LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS AS REQUIRED BY NRS 233B.066

LCB FILE R125-23

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 641A.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The need for the proposed regulations is to protect the public health, safety, and welfare while promoting entrepreneurship and economic growth. The purpose of the adopted regulation is to provide clarity for the public, individuals, and licensees through regulations. The proposed regulation streamlines, clarifies, reduces or otherwise improves administrative code to ensure the regulations provide for the general welfare of the State without unnecessarily inhibiting economic growth.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Copies of the proposed regulation, notice of workshop and notice of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by e-mail to persons who were known to have an interest in marriage and family therapy or clinical professional counseling as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. The Board used informed, reasonable judgment in determining that there will not be an impact on small businesses.

6. If the regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation, a summary of the reasons for adopting the regulation without change.

After consideration of all public comments received, the State of Nevada Board of Examiners for Marriage Family Therapists and Clinical Professional Counselors adopted the regulation on **February 16, 2024,** without change. There were no written comments on the proposed regulation.

The Board determined the regulation was appropriate and necessary and that undue burden is not placed upon licensees as a result of the provisions of the regulation.

The adopted regulations will have a positive impact on workforce development because it allows for more qualified professionals to remain in the field serving our citizens. If the Board provides a more streamlined and concise experience for continuing education providers in our state, then it is our hope that we will see an increase in providers.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

Immediate effect will be improved administration through clarification of existing law and regulatory requirements. Long-term effect will be clarity and consistency in regulation of marriage and family therapists and clinical professional counselors in Nevada.

There are no additional costs involved in the enforcement of these adopted regulations.
