ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 324–ASSEMBLYWOMAN CARLTON

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to dental assistants. (BDR 54-938)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets *fomitted material* is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to dental assistants; prohibiting a person from acting as a dental assistant except under certain circumstances; providing for issuance by the Board of Dental Examiners of Nevada of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant; providing that a dental assistant or registered dental assistant may perform only certain acts authorized by the Board and under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist or dental hygienist; setting forth certain requirements for the issuance and renewal of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides for the licensing and regulation of dentists and dental 1 2345678 hygienists by the Board of Dental Examiners of Nevada. (Chapter 631 of NRS) This bill provides for the regulation of dental assistants and registered dental assistants by the Board. Section 4 of this bill provides that a dental assistant or registered dental assistant may perform only the intraoral tasks and dental procedures authorized by the Board and only under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist or dental hygienist. Section 5 of this bill prohibits a person from acting as a dental assistant in this State unless the person provides to the Board certain information relating to his or her qualifications. Section 6 of this bill ğ 10 prohibits a person from acting as a registered dental assistant in this State unless the 11 person holds a certificate of registration as a dental assistant. Section 6 also sets 12 forth the requirements for the issuance by the Board of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant, and provides that a certificate of registration as a dental assistant expires 2 years after the date of issuance and may be renewed biennially. 13 14 15 Section 7 of this bill sets forth the continuing education requirements for renewal 16 of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant. Section 8 of this bill requires the





19 intraoral tasks and dental procedures which a dental assistant or registered dental

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 631 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. "Dental assistant" means a person who assists a 5 dentist or dental hygienist in the performance of dental 6 procedures.

7 Sec. 3. "Registered dental assistant" means a person to 8 whom the Board has issued a certificate of registration as a dental 9 assistant pursuant to section 6 of this act.

10 Sec. 4. A dental assistant or registered dental assistant may 11 perform only those intraoral tasks and dental procedures 12 authorized by the Board pursuant to the rules and regulations 13 adopted pursuant to NRS 631.317 and only under the direct 14 supervision of a licensed dentist or dental hygienist.

15 Sec. 5. 1. A person shall not act as a dental assistant in this 16 State unless the person presents proof satisfactory to the Board 17 that the person:

(a) Has passed a written examination given by the Board on
 the contents and interpretation of this chapter and the regulations
 adopted pursuant thereto; and

(b) Has successfully completed a course of study in radiation
 safety and techniques that is approved by the Board.

23 2. Not less frequently than every 2 years, a dental assistant 24 shall provide proof satisfactory to the Board that the dental 25 assistant has completed:

(a) A course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation according to the
 guidelines of the American National Red Cross or American
 Heart Association; and

(b) Four hours of continuing education relating to infection
 control procedures.

Sec. 6. 1. A person shall not act as a registered dental assistant in this State unless the person holds a current certificate of registration as a dental assistant issued by the Board pursuant to this section. A person may apply to the Board for the issuance of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant by submitting an application to the Board.





1 *2*. The Board shall issue a certificate of registration as a 2 dental assistant to an applicant who submits an application which 3 provides proof satisfactory to the Board that the applicant: 4 (a) Is of good moral character; 5 (b) Is 18 years of age or older; (c) Is a citizen of the United States or is lawfully entitled to 6 remain and work in the United States; 7 (d) Holds a current certification issued by the Dental Assisting 8 9 National Board, Inc., or its successor organization; 10 (e) Has passed a written examination given by the Board on the contents and interpretation of this chapter and the regulations 11 12 adopted pursuant thereto: 13 (f) Has successfully completed a course of study in radiation 14 safety and techniques that is approved by the Board; and 15 (g) Meets any other requirements for the issuance of a certificate of registration established by the Board by regulation. 16 17 3. A certificate of registration as a dental assistant issued by 18 the Board pursuant to this section expires 2 years after the date on which it is issued and may be renewed biennially as provided in 19 20 section 7 of this act. 4. In determining whether an applicant is of good moral 21 22 character, the Board may consider whether: (a) The applicant has, on or after July 1, 2014, performed any 23 act as a registered dental assistant in this State without a 24 25 certificate of registration as a registered dental assistant issued by 26 the Board: 27 (b) The applicant's license or registration as a dental assistant in another state has been suspended or revoked; and 28 29 (c) The applicant is currently involved in any disciplinary action concerning his or her license or registration as a dental 30 31 assistant in another state. Sec. 7. 1. Any person wishing to renew a certificate of 32 33 registration as a dental assistant must present proof satisfactory to the Board that during the 2 years immediately preceding the date 34 35 of renewal, the registered dental assistant has successfully 36 completed: 37 (a) A course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation according to the 38 guidelines of the American National Red Cross or American 39 Heart Association: and 40 (b) Four hours of continuing education relating to infection 41 control procedures. 2. All persons who have satisfied the requirements for the 42 43 issuance of a certificate of registration as a dental assistant must 44 be registered as dental assistants on the board register, as provided 45 in this chapter, and are entitled to receive a certificate of

