ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1-COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

DECEMBER 16, 2015

Referred to Committee of the Whole

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to economic development. (BDR 18-9)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to economic development; requiring the Office of Economic Development to develop and implement one or more programs to provide customized workforce development services to new and existing businesses in this State; revising provisions governing programs of workforce development provided by providers approved by the Office; authorizing certain providers to apply to the Office for approval of programs of workforce recruitment, assessment and training; authorizing certain providers of programs of workforce recruitment, assessment and training and certain local governmental entities to apply to the Office for an allocation, grant or loan of money to defray the costs of the program; authorizing certain businesses to apply to participate in such programs; creating the Workforce Innovations for a New Nevada Account in the State General Fund; specifying the uses of money in the Account; requiring the State Treasurer to transfer certain money to the Account; revising certain provisions relating to the approval by the Executive Director of the Office of applications for certain transferable tax credits; making an appropriation to the Account; and providing other matters properly relating thereto





Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Section 3 of this bill declares that it is the public policy of this State in 2 implementing the State Plan for Economic Development that: (1) the industrial and 345678 economic development of all geographic areas of this State be supported through the implementation of programs of workforce development that prioritize the recruitment, assessment and training of a highly skilled and diverse workforce; and (2) creating equal opportunities is critical to ensuring equity, social and economic mobility and sustainability.

Section 7 of this bill requires the Office of Economic Development, under the ğ direction of the Executive Director of the Office and in consultation with the 10 Nevada System of Higher Education, the Department of Employment, Training and 11 Rehabilitation, the Department of Education and any other person the Executive 12 Director determines is appropriate, to develop and implement one or more 13 programs to provide customized workforce development services to persons that 14 create and expand businesses in Nevada and relocate businesses to Nevada. Section 15 6 of this bill requires the Board of Economic Development to provide advice and 16 recommendations to the Executive Director concerning the development and 17 implementation of such programs.

18 Section 4 of this bill authorizes a person who wishes to provide a program of 19 workforce recruitment, assessment and training to apply to the Office for approval 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 of the program. Section 4 provides that any program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training approved by the Office must: (1) include a workforce diversity action plan approved by the Office; and (2) to the extent practicable, be provided on a statewide basis to support the industrial and economic development of all geographic areas of this State. Section 4 also provides that an authorized provider or the governing body of a local government within the jurisdiction of which the authorized provider will provide the program may apply to the Office for an allocation, grant or loan of money to defray some or all of the costs of the program. Section 4 requires the Office to give priority to programs that will provide customized workforce development services to one or more businesses that: (1) provide high-skill and high-wage jobs to residents of this State; (2) to the 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 greatest extent practicable, use materials that are produced or bought in this State; (3) are consistent with the State Plan for Economic Development; and (4) are consistent with the unified state plan submitted by the Governor to the Secretary of Labor pursuant to section 102 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, 29 U.S.C. § 3112. Section 4 establishes the authorized uses of any money received by an authorized provider from the Office. Additionally, section 4 authorizes a person who operates a business or will operate a business in this State to apply to the Office to participate in a program of workforce recruitment, assessment and 39 training provided by an authorized provider. Section 4 also requires each 40 authorized provider and each business that participates in a program of workforce 41 recruitment, assessment and training to have a workforce diversity action plan 42 approved by the Office. Section 4.5 of this bill prescribes the contents of such a 43 plan.

44 Existing law authorizes a person who operates or will operate a business in this 45 State to apply to the Office of Economic Development for approval of a course of 46 training administered by a community college for employees of the business. (NRS 47 231.147) Under existing law, the Office is required to establish the amount of 48 matching money that the applicant must provide for the program, which must not 49 be less than 25 percent of the amount the Office approves for the program. (NRS 50 231.147) Section 11 of this bill revises these provisions to authorize a business to 51 52 53 apply to the Office for approval of a program of workforce training provided by a provider approved by the Office.

Section 5 of this bill provides that a business that participates in a program of 54 workforce training or a program of recruitment, assessment and training authorized





by section 4 or 11 of this bill, as applicable, may request that any proprietary information, intellectual property or trade secret contained in the training materials provided through the program be deemed confidential. Section 5 provides that, upon approval by the Executive Director of the Office of such a request, any proprietary information, intellectual property or trade secret contained in the training materials shall be deemed confidential, may be redacted and may not be disclosed.

62 Section 13 of this bill creates the Workforce Innovations for a New Nevada 63 Account and provides that money in the Account must be used to carry out the 64 programs of workforce development authorized by sections 4 and 11 of this bill. 65 Section 17 of this bill requires the State Treasurer to transfer \$1,000,000 to the 66 Account from the amount appropriated for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 for the support 67 of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology. Section 18 of this bill makes 68 an appropriation from the State General Fund to the Account in the amount of 69 \$1,500,000. To offset the appropriation made by section 18, section 16 of this bill 70 71 72 73 revises provisions which authorize the Executive Director or the Board of Economic Development to approve applications for transferable tax credits to reduce amounts previously approved.

73 Section 5.5 of this bill requires the Office of Economic Development to submit 74 to the Legislature a biennial report concerning programs of workforce development 75 which receive money from the Workforce Innovations for a New Nevada Account.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 231 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5.5, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. "Authorized provider" means any institution within 5 the Nevada System of Higher Education, a state or local agency, a 6 school district, a charter school, a nonprofit organization, a labor 7 organization or a private postsecondary educational institution 8 that provides a program of workforce development approved by 9 the Office.

