

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE
NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION**

3 **Proposed Revision of NAC 385B.750 to 385B.770**

4 (The proposed revision embodies a change in regulation to update and clarify the
5 academic

6 eligibility regulations of the Association.)

7 *For consideration by the NIAA Board of Control at their June 15, 2021, Meeting*

8 **To become effective July 1, 2022**

9 **NAC 385B.750 to NAC 385B.770 inclusive are hereby amended to read as follows:**

10 New material is *underlined, italics and blue font*

11 Material to be deleted is ~~bracketed in red, strike through font~~

12 **Academic Eligibility**

13 **NAC 385B.750 Requirements for pupils; imposition of stricter requirements by**
14 **school. (NRS 385B.060)** To be eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, a pupil must
15 comply with the academic requirements set forth in NAC 385B.750 to 385B.770,
16 inclusive. A

17 school may impose stricter academic requirements for participation in a sanctioned sport.

19 (Substituted in revision for NAC 386.800)

20 **NAC 385B.752 Enrollment in ninth grade. (NRS 385B.060)** A pupil who
21 enrolls in his
22 or her first semester in the ninth grade in a school is academically eligible to participate in
23 any
24 sanctioned sport *until the pupil is out of compliance with the academic requirements set*
forth
in NAC 385B.750 to 385B.770, inclusive.

26 (Substituted in revision for NAC 386.801)

27 **Delete NAC 385B.754 to 385B.762 inclusive, and replace with the following:**

28 *(NEW) NAC 385B.754 Minimum academic eligibility requirements*

29 *1. To be eligible to participate in an interscholastic event sanctioned by the*
Association,

30 *including, without limitation, a scrimmage, game, meet or contest, a pupil must:*

31 *(a) During the season in which a pupil participates in an NIAA sanctioned sport,*
be

enrolled in at least four classes the successful completion of which must collectively

- 32 provide at
least two units of credit for a full semester or equivalent;
- 33 (b) Comply with the attendance requirements of the school and/or school district;
- 34 (c) Have obtained a passing grade in at least four classes in the immediately
preceding
35 grading period;
- 36 (d) Have obtained a passing grade in the immediately preceding grading period in
all but
37 one of the classes in which the pupil was enrolled; and
- 38 (e) Have obtained a grade point average (G.P.A.) of at least 2.0 based on a 4.0 scale
or
39 it's equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period.

1 2. When interscholastic events sanctioned by the Association are scheduled prior
2 to the
3 beginning of classes for the school year, registration for the required number of classes
4 fulfills
5 the requirements in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection 1, until classes actually begin.
6 When
7 sanctioned events are scheduled after the conclusion of classes for a school year, a
8 pupil's
9 enrollment in the just concluded grading period is the basis for determining eligibility
10 in
11 accordance with this section.

8 (NEW) NAC 385B.756 Posting of grades; determination of eligibility.

9 1. Eligibility under the provisions of NAC 385B.754 is determined when grades are
10 posted. Grades are "posted" when the school registrar, or other person(s) responsible
11 to do so,
12 enter all grades electronically and those grades are available to pupils, parents and
13 teachers.
14 In no case may the posting date be more than five school days following the last day of
15 the
16 grading period. Except as provided in subsection 2 and NAC 385B.764, grade changes
17 after
18 the posting date shall not restore lost eligibility.

19 2. For the purposes of meeting the requirements set forth in NAC 385B.754, a grade
20 of
21 "incomplete" (I), "no credit" (NC), or "no grade" (NG) is not a passing grade and is to
22 be
23 considered as a failing grade until made up. Even if a grading system does not count
24 these
25 grades as part of a G.P.A., these grades are to be included in calculating a pupil's
26 G.P.A. for
27 the purposes of eligibility until the grade is made up. Once the grade is made up, the
28 new
29 grade earned replaces the I, NC, or NG grade and the G.P.A. is to be recalculated using
30 the
31 new grade.

