INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT PER NRS 233B.066

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation;

The proposed addition/change of regulations to NAC 450B in LCB File No. R105-22 clarify the effect of criminal convictions on background checks, define what criminal convictions make an applicant ineligible for certification and the required frequency of fingerprint submission to be in alignment with NRS 450B.800.

The Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) Emergency Medical Services (EMS) held a Public Workshop on October 25, 2022, to consider proposed regulations (LCB File No. R105-22). No one from the public attended.