The Board shall adopt such regulations as it 3 determines necessary to carry out the provisions of sections 2 to 9, 4 5 inclusive, of this act. 6 Sec. 9. In addition to any other requirements set forth in 30 this chapter: 31 (a) An applicant for the issuance of a license to practice dentistry or dental hygiene or a certificate of registration as a 32 33 *dental assistant* shall include the social security number of the 34 applicant in the application submitted to the Board. 35 (b) An applicant for the issuance or renewal of a license to practice dentistry or dental hygiene or a certificate of registration 36 as a dental assistant shall submit to the Board the statement 37 prescribed by the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of 38 39 the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to NRS 40 425.520. 15 If an applicant indicates on the statement submitted pursuant 4 16 to subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan 17 18 approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the 19 order, the Board shall advise the applicant to contact the district 20 21 attorney or other public agency enforcing the order to determine the 22 actions that the applicant may take to satisfy the arrearage.

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Sec. 13. NRS 631.313 is hereby amended to read as follows:

24 1. A licensed dentist may assign to a person in his or 631.313 25 her employ who is a dental hygienist, *registered* dental assistant, 26 *dental assistant* or other person directly or indirectly involved in the 27 provision of dental care only such intraoral tasks as may be permitted by a regulation of the Board or by the provisions of this 28 29 chapter.

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The performance of these tasks must be: 2.

31 (a) If performed by a dental assistant or a person, other than a dental hygienist $\frac{1}{12}$ or registered dental assistant, who is directly or 32 33 indirectly involved in the provision of dental care, under the 34 supervision of the licensed dentist who made the assignment.

(b) If performed by a dental hygienist, authorized by the 35 36 licensed dentist of the patient for whom the tasks will be performed, 37 except as otherwise provided in NRS 631.287.

38 (c) If performed by a registered dental assistant, under the 39 direct supervision of a licensed dentist or dental hygienist. 40

3. No such assignment is permitted that requires:

41 (a) The diagnosis, treatment planning, prescribing of drugs or medicaments, or authorizing the use of restorative, prosthodontic or 42 43 orthodontic appliances.





1 (b) Surgery on hard or soft tissues within the oral cavity or any 2 other intraoral procedure that may contribute to or result in an 3 irremediable alteration of the oral anatomy.

4 (c) The administration of general anesthesia, conscious sedation 5 or deep sedation except as otherwise authorized by regulations 6 adopted by the Board.

7 (d) The performance of a task outside the authorized scope of 8 practice of the employee who is being assigned the task.

9 4. A dental hygienist may, pursuant to regulations adopted by 10 the Board, administer local anesthesia or nitrous oxide in a health 11 care facility, as defined in NRS 162A.740, if:

(a) The dental hygienist is so authorized by the licensed dentist
of the patient to whom the local anesthesia or nitrous oxide is
administered; and

15 (b) The health care facility has licensed medical personnel and 16 necessary emergency supplies and equipment available when the 17 local anesthesia or nitrous oxide is administered.

Sec. 14. NRS 631.317 is hereby amended to read as follows:

631.317 The Board shall adopt rules or regulations:

1. Specifying the intraoral tasks that may be assigned by a licensed dentist to a dental hygienist <u>for dental assistant</u> in his or her employ or that may be performed by a dental hygienist engaged in school health activities or employed by a public health agency.

24 2. Specifying the intraoral tasks and dental procedures that 25 may be assigned by a licensed dentist to and performed by a dental 26 assistant or registered dental assistant in his or her employ.

3. Governing the practice of dentists, [and] dental hygienists,
 registered dental assistants and dental assistants in full-time
 employment with the State of Nevada.

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Sec. 15. NRS 631.3487 is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 631.3487 1. If the Board receives a copy of a court order 32 issued pursuant to NRS 425.540 that provides for the suspension of 33 all professional, occupational and recreational licenses, certificates and permits issued to a person who is the holder of a license to 34 practice dentistry or dental hygiene $\frac{1}{2}$ or a certificate of 35 registration as a dental assistant, the Board shall deem the license 36 37 or certificate of registration issued to that person to be suspended at 38 the end of the 30th day after the date on which the court order was issued unless the Board receives a letter issued to the holder of the 39 40 license *or certificate of registration* by the district attorney or other 41 public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 stating that the holder of the 42 license or certificate of registration has complied with the subpoena 43 or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560.

44 2. The Board shall reinstate a license to practice dentistry or 45 dental hygiene *or a certificate of registration as a dental assistant*





1 that has been suspended by a district court pursuant to NRS 425.540 2 if

3 (a) The Board receives a letter issued by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 to the person whose 4 license or certificate of registration was suspended stating that the 5 person whose license or certificate of registration was suspended 6 has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the 7 arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560; and 8

(b) The person whose license or certificate of registration was 9 suspended pays [the] any applicable fee imposed pursuant to NRS 10 631.345 for the reinstatement of a suspended license H or 11 certificate of registration. 12 13

Sec. 16. This act becomes effective:

14 Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting 1. regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative 15 tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and 16

2. On July 1, 2014, for all other purposes. 17

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
