- 5. [If the] The sponsor of the charter school may approve the written request if:
- (a) The sponsor finds [pursuant to subsection 3] that the written request is compliant and complete [, the sponsor may approve the request.]; and
- (b) The charter school was rated in the 25<sup>th</sup> percentile or higher during the last rating of the charter school pursuant to the statewide system of accountability for public schools, with exceptions to this subsection allowed if the sponsor determines the written request should be approved due to health, safety, academic or fiduciary concerns at the charter school.
