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SENATE BILL NO. 319—SENATOR HARDY

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing physicians.  
(BDR 54-713)

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AN ACT relating to physicians; revising certain provisions governing certain continuing education requirements for physicians; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law generally provides for the regulation of allopathic and osteopathic  
2 physicians in this State. (Chapters 630 and 633 of NRS) **Section 1** of this bill  
3 authorizes an allopathic physician to substitute not more than 2 hours of continuing  
4 education credits in pain management or addiction care for the purposes of  
5 satisfying an equivalent requirement for continuing education in ethics. **Section 2**  
6 of this bill requires the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine to require, as part of  
7 the continuing education requirements approved by the Board, the biennial  
8 completion by an osteopathic physician of at least 2 hours of credit in pain  
9 management and addiction care.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 630.253 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       630.253   1. The Board shall, as a prerequisite for the:  
3           (a) Renewal of a license as a physician assistant; or  
4           (b) Biennial registration of the holder of a license to practice  
5           medicine,  
6       → require each holder to comply with the requirements for  
7           continuing education adopted by the Board.  
8       2. These requirements:



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1       (a) May provide for the completion of one or more courses of  
2 instruction relating to risk management in the performance of  
3 medical services.

4       (b) Must provide for the completion of a course of instruction,  
5 within 2 years after initial licensure, relating to the medical  
6 consequences of an act of terrorism that involves the use of a  
7 weapon of mass destruction. The course must provide at least 4  
8 hours of instruction that includes instruction in the following  
9 subjects:

10             (1) An overview of acts of terrorism and weapons of mass  
11 destruction;

12             (2) Personal protective equipment required for acts of  
13 terrorism;

14             (3) Common symptoms and methods of treatment associated  
15 with exposure to, or injuries caused by, chemical, biological,  
16 radioactive and nuclear agents;

17             (4) Syndromic surveillance and reporting procedures for acts  
18 of terrorism that involve biological agents; and

19             (5) An overview of the information available on, and the use  
20 of, the Health Alert Network.

21       → The Board may thereafter determine whether to include in a  
22 program of continuing education additional courses of instruction  
23 relating to the medical consequences of an act of terrorism that  
24 involves the use of a weapon of mass destruction.

25       3. The Board shall encourage each holder of a license who  
26 treats or cares for persons who are more than 60 years of age to  
27 receive, as a portion of their continuing education, education in  
28 geriatrics and gerontology, including such topics as:

29             (a) The skills and knowledge that the licensee needs to address  
30 aging issues;

31             (b) Approaches to providing health care to older persons,  
32 including both didactic and clinical approaches;

33             (c) The biological, behavioral, social and emotional aspects of  
34 the aging process; and

35             (d) The importance of maintenance of function and  
36 independence for older persons.

37       4. The Board shall encourage each holder of a license to  
38 practice medicine to receive, as a portion of his or her continuing  
39 education, training concerning methods for educating patients about  
40 how to effectively manage medications, including, without  
41 limitation, the ability of the patient to request to have the symptom  
42 or purpose for which a drug is prescribed included on the label  
43 attached to the container of the drug.

44       5. *A holder of a license to practice medicine may substitute  
45 not more than 2 hours of continuing education credits in pain*



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1   ***management or addiction care for the purposes of satisfying an***  
2   ***equivalent requirement for continuing education in ethics.***

3   **6.** As used in this section:

4       (a) "Act of terrorism" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
5       NRS 202.4415.

6       (b) "Biological agent" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
7       NRS 202.442.

8       (c) "Chemical agent" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
9       NRS 202.4425.

10      (d) "Radioactive agent" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
11     NRS 202.4437.

12      (e) "Weapon of mass destruction" has the meaning ascribed to it  
13    in NRS 202.4445.

14   **Sec. 2.** NRS 633.471 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15   **633.471** 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection ~~IS~~ 6  
16   and NRS 633.491, every holder of a license issued under this  
17   chapter, except a temporary or a special license, may renew the  
18   license on or before January 1 of each calendar year after its  
19   issuance by:

20       (a) Applying for renewal on forms provided by the Board;

21       (b) Paying the annual license renewal fee specified in this  
22   chapter;

23       (c) Submitting a list of all actions filed or claims submitted to  
24   arbitration or mediation for malpractice or negligence against the  
25   holder during the previous year;

26       (d) Submitting an affidavit to the Board that in the year  
27   preceding the application for renewal the holder has attended  
28   courses or programs of continuing education approved by the Board  
29   totaling a number of hours established by the Board which must not  
30   be less than 35 hours nor more than that set in the requirements for  
31   continuing medical education of the American Osteopathic  
32   Association; and

33       (e) Submitting all information required to complete the renewal.

34   2. The Secretary of the Board shall notify each licensee of the  
35   requirements for renewal not less than 30 days before the date of  
36   renewal.

37   3. The Board shall request submission of verified evidence of  
38   completion of the required number of hours of continuing medical  
39   education annually from no fewer than one-third of the applicants  
40   for renewal of a license to practice osteopathic medicine or a license  
41   to practice as a physician assistant. Upon a request from the Board,  
42   an applicant for renewal of a license to practice osteopathic  
43   medicine or a license to practice as a physician assistant shall submit  
44   verified evidence satisfactory to the Board that in the year preceding  
45   the application for renewal the applicant attended courses or



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1 programs of continuing medical education approved by the Board  
2 totaling the number of hours established by the Board.

3       4. The Board shall encourage each holder of a license to  
4 practice osteopathic medicine to receive, as a portion of his or her  
5 continuing education, training concerning methods for educating  
6 patients about how to effectively manage medications, including,  
7 without limitation, the ability of the patient to request to have the  
8 symptom or purpose for which a drug is prescribed included on the  
9 label attached to the container of the drug.

10      5. *The Board shall require, as part of the continuing  
11 education requirements approved by the Board, the biennial  
12 completion by a holder of a license to practice osteopathic  
13 medicine of at least 2 hours of continuing education credits in  
14 pain management or addiction care.*

15      6. Members of the Armed Forces of the United States and the  
16 United States Public Health Service are exempt from payment of the  
17 annual license renewal fee during their active duty status.
