

# LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT AS REQUIRED BY NRS 233B.066

The following statement is submitted by the State of Nevada, Department of Business and Industry, Division of Insurance (“Division”) for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (“NAC”) Chapter(s) 687B.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The regulation is necessary to comply with the requirement that the Commissioner of Insurance issue network adequacy standards required of all network plans. See Nevada Revised Statutes (“NRS”) 687B.490 and NAC 687B.750 to 687B.784. The purpose of the regulation is to establish adequacy standards for network plans for plan year 2025.

- (a) A description of how public comment was solicited:

Public comment was solicited by emailing the proposed regulation, notice of workshop, notice of intent to act upon the regulation, and small business impact statement to persons on the Division’s mailing list requesting notification of proposed regulations. The documents were also made available on the website of the Division, <http://doi.nv.gov/>, the website of the Nevada Legislature, <http://www.leg.state.nv.us>, and the Nevada Public Notice website, <http://www.notices.nv.gov>. The documents were also emailed, or mailed where no email address was available, to the main library for each county in Nevada.

Public comment was also solicited at the workshop held on November 12, 2024, and at the hearing held on November 26, 2024. The public workshop and hearing took place virtually via Webex and in person at the Division’s offices located at 1818 E. College Pkwy, Carson City, Nevada 89706 and 3300 W. Sahara Ave., Las Vegas, Nevada 89102.
