SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the displacement or limitation of competition in providing services by certain local governments. (BDR 21-750)

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AN ACT relating to local government; revising the areas in which an incorporated city may displace or limit competition in providing services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Under existing law, the governing body of an incorporated city may displace or  
2 limit competition in certain areas to provide adequate, economical and efficient  
3 services to the inhabitants of the city. (NRS 268.081) This bill expands the areas in  
4 which the governing body of an incorporated city may displace or limit competition  
5 by removing the requirement that a service otherwise authorized by law to be  
6 provided by the city must also be demanded by the inhabitants of the city.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 268.081 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2 268.081 The governing body of an incorporated city may, to  
3 provide adequate, economical and efficient services to the  
4 inhabitants of the city and to promote the general welfare of those  
5 inhabitants, displace or limit competition in any of the following  
6 areas:  
7 1. Ambulance service.  
8 2. Taxicabs and other public transportation, unless regulated in  
9 that city by an agency of the State.  
10 3. Collection and disposal of garbage and other waste.



- 1       4. Operations at an airport, including, but not limited to, the
- 2 leasing of motor vehicles and the licensing of concession stands, but
- 3 excluding police protection and fire protection.
- 4       5. Water and sewage treatment, unless regulated in that city by
- 5 an agency of the State.
- 6       6. Concessions on, over or under property owned or leased by
- 7 the city.
- 8       7. Operation of landfills.
- 9       8. Search and rescue.
- 10      9. Inspection required by any city ordinance otherwise
- 11 authorized by law.
- 12      10. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 277A.330,
- 13 construction and maintenance of benches and shelters for passengers
- 14 of public mass transportation.
- 15      11. Any other service ~~[demanded by the inhabitants of the city]~~
- 16 which the city itself is otherwise authorized by law to provide.
