

SENATE BILL NO. 502—COMMITTEE ON  
HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION)

MARCH 25, 2013

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to certain required investigations of the background and personal history of certain persons as a condition of employment, licensure, certification and other privileges. (BDR 40-1137)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public health; authorizing the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to establish an Internet website for certain entities to conduct required background investigations; revising provisions relating to the licensing of certain medical and other related health facilities; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Existing law requires certain entities to conduct a background investigation of  
2 the criminal and personal history of certain persons. (NRS 62B.270, 424.031,  
3 424.039, 427A.701, 427A.735, 432.100, 432A.170, 432A.175, 432B.391,  
4 432B.625, 433B.183, 435B.235, 435.335, 449.122, 449.123) **Section 2** of this bill  
5 authorizes the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to  
6 establish an Internet website for use by these entities in conducting the required  
7 investigations. **Section 3** of this bill describes the information that may be obtained  
8 from a search of the Internet website. **Section 4** of this bill allows the Health  
9 Division to enter into cooperative agreements to obtain and accept information for  
10 inclusion on the Internet website. **Section 5** of this bill describes information that  
11 may be collected, maintained and stored on the Internet website. **Section 6** of this  
12 bill requires the Health Division to limit access to information on the Internet



13 website to information that is necessary for the particular client using the website to  
14 conduct an investigation. **Section 7** of this bill authorizes the Health Division to  
15 adopt regulations to establish a fee for use of the Internet website and to carry out  
16 the provisions relating to the Internet website.

17 Existing law requires investigations of applicants for a license to operate certain  
18 facilities, agencies or homes and investigations of employees or independent  
19 contractors of certain agencies, facilities or homes. (NRS 449.122, 449.123)  
20 **Section 10** of this bill provides certain requirements relating to employees of a  
21 temporary employment service. **Sections 9 and 13-16** of this bill add certain  
22 facilities, agencies, homes and programs which are required to be investigated and  
23 to conduct investigations of their employees, employees from a temporary  
24 employment service and independent contractors. **Sections 14-16** of this bill require  
25 employees of a temporary employment service which provide services to such  
26 entities to be subject to such investigations.

27 **Section 14** also requires such entities to use the Internet website of the Health  
28 Division, if established pursuant to **section 2**, as part of the investigation of  
29 employees, employees of a temporary employment service and independent  
30 contractors. **Section 14** also revises the procedure for conducting background  
31 investigations and exempts certain persons from the criminal background  
32 investigation if an investigation has been conducted within the immediately  
33 preceding 5 years.

34 **Section 15** requires the entities which are required to conduct background  
35 investigations to maintain a current list of its employees, employees from a  
36 temporary employment service and independent contractors and submit the list to  
37 the Health Division for inclusion in the Internet website established pursuant to  
38 **section 2**. **Section 15** also authorizes the Central Repository for Nevada Records of  
39 Criminal History to maintain electronic images of fingerprints for the purpose of  
40 notifying those entities and the Health Division if an employee, employee of a  
41 temporary employment service or independent contractor has been convicted of  
42 certain crimes.

43 Under existing law a license to operate certain facilities, homes or agencies  
44 may be denied, suspended or revoked if an applicant or a licensee has been  
45 convicted of certain crimes. (NRS 449.174) **Section 17** of this bill adds certain  
46 other facilities, hospitals, agencies, homes and programs to this provision. **Section**  
47 **17** also adds battery with the intent to kill or commit sexual assault or mayhem to  
48 the list of crimes, a conviction of which may result in the denial, suspension or  
49 revocation of a license to operate such an entity.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 439 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this  
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2. 1. *The Health Division may establish a secure***  
5 ***Internet website which makes certain information available for a***  
6 ***website client to conduct an investigation into the background and***  
7 ***personal history of a person that is required pursuant to the***  
8 ***provisions of this chapter or chapter 62B, 63, 424, 427A, 432,***  
9 ***432A, 432B, 433, 433B or 435 of NRS.***



