SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the Knowledge Fund. (BDR 18-884)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets {omitted material} is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the Knowledge Fund; requiring the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development to create a corporation for public benefit for the purposes of administering the Knowledge Fund; establishing a board of directors to govern the Corporation; requiring the board of directors to appoint the President of the Corporation; authorizing the President, as the appointed executive head of the Corporation, to oversee the administration of the Knowledge Fund; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Knowledge Fund to support commercialization and 1 2345678 technology transfer to the private sector and requires the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development to administer the Fund. (NRS 231.1591-231.1597) Section 2 of this bill requires the Executive Director to create a nonprofit corporation for public benefit for the purposes of administering the Knowledge Fund in lieu of the Fund being administered by the Executive Director. Section $\hat{2}$ requires that the Corporation be governed by a board of directors, and section $\hat{3}$ of this bill authorizes the board of directors to appoint the President of the 9 Corporation. Sections 4-11 of this bill establish the duties and responsibilities of 10 the President as the appointed executive head of the Corporation and authorize the 11 President to perform the administrative tasks relative to the management of the 12 Fund that are currently carried out by the Executive Director.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1	Section 1. Chapter 231 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2	thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

20	(6) Clean and renewable energy; and
21	(7) Mining, textiles and manufacturing; and
22	(e) One member from the private sector appointed by the

24	3. The President shall serve as a nonvoting member of the

26	4. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the
27	members of the board of directors who are appointed pursuant to
28	paragraph (d) of subsection 2 are each appointed for a term of 4
29	years. The initial members of the board who are appointed
30	pursuant to paragraph (d) of subsection 2 shall by lot select three
31	of those members to serve an initial term of 2 years.

"Corporation" means the corporation for public benefit 39 2. created pursuant to section 2 of this act. 40 "President" means the President of the Corporation. 41 3. 42 "Research universities" means the University of Nevada, 4. Las Vegas, and the University of Nevada, Reno. 43





Sec. 6. NRS 231.1592 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 231.1592 1. The Knowledge Fund is hereby created in the 3 State Treasury.

4 2. The Knowledge Fund is a continuing fund without 5 reversion. The interest and income earned on money in the 6 Knowledge Fund, after deducting any applicable charges, must be 7 credited to the Knowledge Fund.

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3. The [Executive Director:] President:

9 (a) Shall administer the Knowledge Fund in a manner that is 10 consistent with the State Plan for Economic Development developed 11 by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053;

(b) May apply for and accept any gift, grant, donation, bequest
 or other source of money for deposit in the Knowledge Fund; and

(c) Subject to any restrictions imposed by such a grant, gift,
donation or appropriation, may allocate money in the Knowledge
Fund among the research universities, the Desert Research Institute,
the technology outreach program established pursuant to NRS
231.1596 and the technology transfer offices of the research
universities and the Desert Research Institute to support
commercialization and technology transfer to the private sector.

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Sec. 7. NRS 231.1593 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22 231.1593 1. The *Executive Director President* may enter 23 into agreements, when the **Executive Director President** deems 24 such an agreement to be appropriate, with the research universities 25 the Desert Research Institute for the allocation and of commercialization revenue between the Office, the research 26 27 universities and the Desert Research Institute. Anv commercialization revenue received by the Office pursuant to such 28 29 an agreement must be deposited in the Knowledge Fund created by 30 NRS 231 1592

2. In consideration of the money and services provided or agreed to be provided by the Office, the research universities and the Desert Research Institute shall agree to allocate commercialization revenue in accordance with any agreement entered into pursuant to subsection 1.

36 3. As used in this section, "commercialization revenue" means 37 dividends, realized capital gains, license fees, royalty fees and other 38 revenues received by a research university or the Desert Research 39 Institute as a result of commercial applications developed as a result 40 of the programs established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597, 41 inclusive, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act,* less:

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(a) The portion of those revenues allocated to the inventor; and

43 (b) Expenditures incurred by the research university or the 44 Desert Research Institute to legally protect the intellectual property.