23 (NEW) NAC 385B.758 Duration of ineligibility for failure to meet
24 minimum
25 academic requirements; Outside credit

26 1. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a pupil who fails to meet the

minimum

26 requirements set forth in NAC 385B.750 to 385B.770, inclusive, shall be ineligible to
27 participate in an interscholastic event sanctioned by the Association, including, without
28 limitation, a scrimmage, game, meet or contest, throughout the next grading period.

29 2. A pupil described in subsection 1 may regain eligibility prior to the conclusion
30 of the
31 next grading period if at an interim progress review conducted in accordance with NAC
32 385B.760 the pupil meets the requirements for eligibility of that progress review. A
33 pupil who
34 regains eligibility pursuant to this subsection and then fails to meet the requirements
35 for
36 eligibility in a subsequent interim progress review during the grading period shall be
37 ineligible
38 until the student meets the requirements of an interim progress review at a subsequent
39 review
40 or until the posting of grades for the grading period, whichever occurs first. A pupil
41 described
42 in subsection 1 is not entitled to a probationary week pursuant to NAC 385B.760.

37 3. A pupil may apply as much as one unit of credit earned by the pupil in a
38 correspondence course, summer school, night school or any other school, including,
39 without
40 limitation, a postsecondary educational institution, toward the satisfaction of the
41 requirements
42 set forth in NAC 385B.754 if the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled
indicates in writing that the course qualifies for credit for the pupil's requirements for
graduation and the credit was earned during or following the grading period in which
the

1 pupil was deficient. In calculating G.P.A., for the purposes of eligibility, grades earned
2 in the
3 same subject area may replace those earned previously. When not replacing a grade,
4 the new
5 grade will be considered as an additional class with all others in the grading period.
6 When
7 replacing a failing grade, the new grade must be in the same subject area.

8 4. Any course taken, or unit of credit received by a pupil pursuant to subsection 3
9 becomes a part of the pupil's academic record and, after the grade for the course or
10 unit of
11 credit is recorded on his or her transcript, applies to the requirements for academic
12 eligibility
13 to participate in a sanctioned sport.

14 5. A school shall ensure that each course or unit of credit in which a pupil who
15 participates in a sanctioned sport is enrolled is reviewed in accordance with the
16 provisions
17 of NAC 385B.754 and NAC 385B.760 to determine academic eligibility to participate in
18 a
19 sanctioned sport.

20 (NEW) NAC 385B.760 Continual review of academic progress; interim
21 progress
22 reviews.

23 1. NIAA Member schools shall, for the period during which a pupil participates in
24 a
25 sanctioned sport, continually review the academic progress of that pupil in accordance
26 with
27 the provisions of this section.

28 2. Each pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at an NIAA member school
29 must
30 maintain a passing grade for each course he or she takes during the season. The school
31 shall,
32 in accordance with this section, review the pupil's progress in each course at an interim
33 progress review. An interim progress review shall be conducted at intervals as set forth
34 in
35 subsection 11. The interim progress review shall include, in addition to courses taken
36 at the
37 school, review of any vocational, magnet, on-line, college, night or other courses taken
38 for
39 credit toward graduation by the pupil at a school other than the school where the pupil
40 participates in a sanctioned sport.

41 3. Each interim progress review must indicate the pupil's academic status for the
42 period

28 beginning on the first day of the semester or equivalent or on the first day of the
29 grading
30 period and ending on the date on which the review is conducted and must be
31 determined in
32 accordance with the regulations of the school district in which the school is located.

33 4. If an interim progress review demonstrates that an otherwise eligible pupil is
34 failing a
35 class, the school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation for 1
36 week. A
37 pupil who is placed on probation remains eligible to participate in the sanctioned sport
38 in
39 which he or she participates during the probationary week and must be reviewed on the
40 last
41 school day of the probationary week.