1       2. *To become a website client, a person or governmental*  
2 *entity must:*

3       (a) *Create an account on the Internet website;*

4       (b) *Comply with sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this act and any*  
5 *regulations adopted pursuant thereto governing use of the Internet*  
6 *website; and*

7       (c) *Designate a website client administrator who is responsible*  
8 *for:*

9       (1) *Determining the persons who are authorized to use the*  
10 *Internet website;*

11       (2) *Providing the Health Division with the names of the*  
12 *persons who are authorized to use the Internet website;*

13       (3) *Ensuring that only those authorized persons have*  
14 *access to the Internet website; and*

15       (4) *Notifying the Health Division of any change in the*  
16 *persons who are authorized to use the Internet website.*

17       3. *Authorized employees of the Health Division and of the*  
18 *Department of Public Safety may be designated to serve as*  
19 *administrators of the Internet website with access to all the data*  
20 *and information on the Internet website.*

21       4. *Except as otherwise provided in this section and NRS*  
22 *239.0115, information collected, maintained, stored, backed up or*  
23 *on file on the Internet website is confidential, not subject to*  
24 *subpoena or discovery and is not subject to inspection by the*  
25 *general public.*

26       5. *The Health Division shall ensure that any information*  
27 *collected, maintained and stored on the Internet website is*  
28 *protected adequately from fire, theft, loss, destruction, other*  
29 *hazards and unauthorized access, and is backed-up in a manner*  
30 *that ensures proper confidentiality and security.*

31       6. *The Internet website must be maintained in accordance*  
32 *with any requirements of the Division of Enterprise Information*  
33 *Technology Services of the Department of Administration*  
34 *established for use of the equipment or services of the Division*  
35 *pursuant to NRS 242.181.*

36       **Sec. 3.** 1. *A person authorized to use the Internet website*  
37 *established pursuant to section 2 of this act may access the website*  
38 *to search for information necessary to conduct an investigation of*  
39 *the background and personal history of a person when required.*  
40 *Such a search may include, without limitation, to the extent that*  
41 *the information is available:*

42       (a) *Determining whether the person being investigated has*  
43 *been convicted of a crime that disqualifies the person for*  
44 *employment, licensure or other privilege sought;*



1 (b) *Verifying the social security number, date of birth and*  
2 *driver's license or identification card number of the person being*  
3 *investigated;*

4 (c) *Determining whether any disciplinary action has been*  
5 *taken by a professional licensing board against the person being*  
6 *investigated; and*

7 (d) *Determining whether the person being investigated is*  
8 *included on the list of individuals who are excluded from*  
9 *participation in Medicare, Medicaid and other federal health care*  
10 *programs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §§ 1320a-7 et seq.*

11 2. *The Internet website established pursuant to section 2 of*  
12 *this act may include, without limitation, any relevant information*  
13 *that is available to the public, including, without limitation,*  
14 *hyperlinks to relevant publicly available Internet websites and*  
15 *registries, forms and educational materials.*

16 **Sec. 4.** *The Health Division may enter into cooperative*  
17 *agreements to obtain and accept information for inclusion on the*  
18 *Internet website established pursuant to section 2 of this act from:*

19 1. *The Statewide Central Registry for the Collection of*  
20 *Information Concerning the Abuse or Neglect of a Child*  
21 *established pursuant to NRS 432.100 and any similar registry*  
22 *maintained by a governmental entity of any state or territory*  
23 *within the United States;*

24 2. *The Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal*  
25 *History or any similar repository maintained by a government*  
26 *agency of any state or territory within the United States; and*

27 3. *Any other state or federal agency which maintains a*  
28 *database, repository or registry which contains information the*  
29 *Health Division determines is necessary or appropriate for*  
30 *inclusion on the Internet website.*

