VETOED BILL PROCESS

After a bill passes both houses of the Legislature, it is presented to the Governor for approval. Three options are available to the Governor: (1) sign the bill; (2) veto the bill; or (3) allow the bill to become law without his signature. The Governor has five days to sign or veto a bill that is presented to him more than five days before the end of the legislative session. When the Governor receives a bill five or fewer days before the session adjourns sine die, he has ten days to take action on the bill. If the Governor fails to sign or veto a bill within the time frame required under the *Nevada Constitution*, the bill becomes law without his signature. Sundays and the date of delivery are not counted when calculating the time allotted to the Governor for action.

For a vetoed bill to become law, two-thirds of the members elected to each house must vote to override the Governor's veto. When the Governor vetoes a bill, the vetoed bill is returned to the house of origin along with the Governor's veto message or statement. If the house of origin sustains the Governor's veto, the bill dies. However, if the house of origin does not sustain the Governor's veto—in other words, overrides the veto—the bill is then sent to the second house for reconsideration. If the second house sustains the Governor's veto, the bill dies; if it overrides the Governor's veto, the bill becomes law. When a veto is overridden and the effective date is not specified in the measure, the bill becomes effective on the date the second house votes to override the Governor's veto.

Governor Jim Gibbons vetoed a record 48 bills that were passed by the 75th Legislature, 33 of which originated in the Assembly. Twenty-nine Assembly bills were returned for reconsideration during the 2009 Session, and four were vetoed after the session ended on June 1, 2009. Assembly Bills 130, 395, 451, and 503 will be returned to the 2011 Legislature for reconsideration. Assembly Bills 119, 307, and 473 were read and upon motion, placed on the Chief Clerk's desk; no further action was taken. The Assembly overrode the Governor's veto of the remaining 26 Assembly bills and transmitted them to the Senate for reconsideration. The Senate overrode the Governor's veto of 14 of these bills, sustained his veto of 11 Assembly bills, and took no action on the 1 remaining Assembly bill.

Enacted bills are those that were passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor; became law pursuant to Article 4, Section 35 of the *Nevada Constitution* and were assigned a chapter number in the *Statutes of Nevada*; or became law because the Governor's veto was overridden by both the Assembly and Senate.

Enacted joint resolutions are those passed by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statutes of Nevada*. Assembly joint resolutions that seek to amend the *Nevada Constitution* must be passed by two sessions of the Legislature and then submitted to the people for a vote. Enacted concurrent and one-house resolutions are those adopted by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statutes of Nevada*.

**JOINT STANDING RULE NO. 14.3 OF THE
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY**

The Joint Standing Rules of the Senate and Assembly (Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 1 [File No. 4, *Statutes of Nevada 2009*]) were adopted by both houses of the Nevada State Legislature on February 2, 2009. Rule No. 14.3 provided certain deadlines for the enactment of bills.

Unless a deadline was waived by the Speaker of the Assembly and the Majority Leader of the Senate pursuant to Rule No. 14.5 of the Joint Standing Rules, no further legislative action was allowed on a bill or joint resolution that failed to meet the established deadlines toward passage and enactment. Assembly and Senate bills and joint resolutions that did not meet the required deadlines have the specific portion of Rule No. 14.3 cited that pertained to each measure. Assembly and Senate bills and joint resolutions that were granted waivers contain the history statement “waiver granted” along with the effective date of the waiver.

SCHEDULE FOR ENACTMENT OF BILLS

Rule No. 14.3 Final Dates for Action by Standing Committees and Houses.

Except as otherwise provided in Joint Standing Rules Nos. 14.4, 14.5 and 14.6:

1. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in its House of origin may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 68th calendar day of the legislative session. A bill may be rereferred after that date only to the Committee on Finance or the Committee on Ways and Means and only if the bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

2. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the House of origin on or before the 79th calendar day of the legislative session.

3. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in the second House may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 103rd calendar day of the legislative session. A bill may be rereferred after that date only to the Committee on Finance or the Committee on Ways and Means and only if the bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

4. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the second House on or before the 110th calendar day of the legislative session.

No notice of reconsideration of any final vote on a bill or joint resolution is in order on the last day on which final action is allowed.

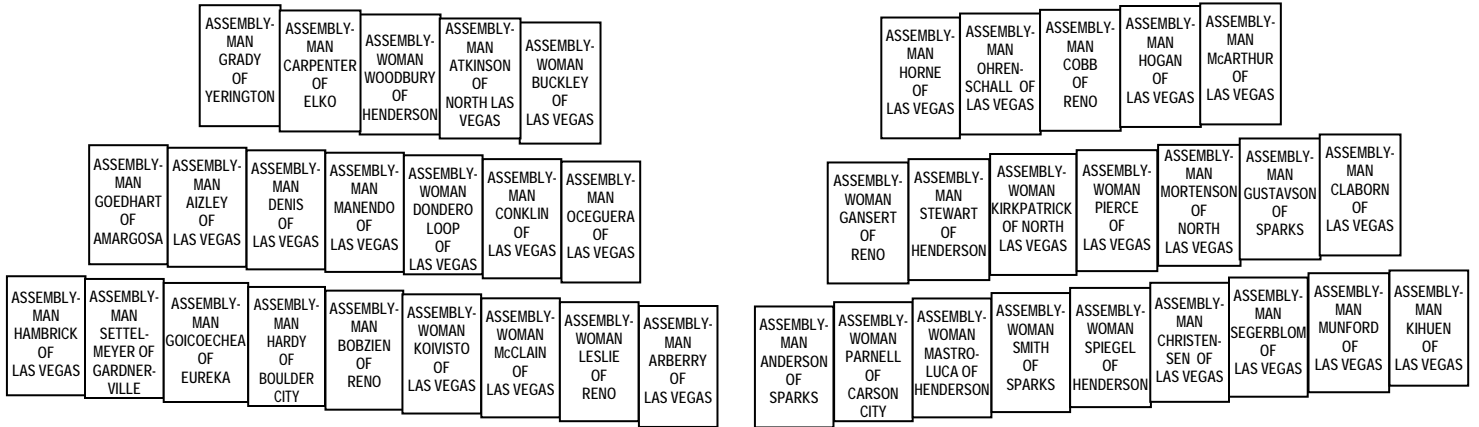
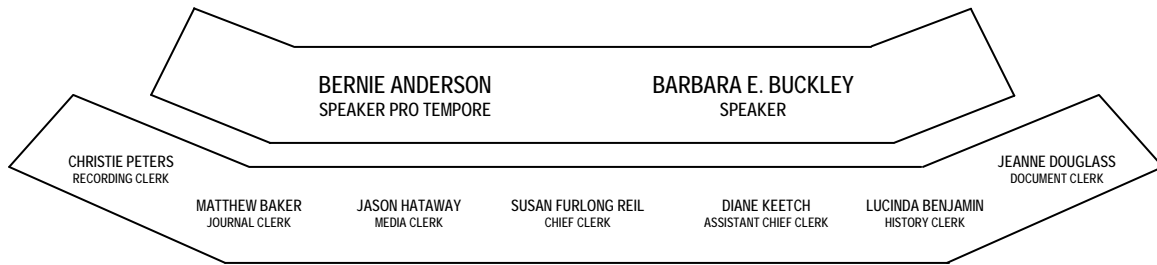

Whenever an amendment is adopted that affects a bill or joint resolution in such a way that the fiscal note ceases to be valid, the presiding officer, at his or her discretion, can direct the Fiscal Analysis Division to obtain a new fiscal note showing the effect of the bill or joint resolution as amended. Not all fiscal notes are updated when an amendment invalidates the note.
