

Digest for Adopted Regulation R_114-11

Existing law requires every applicant for an initial license as a teacher or other educational employee to submit with his or her application a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints for the report of the criminal history of the applicant by the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Such a licensee must also undergo a subsequent background investigation upon each renewal of his or her license. (NRS 391.033) Existing law also requires the Commission on Professional Standards in Education to fix fees of not less than \$65 for the initial issuance of a license and the renewal of the license, which must include the fees for processing the fingerprints of the applicant by the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. (NRS 391.040)

Existing regulations prescribe the fee for the renewal of a license. This regulation revises that fee from \$80 to \$131, which includes the fees for the processing of the fingerprints of the licensee by the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Existing regulations also provide that a provisional license issued by the Superintendent of Public Instruction pending receipt of the reports of the criminal history of the applicant for initial licensure is valid for a period not to exceed 120 days pending receipt of those reports. (NAC 391.0568) This regulation similarly authorizes the Superintendent of Public Instruction to delay the expiration of a license by not more than 120 days pending receipt of the reports of the criminal history of the licensee who is applying for renewal.