Sec. 8. NRS 231.1594 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 231.1594 1. After considering the advice and recommendations of the Board, board of directors of the 3 Corporation, the [Executive Director] President shall establish 4 procedures for applying for an allocation of money from the 5 6 Knowledge Fund created by NRS 231.1592. The procedures must 7 include, without limitation, a requirement that applications for 8 allocations of money set forth:

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(a) The proposed use of the money;

10 (b) The plans, projects and programs for which the money will 11 be used;

(c) The expected benefits of the money; and

13 (d) A statement of the short-term and long-term impacts of the 14 use of the money.

15 2. In accordance with the procedures established pursuant to 16 subsection 1, a research university or the Desert Research Institute 17 may apply for an allocation of money from the Knowledge Fund. 18 Upon receipt of an application for an allocation from the Knowledge 19 Fund, the **Executive Director President** shall review the 20 application and determine whether the approval of the application 21 would promote the economic development of this State and aid the 22 implementation of the State Plan for Economic Development 23 developed by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053. If the *Executive Director* President determines that 24 25 approving the application will promote the economic development of this State and aid the implementation of the State Plan for 26 27 Economic Development, the **Executive Director President** may approve the application and make an allocation of money from the 28 29 Knowledge Fund to the applicant.

30 3. If a research university or the Desert Research Institute 31 receives an allocation of money from the Knowledge Fund, the 32 money must be used for the purposes set forth in NRS 231.1597.

4. In making allocations of money from the Knowledge Fund
 created pursuant to NRS 231.1592, the [Executive Director]
 President must consider:

(a) The extent to which an allocation will promote the economic
development of this State and aid the implementation of the State
Plan for Economic Development developed by the Executive
Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053; and

40 (b) Whether the research universities and the Desert Research
41 Institute have received an equitable share of the allocations of
42 money from the Knowledge Fund.





Sec. 9. NRS 231.1595 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 231.1595 1. In consultation with the [Board] board of 3 directors of the Corporation and the Chancellor, the [Executive 4 Director] President shall:

5 (a) Establish, for the programs established pursuant to NRS 6 231.1591 to 231.1597, inclusive, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act* 7 economic development goals which are consistent with the State 8 Plan for Economic Development developed by the Executive 9 Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053 and the strategic 10 plans of the research universities and the Desert Research Institute.

11 (b) In cooperation with the administration of the research 12 universities and the Desert Research Institute, expand science and 13 technology research at the research universities and the Desert 14 Research Institute.

(c) [Enhance technology transfer and commercialization] *Coordinate the existing efforts* of [research and technologies
developed at] the research universities and the Desert Research
Institute to [create] transfer technology for the purposes of *creating* high-quality jobs and new industries in this State.

(d) Establish economic development objectives for the programs
established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597, inclusive +, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.*

(e) Verify that the programs established pursuant to NRS
231.1591 to 231.1597, inclusive, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act*25 are being enhanced by research grants and that such programs are
26 meeting the [Board's] economic development objectives [.]
27 *established by the President.*

(f) Monitor all research plans that are part of the programs established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597, inclusive, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act* at the research universities and the Desert Research Institute to determine that allocations from the Knowledge Fund created by NRS 231.1592 are being spent in accordance with legislative intent and to maximize the benefit and return to this State.

(g) Develop methods and incentives to encourage investment in
and contributions to the programs established pursuant to NRS
231.1591 to 231.1597, inclusive, *and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act*from the private sector.

(h) Establish requirements for periodic reports from the research
universities and the Desert Research Institute concerning the use of
allocations from the Knowledge Fund pursuant to NRS 231.1597.
The requirements must include, without limitation, a requirement
that the recipient of the allocation include in such a report:



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1 (1) A description of each activity undertaken with money 2 from the allocation and the amount of money used for each such 3 activity; and

4 (2) Such documentation as the *[Executive Director]* 5 *President* deems appropriate to support the information provided in 6 the report.