10 Sec. 3. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of this 11 State in implementing the State Plan for Economic Development 12 developed by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of 13 NRS 231.053 that:

14 1. The industrial and economic development of all 15 geographic areas of this State be supported through the 16 implementation of programs of workforce development that 17 prioritize the recruitment, assessment and training of a highly 18 skilled and diverse workforce; and

19 2. Creating equal opportunities is critical to ensuring equity, 20 social and economic mobility and sustainability.

21 Sec. 4. 1. A person who wishes to provide a program of 22 workforce recruitment, assessment and training may apply to the





Office for approval of the program. The application must be 1 2 submitted on a form prescribed by the Office. 3 2. Each application must include: (a) The name, address and telephone number of the applicant; 4 (b) The name of each business for which the applicant will 5 6 provide the proposed program of workforce recruitment, 7 assessment and training; (c) A statement of the objectives of the proposed program of 8 workforce recruitment, assessment and training; 9 (*d*) A workforce diversity action plan; and 10 (e) The estimated cost of the proposed program of workforce 11 recruitment, assessment and training. 12 13 3. Any program of workforce recruitment, assessment and 14 training approved by the Office pursuant to this section must: (a) Include a workforce diversity action plan approved by the 15 16 Office: and 17 (b) To the extent practicable, be provided on a statewide basis 18 to support the industrial and economic development of all geographic areas of this State. 19 20 4. The Office shall: (a) Maintain on the Internet website of the Office a list of the 21 22 criteria for evaluating applications for approval of a program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training; 23 (b) Approve or disapprove each application for approval of a 24 25 program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training within 60 days after receiving a complete application; and 26 27 (c) Provide notice of the approval or disapproval of each application to the applicant within 10 days after approving or 28 *disapproving the application.* 29 30 5. An authorized provider that provides a program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training approved by the 31 Office pursuant to this section or the governing body of a local 32 government within the jurisdiction of which the authorized 33 provider will provide the program may apply to the Office for an 34 35 allocation, grant or loan of money to defray in whole or in part the cost of the program. The application must be submitted on a form 36 37 prescribed by the Office. The Office shall approve or deny each application for an 38 **6**. allocation, grant or loan of money submitted pursuant to 39 subsection 5 within 45 days after receipt of the application. When 40 considering an application, the Office shall give priority to a 41 42 program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training that will provide workforce development services to one or more 43 44 businesses that:





3 (b) To the greatest extent practicable, use materials that are 4 produced or bought in this State; 5 (c) Are consistent with the State Plan for Economic 6 Development developed by the Executive Director pursuant to 7 subsection 2 of NRS 231.053; and 8 (d) Are consistent with the unified state plan submitted by the 9 Governor to the Secretary of Labor pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 3112. 7. An authorized provider may use money distributed 10 11 pursuant to this section: 12 (a) To provide technical services to a business that participates 13 in the program of workforce recruitment, assessment and 14 training; 15 (b) To provide publicity for the program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training and for job recruiting and 16 assessments conducted through the program; 17 (c) To provide instructional services; 18 19 (d) To provide analysis of on-site training; (e) To pay any costs relating to the rental of instructional 20 facilities, including, without limitation, utilities and costs relating 21 22 to the storage and transportation of equipment and supplies; 23 (f) To pay administrative and personnel costs; and 24 (g) To pay any other costs necessary to effectively carry out the 25 program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training. A person who operates a business or will operate a 26 **8**. business in this State may apply to the Office to participate in a 27 program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training 28 29 provided by an authorized provider. The application must be 30 submitted on a form prescribed by the Office and must include, 31 without limitation: 32 (a) The name, address and telephone number of the business; 33 (b) Proof satisfactory to the Office that the business is consistent with the State Plan for Economic Development 34 35 developed by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of 36 NRS 231.053: 37 (c) A description of the number and types of jobs that the business expects will be created as a result of its participation in 38

39 the program of workforce recruitment, assessment and training 40 and the wages the business expects to pay to persons employed in 41 those jobs;

4 Sec. 4.5. A workforce diversity action plan submitted to the Office for approval pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 3 of 5 section 4 of this act or paragraph (e) of subsection 8 of section 4 of 6 7 this act, must include, without limitation:

1. A statement expressing a commitment to workforce 8 diversity, an explanation of the actions that will be taken and 9 10 strategies that will be implemented to promote workforce diversity and the goals and performance measures which will be used to 11 12 measure the success of the plan in achieving those goals; and

2. A statement expressing a commitment to comply with all 13 applicable federal and state laws. 14

15 Sec. 5. A business that participates in a program of development may request that any proprietary 16 workforce information, intellectual property or trade secret which is 17 contained in any training materials provided through the program 18 19 be deemed confidential. Upon approval by the Executive Director of such a request, the proprietary information, intellectual 20 property or trade secret identified by the business shall be deemed 21 confidential, may be redacted from the training materials and may 22 23 not be disclosed.

Sec. 5.5. The Office shall, on or before January 15 of each 24 25 odd-numbered year, prepare and submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the Legislature a 26 27 report concerning programs of workforce development which receive money from the Workforce Innovations for a New Nevada 28 29 Account created by NRS 231.151. The report must include:
