## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 242–COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON SENIOR CITIZENS, VETERANS AND ADULTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS)

## Referred to Committee on Transportation

SUMMARY—Authorizes the placement of a designation of veteran status on certain documents issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles. (BDR 43-145)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; authorizing a person who has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States to obtain a designation on his or her instruction permit, driver's license or identification card indicating that he or she is a veteran; requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles, on a monthly basis, to submit to the Office of Veterans Services a list of persons who have declared that they are veterans of the Armed Forces; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to place a designation
 on the instruction permit, driver's license or identification card of certain persons,
 including persons with a disability which impairs or limits the ability to walk. (NRS
 483.349, 483.865) Existing law also requires the Department to inquire whether a
 person wishes to declare that he or she is a veteran when applying for an instruction
 permit, driver's license or identification card. (NRS 483.292, 483.852)
 Sections 6 and 9 of this bill require that a person who: (1) applies to the
 Department for the initial issuance or renewal of an instruction permit, driver's

Sections 6 and 9 of this bill require that a person who: (1) applies to the Department for the initial issuance or renewal of an instruction permit, driver's license or identification card; and (2) requests to have imprinted on that permit, license or card a designation that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty," indicating that he or she was honorably discharged from the Armed Forces. If such a person fulfills the requirements of section 6 or 9,





14 as applicable, sections 2 and 3 of this bill require the Department to place a 15 designation that the person is a veteran on the person's instruction permit, driver's 16 license or identification card, as appropriate. Sections 6 and 9 also require the 17 Department to compile and submit to the Office of Veterans Services each month a list of persons who have declared that they are veterans of the Armed Forces.

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## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 483 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. Upon the application of a person who requests 3 that his or her instruction permit or driver's license indicate that 4 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States 5 pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 483.292, and who satisfies the 6 requirements of that subsection, the Department shall place on 7 any instruction permit or driver's license issued to the person 8 9 pursuant to the provisions of this chapter a designation that the 10 person is a veteran.

2. The Director shall determine the design and placement of 11 the designation of veteran status required by subsection 1 on any 12 instruction permit or driver's license to which this section applies. 13

Sec. 3. 1. Upon the application of a person who requests 14 that his or her identification card indicate that he or she is a 15 veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States pursuant to 16 subsection 3 of NRS 483.852, and who satisfies the requirements 17 of that subsection, the Department shall place on any 18 identification card issued to the person pursuant to this section 19 and NRS 483.810 to 483.890, inclusive, a designation that the 20 21 person is a veteran.

The Director shall determine the design and placement of 22 *2*. the designation of veteran status required by subsection 1 on any 23 identification card to which this section applies. 24 25

Sec. 4. NRS 483.015 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.015 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 483.330, the 26 provisions of NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, and section 2 of 27 this act apply only with respect to noncommercial drivers' licenses. 28

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Sec. 5. NRS 483.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.020 As used in NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and* 30 section 2 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the 31 words and terms defined in NRS 483.030 to 483.190, inclusive, 32 33 have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections. 34

**Sec. 6.** NRS 483.292 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.292 1. When a person applies to the Department for *the* 35 *initial issuance of* an instruction permit or driver's license pursuant 36





to NRS 483.290 H or the renewal of an instruction permit or 1 2 *driver's license*, the Department shall inquire whether the person 3 desires to declare that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of 4 the United States.

5 2. If the person desires to declare pursuant to subsection 1 that 6 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 7 person shall provide *[evidence]*:

(a) Evidence satisfactory to the Department that he or she has 8 been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United 9 10 States **H**; and

11 (b) A written release authorizing the Department to provide to 12 the Office of Veterans Services personal information about the person, which release must be signed by the person and in a form 13 14 required by the Director pursuant to NRS 481.063.

15 If the person declares pursuant to subsection 1 that he or 3. she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 16 17 Department shall count the declaration and maintain it only 18 numerically in a record kept by the Department for that purpose.] In 19 addition to the declaration described in subsection 1, a person who is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States and who 20 21 wishes to have placed on his or her instruction permit or driver's 22 license a designation that he or she is a veteran, as described in 23 section 2 of this act, must:

24 (a) If applying for the initial issuance of an instruction permit 25 or driver's license, appear in person at an office of the Department and submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of 26 27 Release or Discharge from Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of Defense, indicating that the person has been 28 29 honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States.

30 (b) If applying for the renewal of an instruction permit or 31 driver's license upon which a designation that the person is a 32 veteran:

33 (1) Is not placed, submit by mail or in person a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from 34 Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of Defense, 35 36 indicating that the person has been honorably discharged from the 37 Armed Forces of the United States.