31 **Sec. 5.** 1. *In addition to any other information included on*  
32 *the Internet website established pursuant to section 2 of this act,*  
33 *the Health Division may collect, maintain and store on the*  
34 *Internet website the following information relating to the*  
35 *background and personal history of a person:*

36 (a) *The first, middle and last name of the person, any aliases*  
37 *used by the person and, if available, a photograph of the person;*

38 (b) *The social security number, date of birth and, if available,*  
39 *the driver's license or identification card number of the person;*

40 (c) *Information regarding the criminal convictions of the*  
41 *person, if any;*

42 (d) *Any other information submitted pursuant to section 4 of*  
43 *this act; and*

44 (e) *Any other information determined by the Health Division*  
45 *to be necessary or appropriate.*



1       2. *The information described in subsection 1 may be*  
2 *collected, stored and maintained electronically, in hard copy, in a*  
3 *database, through a secure interface from a state or federal*  
4 *governmental entity directly to the Internet website, or by any*  
5 *other means as the Health Division determines necessary or*  
6 *appropriate.*

7       **Sec. 6.** *1. When establishing permissions for a website*  
8 *client to access information on the Internet website established*  
9 *pursuant to section 2 of this act, the Health Division shall*  
10 *determine the information necessary for the website client to*  
11 *conduct an investigation into the background and personal history*  
12 *of a person and limit access to the website client to only the*  
13 *information necessary for that website client.*

14       2. *Information regarding a person whose background and*  
15 *personal history is investigated must not be shared with any other*  
16 *website client.*

17       3. *A person who is authorized to use the Internet website by*  
18 *the website client administrator pursuant to section 2 of this act*  
19 *may be given permission to access any information deemed*  
20 *necessary pursuant to subsection 1.*

21       **Sec. 7.** *The Health Division may adopt regulations to:*

22       1. *Prescribe a fee to be imposed on website clients for use of*  
23 *the Internet website established pursuant to section 2 of this act;*  
24 *and*

25       2. *Carry out the provisions of sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this*  
26 *act.*

27       **Sec. 8.** *Chapter 449 of NRS is hereby amended by adding*  
28 *thereto the provisions set forth as sections 9 and 10 of this act.*

29       **Sec. 9.** *As used in NRS 449.121 to 449.125, inclusive, and*  
30 *sections 9 and 10 of this act, "facility, hospital, agency, program*  
31 *or home" means a residential facility for groups, an agency to*  
32 *provide personal care services in the home, a hospital described in*  
33 *42 U.S.C. § 1395ww(d)(1)(b)(iv) which accepts payment through*  
34 *Medicare, a home for individual residential care, a program of*  
35 *hospice care or, if residential services are provided to children, a*  
36 *medical facility or facility for the treatment of abuse of alcohol or*  
37 *drugs.*

38       **Sec. 10.** *1. A temporary employment service shall not send*  
39 *an employee to provide services to a facility, hospital, agency,*  
40 *program or home if the temporary employment service has*  
41 *received notice from a facility, hospital, agency, program or home*  
42 *that the employee of the temporary employment service is*  
43 *ineligible to provide such services.*

44       2. *A facility, hospital, agency, program or home that enters*  
45 *into an agreement with a temporary employment service to provide*



1 *services for the facility, hospital, agency, program or home on a*  
2 *temporary basis must require the temporary employment service*  
3 *to:*

4 (a) *Provide proof that each employee of the temporary*  
5 *employment service whom it may send to provide services to the*  
6 *facility, hospital, agency, program or home has been continuously*  
7 *employed by the temporary employment service since the last*  
8 *investigation conducted of the employee pursuant to NRS 449.123;*  
9 *and*

10 (b) *Notify the facility, hospital, agency, program or home if the*  
11 *investigation conducted of an employee of the temporary*  
12 *employment service pursuant to NRS 449.123 has not been*  
13 *conducted within the immediately preceding 5 years.*

