

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 386—ASSEMBLYMEN WOODBURY,
OHRENSCHALL; AND STEWART

MARCH 18, 2013

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Establishes a pilot program for the administration of mental health screenings to pupils enrolled in selected secondary schools in the Clark County School District and the Washoe County School District. (BDR S-1022)

AN ACT relating to education; establishing a pilot program in the Clark County School District and the Washoe County School District for the administration of mental health screenings to pupils enrolled in selected secondary schools within each school district; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill establishes a pilot program in the Clark County School District and the
2 Washoe County School District for the administration of mental health screenings
3 to pupils enrolled in at least one secondary school within each school district.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby established a pilot program in
2 the Clark County School District and the Washoe County School
3 District. For purposes of the pilot program, the board of trustees of
4 the Clark County School District and the board of trustees of the
5 Washoe County School District shall each:
6 (a) Provide for the administration of mental health screenings to
7 pupils enrolled in at least one secondary school within the school
8 district, as selected by the school district.



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1 (b) Select an age-appropriate, professionally recognized mental
2 health screening for administration to the pupils enrolled in each
3 secondary school selected for the pilot program.

4 (c) Assist the principal of each secondary school selected for the
5 pilot program with identifying professionally qualified persons to
6 administer the mental health screenings to pupils and to conduct
7 follow-up screenings if a pupil scores in a range which indicates that
8 he or she may have a mental health issue.

9 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, each
10 secondary school selected for the pilot program shall provide for the
11 administration of the mental health screening selected by the school
12 district by qualified persons to the pupils enrolled in the secondary
13 school or to pupils enrolled in selected grades at the secondary
14 school, as determined by the school district. The school district shall
15 ensure that if a pupil is absent or otherwise not available on the day
16 scheduled for administration of the mental health screenings, a
17 make-up administration is scheduled for the pupil within a
18 reasonable time period.

19 3. Before administration of the mental health screening to a
20 pupil pursuant to subsection 2, the principal of the secondary school
21 shall provide advance written notice of the screening to the parent or
22 guardian of the pupil. The notice must inform the parent or guardian
23 of his or her right to exempt the pupil from the screening and
24 contain a form for the signature of the parent or guardian to exempt
25 the pupil from the screening. If a form of exemption is signed by the
26 parent or guardian and returned to the school, the principal must
27 exempt the pupil and the pupil must not undergo the mental health
28 screening.

29 4. If a pupil scores on a mental health screening administered
30 pursuant to subsection 2 in a range which indicates the pupil may
31 have a mental health issue, the school district shall ensure that an
32 appropriate qualified professional conducts an in-person assessment
33 of the pupil to determine the need, if any, for further diagnosis and
34 treatment. If such a professional determines that the pupil should
35 undergo further diagnosis or treatment, the school district shall
36 provide the parent or guardian of the pupil with a list of resources
37 available from the school district and in the county to assist the
38 parent or guardian with obtaining appropriate further professional
39 diagnosis and, if necessary, treatment for the pupil.

40 **Sec. 2.** 1. On or before April 1, 2014, the Clark County
41 School District and the Washoe County School District shall
42 provide a report to the Legislative Committee on Education
43 concerning the status of the implementation of the pilot program for
44 mental health screenings required by section 1 of this act.



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1 2. On or before December 1, 2014, the Clark County School
2 District and the Washoe County School District shall each submit a
3 report to the Department of Education which includes, without
4 limitation, and except as otherwise provided in subsection 3:

5 (a) The number of secondary schools in the school district
6 selected for the pilot program;

7 (b) The number of pupils in each grade level of the secondary
8 school selected for the pilot program and the actual number of
9 pupils who underwent mental health screenings pursuant to the pilot
10 program;

11 (c) The number of pupils whose parents or guardians opted out
12 of administering the mental health screening to the pupil;

13 (d) The number of pupils who scored in a range indicating that
14 the pupil may have a mental health issue and a description of the
15 types of resources which were referred to the parent or guardian of
16 the pupil;

17 (e) If available, an indication of how many parents and
18 guardians followed up by seeking professional help for further
19 diagnosis and, if necessary, treatment for the pupil;

20 (f) An evaluation of whether the pilot program was useful in
21 identifying pupils with possible mental health issues and assisting
22 the parents and guardians of those pupils with obtaining appropriate
23 professional diagnosis and treatment; and

24 (g) Recommendations for expanding the number of schools that
25 participate in a program of mental health screenings for pupils if the
26 Legislature determines to continue and expand the program.

27 3. If any of the information required by the report pursuant to
28 subsection 2 would reveal the individual identity of a pupil, the
29 school district shall not include that information in the report.

30 4. On or before January 1, 2015, the Department of Education
31 shall compile each report received pursuant to subsection 2 and
32 submit the written compilation, including, without limitation,
33 recommendations for continuing and expanding the pilot program
34 for mental health screenings to pupils, to the Director of the
35 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 78th Session of the
36 Nevada Legislature.

37 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