(i) On or before November 1, 2012, and on or before November
1 of every year thereafter, submit a report to the Governor and to the
Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the
Interim Finance Committee, if the report is received during an oddnumbered year, or to the next session of the Legislature, if the report
is received during an even-numbered year. The report must include,
without limitation:

(1) The number of research teams and faculty recruited, hired
 and retained pursuant to NRS 231.1597 and the amount of funding
 provided to those research teams;

(2) A description of the research being conducted by the
research teams and faculty for which the [Executive Director] *President* has provided funding pursuant to NRS 231.1597;

(3) The number of patents which have been filed as a result
of the programs established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597,
inclusive [;], and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act;

(4) The amount of research grants awarded to the
 research teams and faculty recruited, hired and retained pursuant to
 NRS 231.1597;

(5) The amount of all grants, gifts and donations to theKnowledge Fund from public and private sources;

(6) The number of businesses which have been created or
expanded in this State, or relocated to this State, because of the
programs established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597,
inclusive [1], and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act; and

(7) The number of jobs which have been created or saved as
 a result of the activities of the Office.

34 *(j) Develop and implement a plan to track research and* 35 *researchers across the Nevada System of Higher Education.*

(k) Develop and implement a plan to support expanded
collaboration between the Nevada System of Higher Education
and the private sector, including, without limitation:

39 (1) Identifying the research and development needs of 40 existing businesses and industries operating in this State; and

41 (2) Introducing those businesses and industries to the 42 appropriate research and development personnel and facilities at 43 research universities and the Desert Research Institute.

44 *(l) Actively promote the importance of higher education with* 45 *respect to the development of an innovation-based economy.*





1 (m) Develop and implement a plan to promote interaction 2 between public schools and the Nevada System of Higher Education for the purposes of retaining within this State students 3 4 of exceptional academic merit.

5 (n) Develop and implement a plan to provide incentives to faculty and staff of the Nevada System of Higher Education to 6 7 engage in activities that are commercially driven and that provide 8 opportunities for targeted economic development.

9 2. The **Executive Director President** may enter into any 10 agreements necessary to obtain private equity investment in the programs established pursuant to NRS 231.1591 to 231.1597, 11 12 inclusive [], and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

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Sec. 10. NRS 231.1596 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 231.1596 1. The Executive Director President shall use 15 money in the Knowledge Fund created by NRS 231.1592 to 16 establish a technology outreach program at locations distributed 17 strategically throughout this State.

18 2. The *Executive Director* **President** shall ensure that the 19 technology outreach program acts as a resource to:

20 (a) Broker ideas, new technologies and services to entrepreneurs 21 and businesses throughout a defined service area;

22 (b) Engage local entrepreneurs and faculty and staff at state 23 colleges and community colleges by connecting them to the research 24 universities and the Desert Research Institute;

25 (c) Assist professors and researchers in finding entrepreneurs 26 and investors for the commercialization of their ideas and 27 technologies:

28 (d) Connect market ideas and technologies in new or existing 29 businesses or industries or in state colleges and community colleges 30 with the expertise of the research universities and the Desert 31 Research Institute;

32 (e) Assist businesses, the research universities, state colleges, 33 community colleges and the Desert Research Institute in developing 34 commercial applications for their research; and

35 (f) Disseminate and share discoveries and technologies 36 emanating from the research universities and the Desert Research 37 Institute to local entrepreneurs, businesses, state colleges and 38 community colleges.

39 In designing and operating the technology outreach program, 3. the **Board** board of directors of the corporation shall work 40 41 cooperatively with the technology transfer offices at the research 42 universities and the Desert Research Institute. 43

Sec. 11. NRS 231.1597 is hereby amended to read as follows:

44 231.1597 In consultation with the **Board** board of directors 45 of the corporation and the Chancellor, the **Executive Director**





President shall allocate money in the Knowledge Fund created by
 NRS 231.1592 to the research universities and the Desert Research
 Institute to provide funding for:

4 1. The recruitment, hiring and retention of research teams and 5 faculty to conduct research in science and technology which has the 6 potential to contribute to economic development in this State;

7 2. Research laboratories and related equipment located or to be 8 located in this State;

9 3. The construction of research clinics, institutes and facilities 10 and related buildings located or to be located in this State; and

4. Matching funds for federal and private sector grants and
 contract opportunities that support economic development
 consistent with the State Plan for Economic Development developed
 by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053.

15 Sec. 12. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.

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
