semester, the pupil is ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport for one semester unless, for
- the grading period for the first 9 weeks of the semester that is conducted immediately after that
- semester, he or she receives a passing grade for the two units of credit for the grading period, at
- which time he or she becomes eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport for the remainder of
- that semester.

- 2. A pupil may enroll in a course for one unit of credit for each semester he or she enrolls in
- a correspondence course or attends any summer school, night school or any other school,
- including, without limitation, a postsecondary educational institution, and receive credit for the
- satisfactory completion of that course toward the satisfaction of the requirements for academic
- eligibility if the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled indicates in writing that the
- 24 course qualifies for credit for the pupil's requirements for graduation.
- 25 3. Any course taken or unit of credit received by a pupil pursuant to subsection 2 becomes a
- part of the pupil's academic record and, after the grade for the course or unit of credit is recorded
- on his or her transcript, applies to the requirements for academic eligibility to participate in a
- 28 sanctioned sport.

- 4. A school shall ensure that each course or unit of credit in which a pupil who participates
- in a sanctioned sport is enrolled is reviewed in accordance with the provisions of <u>NAC</u>
- 31 <u>385B.758</u>, <u>385B.760</u> or <u>385B.762</u>, as adopted by the school pursuant to the provisions of NAC
- 385B.756, to determine academic eligibility to participate in the sanctioned sport.

- NAC 385B.756 Adoption of certain alternative requirements by school district;
- **continual review of academic progress.** (NRS 385B.060) Each school district in which a
- school is located must, before the beginning of each school year, adopt the provisions of NAC
- 38 <u>385B.758</u>, <u>385B.760</u> or <u>385B.762</u> for use by the school district in determining the academic
- eligibility of each pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at the school. The school shall, for
- the period during which each of those pupils participates in a sanctioned sport, continually
- review the academic progress of those pupils in accordance with the provisions of <u>NAC</u>
- 42 <u>385B.758</u>, <u>385B.760</u> or <u>385B.762</u> as adopted by the school district pursuant to this section.

1 NAC 385B.758 Passing grades during season; periodic reviews of pupil's

- 2 **progress.** (NRS 385B.060)
- 1. If, pursuant to the provisions of <u>NAC 385B.756</u>, a school district adopts the requirements
- 4 for academic eligibility set forth in this section, each pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport
- 5 at a school that is located in the school district must maintain a passing grade for each course he
- or she takes during the season. The school shall, in accordance with this section, review the
- pupil's progress in each course at least once every 3 weeks, including any vocational, magnet,
- 8 college or night courses taken by the pupil at a school other than the school where the pupil
- 9 participates in a sanctioned sport.

- 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 3 and 4, each school district shall establish
- the dates for conducting the reviews required pursuant to this section based on its academic
- calendar for each school year. The dates must be determined:
- (a) By beginning at the end of the first semester of the school year and counting back to the
- beginning of the school year in increments of 3 weeks; and
- (b) From the beginning of the second semester of the school year and counting forward to the
- end of the school year in increments of 3 weeks.
 - 3. If approved by the Executive Director, a school district may establish a date for
- conducting a review pursuant to this section that occurs not more than 1 week before or after any
- date that the school district must establish pursuant to subsection 2. The Executive Director may
- waive the establishment of a date for conducting a review pursuant to this section if, as
- 21 determined by the Executive Director, the review scheduled for that date is unnecessary.
- 4. A school shall not conduct the first review during a school year until after the first date
- on which a game, contest or meet may be scheduled for a season as determined by the schedule
- of activities established by the Association for that purpose.
- 5. Each review must indicate the pupil's academic status for the period beginning on the
- 26 first day of the semester and ending on the date on which the review is conducted and must be
- 27 determined in accordance with the regulations of the school district in which the school is
- located. Each review may include the pupil's cumulative semester grades or 9-week grades, or
- any combination thereof. Each school district shall declare the eligibility or ineligibility of

- pupil to participate in a sanctioned sport based on the policy of the school district.
- 6. If a pupil receives a failing grade in an academic course after a review is conducted for
- the pupil pursuant to this section, the school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on
- probation for 1 week. A pupil who is placed on probation remains eligible to participate in the
- sanctioned sport in which he or she participates during the probationary week and must be
- reviewed on the Friday of the probationary week.
- 7. If a pupil who is placed on probation pursuant to subsection 6 continues to maintain a
- failing grade at the review conducted on the Friday of the probationary week, the school that
- conducted the review shall declare the pupil to be ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport
- for the period beginning on the Monday after he or she is declared ineligible and ending on the
- 40 first Saturday after that Monday.
- 8. If a pupil is declared ineligible after the probationary week, the school shall conduct a
- review of the pupil each week until the pupil becomes eligible, regardless of whether that period
- extends beyond the next scheduled review. If the pupil becomes eligible, the pupil must be
- reviewed at the next regularly scheduled review and is entitled to another probationary week.
- 9. If a review is scheduled pursuant to this section for the day before a holiday or vacation
- for the school, and if a pupil has received a failing grade at the time the review is conducted:

- 1 (a) The pupil remains eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport during the holiday or vacation; and
- 3 (b) The school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation beginning on the
- 4 first school day after the holiday or vacation.
- 5 10. A pupil who is placed on probation the week before a school holiday or vacation is
- eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport if the school determines that the pupil has maintained
- 7 passing grades at the regularly scheduled review conducted immediately before the holiday or
- 8 vacation. If the school determines that the pupil has not maintained passing grades after that
- 9 review is conducted, the pupil remains ineligible during the holiday or vacation.
- 11. A pupil who is declared ineligible not more than 2 weeks before a school holiday or

- based on a 4.0 grading system during the immediately preceding semester. A pupil who fails to
