

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 319—ASSEMBLYWOMAN DIAZ

MARCH 18, 2011

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the final disposition of human remains. (BDR 40-775)

AN ACT relating to dead bodies; authorizing certain persons who assume legal and final responsibility for the final disposition of the human remains of a deceased person to order the burial of those human remains; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes certain persons to order the burial of the human
2 remains of a deceased person, and this bill authorizes, in the absence of any such person,
3 any person who is 18 years of age or older and who assumes legal and financial responsibility for the human remains of the deceased person to order the
4 burial of the remains of the deceased person. (NRS 451.024)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 451.024 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 451.024 1. The following persons, in the following order of priority, may order the burial of human remains of a deceased person:
3 (a) A person designated as the person with authority to order the
4 burial of the human remains of the decedent in a legally valid
5 document or in an affidavit executed in accordance with
6 subsection 5;
7 (b) The spouse of the decedent;
8 (c) An adult son or daughter of the decedent;
9 (d) Either parent of the decedent;



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1 (e) An adult brother or sister of the decedent;
2 (f) A grandparent of the decedent;
3 (g) A guardian of the person of the decedent at the time of death;

5 (h) A person who held the primary domicile of the decedent in
6 joint tenancy with the decedent at the time of death ~~1.~~; and

7 *(i) In the absence of any person specified in paragraphs (a) to*
8 *(h), inclusive, any other person 18 years of age or older who*
9 *assumes legal and financial responsibility for the final disposition*
10 *of the human remains of the decedent.*

11 2. If the deceased person was an indigent or other person for
12 whom the final disposition of the decedent's remains is a
13 responsibility of a county or the State, the appropriate public officer
14 may order the burial of the remains and provide for the respectful
15 disposition of the remains.

16 3. If the deceased person donated his or her body for scientific
17 research or, before the person's death, a medical facility was made
18 responsible for the final disposition of the person, a representative of
19 the scientific institution or medical facility may order the burial of
20 his or her remains.

21 4. A living person may order the burial of human remains
22 removed from his or her body or the burial of his or her body after
23 death. In the latter case, any person acting pursuant to his or her
24 instructions is an authorized agent.

25 5. A person 18 years of age or older wishing to authorize
26 another person to order the burial of his or her human remains in the
27 event of the person's death may execute an affidavit before a notary
28 public in substantially the following form:
