ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 188–COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND LABOR

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the practice of optometry. (BDR 54-734)

EXPLANATION - Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to optometry; revising provisions governing the practice of optometry; revising provisions relating to accreditation by the Nevada State Board of Optometry of schools of optometry; revising provisions relating to the suspension of licenses of certain licensees; authorizing the Board to impose administrative fines for certain violations by any person; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law defines the scope of the practice of optometry. (NRS 636.025) **Section 4** of this bill provides that the measurement of the powers or range of human vision by any means, including, without limitation, the use of an autorefractor or other automated testing device, is within the scope of the practice of optometry.

Existing law requires the Nevada State Board of Optometry to accredit schools of optometry. **Section 5** of this bill authorizes the Board to adopt regulations which provide that a school may satisfy the criteria for accreditation if the school is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency or organization.

Existing law requires each applicant for a license to practice optometry in this State to file proof that he or she has graduated from a school of optometry accredited by an established professional agency and the Board. (NRS 636.155) **Section 7** of this bill requires each applicant to file proof that he or she has graduated from a school of optometry accredited by the Board pursuant to **section 5**.

Existing law provides that, upon payment of the prescribed fee, the Executive Director of the Board is required to issue and deliver a license to the licensee. (NRS 636.220) **Section 10** of this bill specifies that the Executive Director must



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only issue and deliver a license to the licensee if the licensee has also met the other requirements for obtaining a license.

Existing law provides that failure to comply with the provisions governing the annual renewal of a license to practice optometry will result in the suspension of the license. (NRS 636.270) Sections 11 and 13 of this bill provide for the retirement of a license to practice optometry and the restoration of a retired license under certain circumstances. Section 12 of this bill authorizes the Board to indicate in its records that a license has been suspended because of the death of the licensee.

Existing law authorizes the Board to assess an administrative fine against any licensed optometrist who violates any provision of existing law, or any regulation of the Board, relating to the practice of optometry. Section 15 of this bill authorizes the Board to assess such administrative fines regardless of whether the person is a licensed optometrist.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 636.016 is hereby amended to read as follows: "Advertise" means the commercial use of any 636.016 medium, including, four not limited to, the without limitation, radio, for television, for a newspaper, magazine, sign newspapers, magazines, signs or any other printed [matter,] or electronic *medium*, by an optometrist to bring the services or materials offered by the optometrist to the attention of members of the general public.

Sec. 2. NRS 636.018 is hereby amended to read as follows: 636.018 "Contact lens" means an ophthalmic lens prescribed for application on the anterior surface of the eye ... and includes decorative and cosmetic contact lenses.

Sec. 3. NRS 636.019 is hereby amended to read as follows:

636.019 "Diagnostic pharmaceutical agents" means [topical ophthalmic anesthetics and topical cycloplegies, miotics and mydriatics.] any agents used to examine and diagnose conditions of the eye.

Sec. 4. NRS 636.025 is hereby amended to read as follows:

636.025 1. The acts set forth in this section, or any of them, whether done severally, collectively or in combination with other acts that are not set forth in this section constitute practice in optometry within the purview of this chapter:

(a) Advertisement or representation as an optometrist.

(b) Adapting, or prescribing or dispensing, without prescription by a practitioner of optometry or medicine licensed in this State, any ophthalmic lens, frame or mounting, or any part thereof, for correction, relief or remedy of any abnormal condition or insufficiency of the eye or any appendage or visual process. The provisions of this paragraph do not prevent an optical mechanic from doing the mere mechanical work of replacement or duplication



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of the ophthalmic lens or prevent a licensed dispensing optician from engaging in the practice of ophthalmic dispensing.

- (c) The examination of the human eye and its appendages, the measurement of the powers or range of human vision \(\frac{1}{2}\) by any means, including, without limitation, the use of an autorefractor or other automated testing device, the determination of the accommodative and refractive states of the eye or the scope of its function in general, or the diagnosis or determination of any visual, muscular, neurological, interpretative or anatomic anomalies or deficiencies of the eye or its appendages or visual processes.
- (d) Prescribing, directing the use of or using any optical device in connection with ocular exercises, orthoptics or visual training.
 - (e) The prescribing of contact lenses.
- (f) The measurement, fitting or adaptation of contact lenses to the human eye except under the direction and supervision of a physician, surgeon or optometrist licensed in the State of Nevada.
- (g) The topical use of diagnostic pharmaceutical agents to determine any visual, muscular, neurological, interpretative or anatomic anomalies or deficiencies of the eye or its appendages or visual processes.
- (h) Prescribing, directing the use of or using a therapeutic pharmaceutical agent to treat an abnormality of the eye or its appendages.
- (i) Removing a foreign object from the surface or epithelium of the eye.
- (j) The ordering of laboratory tests to assist in the diagnosis of an abnormality of the eye or its appendages.
- 2. The provisions of this section do not authorize an optometrist to engage in any practice which includes:
 - (a) The incision or suturing of the eye or its appendages; or
 - (b) The use of lasers for surgical purposes.
 - **Sec. 5.** NRS 636.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 636.135 The Board [shall]:
- 1. Shall accredit schools in and out of this State teaching the science and art of optometry which it finds are giving a sufficient and thorough course of study for the preparation of optometrists [.]; and
- 2. May adopt regulations which provide that the findings required by subsection 1 may be satisfied if a school is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency or organization.
 - **Sec. 6.** NRS 636.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 636.150 Any person applying for a license to practice optometry in this State must:
 - 1. File proof of his or her qualifications;
 - 2. Make application for an examination;





- 3. Take and pass the examination [;] administered by the Board or the testing agency that has been designated by the Board to conduct its examinations;
 - 4. Pay the prescribed fees; and

- 5. Verify that all the information he or she has provided to the Board or to any other entity pursuant to the provisions of this chapter is true and correct.
 - **Sec. 7.** NRS 636.155 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 636.155 An applicant must file with the Executive Director satisfactory proof that the applicant:
 - 1. Is at least 21 years of age;
- 2. Is a citizen of the United States or is lawfully entitled to reside and work in this country;
 - 3. Is of good moral character;
 - 4. Has been certified or recertified as completing a course of cardiopulmonary resuscitation within the 12-month period immediately preceding the examination for licensure; and
 - 5. Has graduated from a school of optometry accredited by [the established professional agency and] the Board [, maintaining a standard of 6 college years, and including, as a prerequisite to admission to the courses in optometry, at least 2 academic years of study in a college of arts and sciences accredited by the Association of American Universities or a similar regional accrediting agency.] pursuant to NRS 636.135.
 - **Sec. 8.** NRS 636.170 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 636.170 1. The Board or the testing agency that has been designated by the Board to conduct its examinations shall [:
 - 1. Conduct conduct a regular annual examination, and may conduct a special examination when the Board deems that circumstances warrant such examination.
 - 2. **[Fix]** The Board shall fix and announce the time and place of any examination at least 30 days **[prior to]** before the day **[when]** on which it is to be commenced.
 - **Sec. 9.** NRS 636.190 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 636.190 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 622.090, a grade of 75 or higher for each area tested on the examination is required to pass an examination [...] administered by the Board or the testing agency that has been designated by the Board to conduct its examinations.
 - **Sec. 10.** NRS 636.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 636.220 The [license must be issued and delivered by the] Executive Director shall issue a license to an applicant who satisfies the [licensee upon payment to the Executive Director of the prescribed fee.] requirements of NRS 636.150.





Sec. 11. NRS 636.260 is hereby amended to read as follows: 636.260 1. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:*

(a) Before March 1 of each year, each licensee shall pay a renewal fee to the Executive Director in the amount specified in NRS 636.143. For the purposes of this [subsection,] paragraph, the date of the postmark on any payment received by mail shall be deemed to be the date of receipt by the Executive Director.

[2-] (b) The renewal fee must be accompanied by satisfactory evidence that the licensee has, within the immediately preceding 12-month period, completed the required number of hours in a course or courses of continuing education that have been approved by the Board. This evidence must be indicated on the form for proof of completion of continuing education that is furnished by the Board. The Board shall not require a licensee to complete more than 24 hours of continuing education during each year. The Board may waive the requirement that a licensee complete all or part of the required number of hours of continuing education upon good cause shown by the licensee.