42 5. If a pupil who is placed on probation pursuant to subsection 4 has a failing
43 grade at
44 the review conducted on the last school day of the probationary week, the school that
45 conducted the review shall declare the pupil to be ineligible to participate in a
46 sanctioned sport
47 for the period beginning on the Monday after the review and concluding at the end of
48 the day
49 on the first Saturday after that Monday.

50 6. If a pupil is declared ineligible after the probationary week, the school shall
51 conduct a
52 review of the pupil each week until the pupil becomes eligible, regardless of whether
53 that

1 period extends beyond the next scheduled interim progress review. If the pupil becomes
2 eligible, the pupil must be reviewed at the next regularly scheduled interim progress
3 review
4 and is entitled to another probationary week of eligibility.

4 7. If a review is scheduled pursuant to this section for the day before a holiday or
5 vacation for the school, and if a pupil has received a failing grade at the time the review
6 is
7 conducted:

7 (a) The pupil remains eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport during the holiday
8 or
9 vacation; and

9 (b) The school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation
10 beginning on
11 the first school day after the holiday or vacation.

11 8. A pupil who is placed on probation for the week before a school holiday or
12 vacation is
13 eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport if the school determines that the pupil has
14 maintained passing grades in all classes at the review conducted on the last school day
15 of the
16 probationary week and immediately before the holiday or vacation. If the school
17 determines
18 that the pupil has not maintained passing grades in all classes after that review is
19 conducted,
20 the pupil is ineligible during the holiday or vacation.

17 9. A pupil who is declared ineligible not more than 2 weeks before a school
18 holiday or
19 vacation remains ineligible to participate in the sanctioned sport until achieving a
20 passing
21 grade as determined by each weekly review conducted pursuant to this section.

20 10. If a pupil withdraws or is excluded from a class because he or she received a
21 failing
22 grade during a grading period, the school shall, immediately after the record of the
23 withdrawal or exclusion becomes available, declare the pupil ineligible to participate in
24 the
25 sanctioned sport for the period beginning on the Monday after he or she withdraws or
26 is
27 excluded and concluding at the end of the day on the first Saturday after that Monday.
28 The
29 provisions of this subsection do not exempt a pupil from complying with the
30 requirement set
31 forth in subsection 1 of NAC 385B.754.

31 11. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 12 and 13, each school district or
32 school

28 that is not part of a school district, shall establish the dates for conducting the interim
29 progress

30 reviews required pursuant to this section based on its academic calendar for each
31 school year.

32 The dates shall be:

33 (a) The last school day in a week; and

34 (b) Separated from either the beginning or conclusion of a grading period by
35 approximately 15 school days or the equivalent; and

36 (c) Separated from another interim progress review by approximately 15 school
37 days or the
38 equivalent; and

39 (d) Conducted no less than two times during a grading period of approximately 45
40 school

41 days or the equivalent and no less than three times during a grading period of
42 approximately

43 60 school days or the equivalent.

44 12. If approved by the Executive Director, a school district may establish a date for
45 conducting a review pursuant to this section that occurs not more than 1 week before or
46 after

47 any date that the school district must establish pursuant to subsection 11.

1 13. A school shall not conduct the first review during a school year until after the
2 first date
3 on which an interscholastic game, meet or contest may be scheduled as set forth by the
4 schedule of activities established by the Association for that purpose.

5 (NEW) NAC 385B.762 Grading Period

6 1. For the purposes of eligibility in NIAA sanctioned sports, grading periods:

7 (a) Shall be determined by a school district or a school if the school is not part of a
8 district; and

9 (b) Shall not include more than one third of a school year; and

10 (c) May be a portion of a period over which credit is earned by a pupil; and

11 (d) Shall be approximately equal in length as measured by the number of school
12 days in
13 each grading period throughout a school year.

