

**APPROVED REGULATION OF THE
CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIANS' BOARD OF NEVADA**

AUTHORITY: § 1, NRS 634.030 and 634.090.

A REGULATION relating to chiropractors; setting forth the documents that an applicant for a license to practice chiropractic may provide to the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada to demonstrate that he or she has a high school education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada to adopt reasonable regulations for the transaction of business and to enable the Board to carry out its duties under the provisions of law governing chiropractic physicians and chiropractic assistants. (NRS 634.030)

Existing law requires an applicant for a license to practice chiropractic to furnish to the Board satisfactory evidence that he or she has a high school education and is a graduate from an accredited college of chiropractic. (NRS 634.090) This regulation sets forth the documents an applicant may provide to the Board for the purposes of furnishing satisfactory evidence that he or she has a high school education.

Section 1. Chapter 634 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

For the purposes of an applicant furnishing satisfactory evidence to the Board that he or she has a high school education in accordance with paragraph (b) of subsection 1 of NRS 634.090, the applicant may provide to the Board:

1. A diploma issued by a high school in this State or any other state or territory of the United States;

2. An official transcript issued by a high school in this State or any other state or territory of the United States;

3. A certificate of general educational development or an equivalent document issued by the Department of Education or the appropriate authority of any other state or territory of the United States; or

4. A certificate of completion of high school or an equivalent document issued by a charter school or homeschool that is lawfully operated in this State or any other state or territory of the United States.