[3-] (c) A licensee who is certified to administer and prescribe therapeutic pharmaceutical agents pursuant to NRS 636.288 must, at the time of paying the renewal fee, present evidence satisfactory to the Executive Director that, during the 12 months immediately preceding the payment of the renewal fee, the licensee completed an educational or postgraduate program approved by the Board. The Board shall establish the number of hours for completion of the program which must be not less than 30 hours nor more than 50 hours.

2. A licensee is not required to pay the renewal fee or complete the hours of continuing education required by subsection 1 if the licensee indicates, on a form prescribed by the Board, that he or she is retired from the practice of optometry in this State and requests that the Board retire his or her license. A licensee whose license is retired pursuant to this subsection shall not practice optometry in this State unless his or her license is restored in the manner specified in NRS 636.275.

Sec. 12. NRS 636.270 is hereby amended to read as follows:

636.270 [Iff] 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, if a licensee fails to comply with the provisions of NRS 636.260 on or before the prescribed date, the license must be suspended effective March 1, and must remain suspended until it is restored in the manner specified in NRS 636.275.

2. If a licensee does not comply with the provisions of NRS 636.260 because the licensee is deceased, the Board may indicate in its records that the license is suspended because of the death of the licensee.





- **Sec. 13.** NRS 636.275 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 636.275 1. A license which has been suspended for failure of the licensee to pay the annual renewal fee or to submit all information required to complete the renewal may be restored at any time during the calendar year upon the licensee:
 - (a) Paying the annual fee;

- (b) Paying the Executive Director a nonrenewal penalty in the amount prescribed by NRS 636.285; and
 - (c) Submitting all required information.
- 2. A license which has been suspended for failure of the licensee to submit evidence of completion of the required number of hours of continuing education may be restored upon the licensee completing the continuing education, if such completion occurs during the calendar year in which the suspension has occurred.
- 3. Any license suspended pursuant to the provisions of NRS 636.270 must be revoked at the end of the calendar year during which it was suspended unless the license is restored pursuant to subsection 1 or 2.
- 4. A license which has been retired pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 636.260 may be restored at any time upon:
- (a) Approval by the Board of a written request for restoration of the license submitted by the licensee;
 - (b) Payment by the licensee of the annual fee;
 - (c) Submission by the licensee of all required information; and
- (d) Completion by the licensee of the number of hours of continuing education as may be required by the Board as a condition of restoration of the retired license.
 - **Sec. 14.** NRS 636.382 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 636.382 1. No licensed optometrist may administer **[topical ophthalmic] diagnostic** pharmaceutical agents unless the optometrist has received certification from the Board authorizing him or her to do so.
- 2. The Board shall adopt regulations prescribing the diagnostic uses to which the agents enumerated in subsection 3 may be put, the manner in which such agents may be used, and thel qualifications and requirements for such certification which must include:
 - (a) A valid license to practice optometry in this State;
- (b) Satisfactory completion of a curriculum approved by the Board, which must include general and ocular pharmacology, at an institution approved by the Board and accredited by a regional or professional accrediting organization and recognized or approved by the Council [on Post Secondary] for Higher Education Accreditation, the Northwest Accreditation [Association] Commission or the United States Department of Education; and





- (c) Successful completion of an appropriate examination approved and administered by the Board [-
- 3. The following topical ophthalmic pharmaceutical agents may be used for diagnostic purposes by an optometrist who has been authorized by the Board to do so:
- 6 (a) Mydriatics;

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- 7 (b) Cycloplegics;
- 8 (c) Topical anesthetics; and
- 9 (d) Miotics.] or the testing agency that has been designated by the Board to conduct its examinations.
 - **Sec. 15.** NRS 636.420 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 636.420 Any person [licensed under this chapter] who violates any provision of this chapter or any regulation of the Board relating to the practice of optometry is liable to the Board for an administrative fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$5,000.