14 2. As an example, a grading period in a semester credit system would likely consist
15 of

16 approximately a 45 school-day quarter and would use formative or progress grades in
17 quarters

18 1 and 3 and summative or final grades in quarters 2 and 4. In a trimester credit system
19 it

20 would likely be approximately a 60 school-day trimester and use all summative grades.

21 Equivalents of these in other credit systems that meet the requirements of subsection 1
22 may be

23 used.

24 3. The grades issued for a grading period may be either formative or summative.

25 Except

26 as provided in subsection 3 of NAC 385B.758, the grade point average calculated for
27 the

28 purposes of eligibility shall only use the grades issued for the grading period in which
29 they

30 were obtained.

31 **NAC 385B.764 Change in recorded grade for pupil; completion of extra work**
32 **to**

33 **improve pupil's grade. (NRS 385B.060)**

34 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if a school records a grade for a
35 pupil for

36 a ~~[semester or any 9-week]~~ **grading** period, the school or pupil shall not, after the grade is
37 recorded, change the grade in a manner which establishes the academic eligibility of the
38 pupil to

29 participate in a sanctioned sport at the school. The school may change a grade specified in
30 this
31 subsection if the school submits evidence satisfactory to the Executive Director that the
32 grade
33 was issued incorrectly.

32 2. A school shall not allow a pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at the
33 school to
34 complete any extra work to improve the pupil's grade in a course of instruction unless the
35 school
36 allows all pupils in that course of instruction to complete extra work for that course of
37 instruction. If a school allows a pupil to complete extra work pursuant to this subsection,
38 the
39 school shall ensure that the extra work is graded and included in the grade for the course
40 of
41 instruction prior to the posting of grades for the ~~[semester or any 9-week]~~ grading
42 period. ~~[for~~
43 ~~the semester.]~~

2 **NAC 385B.766 Pupil who qualifies for special education services. (NRS**
3 **385B.060, 385B.090)**

4 1. A pupil who qualifies for special education services pursuant to the Individuals
5 With
6 Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400, et seq., or NRS 388.417 to 388.453,
7 inclusive,
8 and chapter 388 of NAC must comply with the requirements for academic eligibility that
9 are
10 applicable to a pupil who is not qualified for those services.

11 2. Any exception to the academic requirements of the Association for eligibility for
12 participation in a sanctioned sport set forth in the individual education plan of a pupil who
13 qualifies for special education services pursuant to subsection 1 may be considered by the
14 Association pursuant to the provisions for appealing a pupil hardship set forth in NAC
15 385B.900 to 385B.924, inclusive, if the exception is based on the disability of the pupil.

16 3. Any exception specified in subsection 2 that is included in the individual
17 education plan
18 of the pupil after he or she is declared academically ineligible to participate in a
19 sanctioned sport
20 may not be appealed pursuant to the provisions of NAC 385B.900 to 385B.924, inclusive,
21 until
22 the beginning of the next period for conducting reviews.

20 **NAC 385B.768 Homeschooled children. (NRS 385B.060)**

21 1. If a homeschooled child enrolls in a school and wishes to become eligible to
22 participate
23 in a sanctioned sport at that school, a parent or legal guardian of the homeschooled child
24 must
25 submit written evidence satisfactory to the school indicating that the homeschooled child
26 received the instruction required by NAC 392.035 and maintained a grade point average
27 of not
28 less than 2.0 for the period in which he or she was a homeschooled child.

29 2. The written evidence required pursuant to subsection 1 may consist of a statement
30 signed
31 by a parent or legal guardian of the homeschooled child attesting to the written evidence.

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31 **NAC 385B.770 Incorrect determination of grade of pupil; date of eligibility of**
32 **ineligible pupil who is allowed to practice with team. ([NRS 385B.060](#))**

33 1. If a teacher of a school incorrectly determines the grade of a pupil and, because of
34 that
35 determination, the pupil becomes ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport as
36 determined by
37 the principal of the school or a designee thereof, the school shall declare the pupil eligible
38 to
39 participate in the sanctioned sport immediately after the discovery of the incorrect
40 determination.

37 2. A pupil who becomes academically ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport
38 at a
39 school during a ~~semester~~ grading period and practices with a team at that school after
40 receiving
approval from the principal of the school to do so becomes academically eligible to
participate in
a sanctioned sport beginning on the day the grades of the pupil are submitted to the
computer

1 system of the school if, on that day, the pupil is otherwise ~~academically~~ eligible to
2 participate
3 in the sanctioned sport in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

7 **Below is the text of the deleted sections:**

9 **NAC 385B.754 Courses and units of credit. (NRS 385B.060)**

10 1. For each semester a pupil participates in a sanctioned sport, the pupil must enroll
11 in a
12 course of at least two units of credit consisting of at least four classes and regularly attend
13 a
14 school. The pupil must successfully complete a course of at least two units of credit for
15 the
16 immediately preceding semester. If a pupil fails to complete successfully the course for
17 that
18 semester, the pupil is ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport for one semester
19 unless, for
20 the grading period for the first 9 weeks of the semester that is conducted immediately
21 after that
22 semester, he or she receives a passing grade for the two units of credit for the grading
23 period, at
24 which time he or she becomes eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport for the
25 remainder of
26 that semester.

19 2. A pupil may enroll in a course for one unit of credit for each semester he or she
20 enrolls in
21 a correspondence course or attends any summer school, night school or any other school,
22 including, without limitation, a postsecondary educational institution, and receive credit
23 for the
24 satisfactory completion of that course toward the satisfaction of the requirements for
25 academic
26 eligibility if the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled indicates in writing
27 that the
28 course qualifies for credit for the pupil's requirements for graduation.

25 3. Any course taken or unit of credit received by a pupil pursuant to subsection 2
26 becomes a
27 part of the pupil's academic record and, after the grade for the course or unit of credit is
28 recorded
29 on his or her transcript, applies to the requirements for academic eligibility to participate
30 in a
31 sanctioned sport.

29 4. A school shall ensure that each course or unit of credit in which a pupil who
participates
30 in a sanctioned sport is enrolled is reviewed in accordance with the provisions of NAC
31 385B.758, 385B.760 or 385B.762, as adopted by the school pursuant to the provisions of
NAC
32 385B.756, to determine academic eligibility to participate in the sanctioned sport.

35 **NAC 385B.756 Adoption of certain alternative requirements by school district;**
36 **continual review of academic progress. (NRS 385B.060)** Each school district in
which a
37 school is located must, before the beginning of each school year, adopt the provisions of
NAC
38 385B.758, 385B.760 or 385B.762 for use by the school district in determining the
academic
39 eligibility of each pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport at the school. The school
shall, for
40 the period during which each of those pupils participates in a sanctioned sport,
continually
41 review the academic progress of those pupils in accordance with the provisions of NAC
42 385B.758, 385B.760 or 385B.762 as adopted by the school district pursuant to this
section.
43 (Added to NAC by Nev. Interscholastic Activities Ass'n by R206-03, eff. 11-2-2004;
A by
44 R147-10, 5-5-2011) — (Substituted in revision for NAC 386.803)

1 **NAC 385B.758 Passing grades during season; periodic reviews of pupil's**
2 **progress. (NRS 385B.060)**

3 1. If, pursuant to the provisions of NAC 385B.756, a school district adopts the
4 requirements
5 for academic eligibility set forth in this section, each pupil who participates in a
6 sanctioned sport
7 at a school that is located in the school district must maintain a passing grade for each
8 course he
9 or she takes during the season. The school shall, in accordance with this section, review
10 the
11 pupil's progress in each course at least once every 3 weeks, including any vocational,
12 magnet,
13 college or night courses taken by the pupil at a school other than the school where the
14 pupil
15 participates in a sanctioned sport.