38 (2) Is placed, submit by mail, in person or by other means 39 authorized by the Department a statement that the person wishes the instruction permit or driver's license to continue to designate 40 41 that the person is a veteran. 42

The Department shall, at least once each **[quarter:]** month: 4.

43 (a) Compile [the aggregate number] *a list* of persons who have, during the immediately preceding **[quarter,]** month, declared 44





1 pursuant to subsection 1 that they are veterans of the Armed Forces 2 of the United States; and

3 (b) Transmit that <u>[number]</u> *list* to the Office of Veterans 4 Services to be used for statistical *and communication* purposes.

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Sec. 7. NRS 483.530 is hereby amended to read as follows:

6 483.530 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, it is 7 a misdemeanor for any person:

8 (a) To display or cause or permit to be displayed or possess any 9 cancelled, revoked, suspended, fictitious, fraudulently altered or 10 fraudulently obtained driver's license;

11 (b) To alter, forge, substitute, counterfeit or use an unvalidated 12 driver's license;

(c) To lend his or her driver's license to any other person orknowingly permit the use thereof by another;

15 (d) To display or represent as one's own any driver's license not 16 issued to him or her;

17 (e) To fail or refuse to surrender to the Department, a peace 18 officer or a court upon lawful demand any driver's license which 19 has been suspended, revoked or cancelled;

20 (f) To permit any unlawful use of a driver's license issued to 21 him or her;

(g) To do any act forbidden, or fail to perform any act required,
by NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive <sup>[+]</sup>, *and section 2 of this act;*or

(h) To photograph, photostat, duplicate or in any way reproduce
any driver's license or facsimile thereof in such a manner that it
could be mistaken for a valid license, or to display or possess any
such photograph, photostat, duplicate, reproduction or facsimile
unless authorized by this chapter.

30 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a person 31 who uses a false or fictitious name in any application for a driver's license or identification card or who knowingly makes a false 32 33 statement or knowingly conceals a material fact or otherwise commits a fraud in any such application is guilty of a category E 34 felony and shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130. If the 35 false statement, knowing concealment of a material fact or other 36 37 commission of fraud described in this subsection relates solely to 38 the age of a person, including, without limitation, to establish false proof of age to game, purchase alcoholic beverages or purchase 39 40 cigarettes or other tobacco products, the person is guilty of a 41 misdemeanor.

Sec. 8. NRS 483.620 is hereby amended to read as follows:

43 483.620 It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of
44 the provisions of NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and section 2*45 of this act, unless such violation is, by NRS 483.010 to 483.630,



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1 inclusive, and section 2 of this act or other law of this State, 2 declared to be a felony. 3

**Sec. 9.** NRS 483.852 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 1. When a person applies to the Department for *the* 483.852 initial issuance of an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.850 5  $\frac{1}{1}$  or the renewal of an identification card pursuant to NRS 6 7 483.875, the Department shall inquire whether the person desires to declare that he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United 8 9 States

10 2. If the person desires to declare pursuant to subsection 1 that 11 he or she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 12 person shall provide *[evidence]*:

13 (a) Evidence satisfactory to the Department that he or she has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United 14 15 States **H** : and

16 (b) A written release authorizing the Department to provide to 17 the Office of Veterans Services personal information about the 18 person, which release must be signed by the person and in a form 19 required by the Director pursuant to NRS 481.063.

3. If the person declares pursuant to subsection 1 that he or 20 she is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 21 22 Department shall count the declaration and maintain it only 23 numerically in a record kept by the Department for that purpose.] In addition to the declaration described in subsection 1, a person who 24 25 is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States and who wishes to have placed on his or her identification card a 26 27 designation that he or she is a veteran, as described in section 3 of 28 this act, must:

(a) If applying for the initial issuance of an identification card, 29 30 appear in person at an office of the Department and submit a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge 31 from Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of 32 Defense, indicating that the person has been honorably 33 discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States. 34

35 (b) If applying for the renewal of an identification card upon 36 which a designation that the person is a veteran:

37 (1) Is not placed, submit by mail or in person a copy of his or her DD Form 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from 38 39 Active Duty," issued by the United States Department of Defense, indicating that the person has been honorably discharged from the 40 41 Armed Forces of the United States.

42 (2) Is placed, submit by mail, in person or by other means 43 authorized by the Department a statement that the person wishes 44 the identification card to continue to designate that the person is a 45 veteran.





4. The Department shall, at least once each [quarter:] month: (a) Compile [the aggregate number] a list of persons who have, during the immediately preceding [quarter,] month, declared pursuant to subsection 1 that they are veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States; and 

 (b) Transmit that [number] list to the Office of Veterans
 Services to be used for statistical and communication purposes.
 Sec. 10. This act becomes effective on January 1, 2014.
