SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing certain professions. (BDR 54-713)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets {omitted material} is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to professions; revising certain provisions governing certain continuing education requirements for physicians; authorizing certain qualified professionals who hold a license in another state or territory of the United States to apply for a license by endorsement to practice in this State; expanding the scope of practice of clinical professional counselors and marriage and family therapists; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law generally provides for the regulation of professions in this State. 23456789 (Title 54 of NRS) Sections 1 and 2 of this bill authorize a physician to substitute not more than 2 hours of continuing education credits in pain management or addiction care for the purposes of satisfying an equivalent requirement for continuing education in ethics. Sections 3 and 11 of this bill authorize certain qualified professionals who are licensed in another state or territory of the United States to practice as a clinical professional counselor, marriage and family therapist, alcohol and drug abuse counselor or problem gambling counselor to apply for and receive a license or certificate by endorsement to practice their respective 10 profession in this State. If the applicant is an active member or veteran of, or the 11 surviving spouse of a veteran of, the Armed Forces of the United States, the 12 applicant is entitled to a 50 percent reduction in the fee for the initial issuance of 13 the license or certificate. Sections 4-6 and 18 of this bill authorize a clinical 14 professional counselor or marriage and family therapist to provide certain services 15 to a person who is an alcohol or drug abuser.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 630.253 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Personal protective equipment required for acts of 20 21 terrorism:

22 (3) Common symptoms and methods of treatment associated with exposure to, or injuries caused by, chemical, biological, 23 24 radioactive and nuclear agents;

(4) Syndromic surveillance and reporting procedures for acts 25 of terrorism that involve biological agents; and 26

(5) An overview of the information available on, and the use 27 28 of, the Health Alert Network.

The Board may thereafter determine whether to include in a 29 program of continuing education additional courses of instruction 30 relating to the medical consequences of an act of terrorism that 31 involves the use of a weapon of mass destruction. 32

33 The Board shall encourage each holder of a license who 3. 34 treats or cares for persons who are more than 60 years of age to 35 receive, as a portion of their continuing education, education in geriatrics and gerontology, including such topics as: 36

(a) The skills and knowledge that the licensee needs to address 37 38 aging issues;

(b) Approaches to providing health care to older persons, 39 including both didactic and clinical approaches; 40

(c) The biological, behavioral, social and emotional aspects of 41 42 the aging process; and





1 (d) The importance of maintenance of function and 2 independence for older persons.

4. The Board shall encourage each holder of a license to practice medicine to receive, as a portion of his or her continuing education, training concerning methods for educating patients about how to effectively manage medications, including, without limitation, the ability of the patient to request to have the symptom or purpose for which a drug is prescribed included on the label attached to the container of the drug.

10 5. A holder of a license to practice medicine may substitute 11 not more than 2 hours of continuing education credits in pain 12 management or addiction care for the purposes of satisfying an 13 equivalent requirement for continuing education in ethics.

Upon a request from the Board, 9 an applicant for renewal of a license to practice osteopathic 10 medicine or a license to practice as a physician assistant shall submit 11 verified evidence satisfactory to the Board that in the year preceding 12 the application for renewal the applicant attended courses or 13 programs of continuing medical education approved by the Board 14 totaling the number of hours established by the Board.

Unless the Board denies the application for good 19 cause, the Board shall approve the application and issue a license 20 by endorsement to the applicant not later than 45 days after 21 22 receiving the application.

23 4. A license by endorsement may be issued at a meeting of the 24 Board or between its meetings by the President of the Board. Such 25 an action shall be deemed to be an action of the Board.
