

Digest for Adopted Regulation R_049-11

Existing law requires the State Environmental Commission to adopt regulations which establish minimum standards for separating at the source recyclable material from other solid waste originating from residential premises and public buildings where services for the collection of solid waste are provided, including the placement of recycling containers on the premises of apartment complexes and condominiums where such services are provided. (NRS 444A.020, as amended by section 1 of Senate Bill No. 417, chapter 254, Statutes of Nevada 2011, p. 1319)

Existing regulations require a municipality which makes certain recycling programs available and whose population is 100,000 or more (currently Clark and Washoe Counties and the Cities of Las Vegas, Reno, Henderson and North Las Vegas) to submit to the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources copies of all contracts and agreements to provide for the separation at the source of recyclable material from other solid waste originating from the residential premises and public buildings where services for the collection of solid waste are provided. (NAC 444A.120) Existing regulations also require municipalities with a program for the separation at the source of recyclable material at residential premises to designate at least three recyclable materials to be so separated. (NAC 444A.130) **Sections 1 and 2** of this regulation expand these requirements to include apartment complexes and condominiums.
