The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapters 502, and 503.

**1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:**

This regulation is necessary to establish provisions relating to moose. Until now, there were no previous regulations to address moose.

**2. Description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary:**

Public comment was solicited for the permanent regulation during one workshop with the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners (NBWC) on January 26, 2024.

There were three comments during the public comment period. One commentor felt the tag fees should be higher. Two commentors did not see the need for a moose hunt.

Public comment was solicited for the permanent regulation during one adoption hearing with the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners (NBWC) on January 27, 2024.

There was no public comment.

**5. A description of how comment was solicited from affected businesses, a summary of their response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary:**

This regulation does not affect small businesses. Therefore, the Department concluded that there would be no small business impact.

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**6. If the regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation, a summary of the reasons for adopting the regulation without change:**

The regulation was adopted with three small changes as discussed during the meeting. The first change clarifies that the tag can only be drawn once in a lifetime for both antlered and antlerless moose. The second change renumbers species in the bonus point section for clarity. The third change adds "wild turkey" into the list of species for which bonus points can be collected. This change was made because it was removed from another regulation and added to this one in order to avoid confusion between the two regulations.

There is no estimated cost to the agency. Enforcement of the regulation falls within current operations of the Department.

There are no other regulations that overlap or duplicate this regulation.

This regulation does provide for the cost of moose tags in Nevada. The agency does not anticipate collecting more than \$2400 dollars in the first few years as there will likely be very few tags awarded, if any. This money will be accounted for and used in accordance with NRS 501.356.