16 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 3 and 4, each school district shall
17 establish
18 the dates for conducting the reviews required pursuant to this section based on its
19 academic
20 calendar for each school year. The dates must be determined:

21 (a) By beginning at the end of the first semester of the school year and counting back
22 to the
23 beginning of the school year in increments of 3 weeks; and
24 (b) From the beginning of the second semester of the school year and counting
25 forward to the
26 end of the school year in increments of 3 weeks.

27 3. If approved by the Executive Director, a school district may establish a date for
28 conducting a review pursuant to this section that occurs not more than 1 week before or
29 after any
30 date that the school district must establish pursuant to subsection 2. The Executive
31 Director may
32 waive the establishment of a date for conducting a review pursuant to this section if, as
33 determined by the Executive Director, the review scheduled for that date is unnecessary.

34 4. A school shall not conduct the first review during a school year until after the first
35 date
36 on which a game, contest or meet may be scheduled for a season as determined by the
37 schedule
38 of activities established by the Association for that purpose.

39 5. Each review must indicate the pupil's academic status for the period beginning on
40 the
41 first day of the semester and ending on the date on which the review is conducted and
42 must be
43 determined in accordance with the regulations of the school district in which the school is
44 located. Each review may include the pupil's cumulative semester grades or 9-week
45 grades, or
46 any combination thereof. Each school district shall declare the eligibility or ineligibility of

a

30 pupil to participate in a sanctioned sport based on the policy of the school district.

31 6. If a pupil receives a failing grade in an academic course after a review is
conducted for

32 the pupil pursuant to this section, the school that conducted the review shall place the
pupil on

33 probation for 1 week. A pupil who is placed on probation remains eligible to participate in
the

34 sanctioned sport in which he or she participates during the probationary week and must be
35 reviewed on the Friday of the probationary week.

36 7. If a pupil who is placed on probation pursuant to subsection 6 continues to
maintain a

37 failing grade at the review conducted on the Friday of the probationary week, the school
that

38 conducted the review shall declare the pupil to be ineligible to participate in a sanctioned
sport

39 for the period beginning on the Monday after he or she is declared ineligible and ending
on the

40 first Saturday after that Monday.

41 8. If a pupil is declared ineligible after the probationary week, the school shall
conduct a

42 review of the pupil each week until the pupil becomes eligible, regardless of whether that
period

43 extends beyond the next scheduled review. If the pupil becomes eligible, the pupil must
be

44 reviewed at the next regularly scheduled review and is entitled to another probationary
week.

45 9. If a review is scheduled pursuant to this section for the day before a holiday or
vacation

46 for the school, and if a pupil has received a failing grade at the time the review is
conducted:

1 (a) The pupil remains eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport during the holiday or
2 vacation; and

3 (b) The school that conducted the review shall place the pupil on probation beginning
4 on the
5 first school day after the holiday or vacation.

6 10. A pupil who is placed on probation the week before a school holiday or vacation
7 is
8 eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport if the school determines that the pupil has
9 maintained
10 passing grades at the regularly scheduled review conducted immediately before the
11 holiday or
12 vacation. If the school determines that the pupil has not maintained passing grades after
13 that
14 review is conducted, the pupil remains ineligible during the holiday or vacation.

15 11. A pupil who is declared ineligible not more than 2 weeks before a school holiday
16 or
17 vacation remains ineligible to participate in the sanctioned sport until achieving a passing
18 grade
19 as determined by each weekly review conducted pursuant to this section.

20 12. If a pupil withdraws or is excluded from a class because he or she received a
21 failing
22 grade during a semester, the school shall, immediately after the record of the withdrawal
23 or
24 exclusion becomes available, declare the pupil ineligible to participate in the sanctioned
25 sport for
26 the period beginning on the Monday after he or she withdraws or is excluded and ending
27 on the
28 first Saturday after that Monday. The provisions of this subsection do not exempt a pupil
29 from
30 complying with the requirement set forth in subsection 1 of NAC 385B.754.