14 **Sec. 11.** NRS 449.089 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15 449.089 1. Each license issued pursuant to NRS 449.030 to  
16 449.240, inclusive, *and sections 9 and 10 of this act* expires on  
17 December 31 following its issuance and is renewable for 1 year  
18 upon reapplication and payment of all fees required pursuant to  
19 NRS 449.050 unless the Health Division finds, after an  
20 investigation, that the facility has not:

21 (a) Satisfactorily complied with the provisions of NRS 449.030  
22 to 449.240, inclusive, *and sections 9 and 10 of this act* or the  
23 standards and regulations adopted by the Board;

24 (b) Obtained the approval of the Director of the Department of  
25 Health and Human Services before undertaking a project, if such  
26 approval is required by NRS 439A.100; or

27 (c) Conformed to all applicable local zoning regulations.

28 2. Each reapplication for an agency to provide personal care  
29 services in the home, ~~an agency to provide nursing in the home, a~~  
30 ~~facility for intermediate care, a facility for skilled nursing,~~ *a*  
31 *hospital described in 42 U.S.C. § 1395ww(d)(1)(B)(iv) which*  
32 *accepts payment through Medicare, a residential facility for groups*  
33 *, a program of hospice care* or a home for individual residential  
34 care must include, without limitation, a statement that the facility,  
35 *hospital, agency, program* or home is in compliance with the  
36 provisions of NRS 449.121 to 449.125, inclusive, *and sections 9*  
37 *and 10 of this act*, and 449.174.

38 3. Each reapplication for an agency to provide personal care  
39 services in the home, a facility for intermediate care, a facility for  
40 skilled nursing, a facility for the care of adults during the day, a  
41 residential facility for groups or a home for individual residential  
42 care must include, without limitation, a statement that the holder of  
43 the license to operate, and the administrator or other person in  
44 charge and employees of, the facility, agency or home are in  
45 compliance with the provisions of NRS 449.093.



1       **Sec. 12.** NRS 449.121 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       449.121 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the  
3 provisions of NRS 449.122 to 449.125, inclusive, *and sections 9*  
4 *and 10 of this act* and 449.174 do not apply to any facility for the  
5 treatment of abuse of alcohol or drugs.

6       2. A facility for the treatment of abuse of alcohol or drugs must  
7 comply with the requirements of NRS 449.122 to 449.125,  
8 inclusive, *and sections 9 and 10 of this act* and 449.174 if the  
9 facility for the treatment of abuse of alcohol or drugs provides  
10 residential services to children.

11       **Sec. 13.** NRS 449.122 is hereby amended to read as follows:

12       449.122 1. Each applicant for a license to operate a facility  
13 ~~for intermediate care, facility for skilled nursing, residential facility~~  
14 ~~for groups, agency to provide personal care services in the home or~~  
15 ~~home for individual residential care or, if residential services are~~  
16 ~~provided to children, a medical facility or facility for the treatment~~  
17 ~~of abuse of alcohol or drugs}, *hospital, agency, program or home*~~  
18 shall submit to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of  
19 Criminal History two complete sets of fingerprints for submission to  
20 the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report.

21       2. The Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal  
22 History shall determine whether the applicant has been convicted of  
23 a crime listed in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of NRS 449.174 and  
24 immediately inform the administrator of the facility, agency or  
25 home, if any, and the Health Division of whether the applicant has  
26 been convicted of such a crime.

27       3. A person who holds a license to operate ~~an agency, a~~  
28 ~~facility or a~~ *a facility, hospital, agency, program or* home which  
29 provides residential services to children shall submit to the Central  
30 Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History two complete  
31 sets of fingerprints for a report required by this section at least once  
32 every 5 years after the initial investigation.

33       **Sec. 14.** NRS 449.123 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34       449.123 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection ~~2,~~ **3,**

36 *a temporary employment service* or entering into a contract with an  
37 independent contractor, the administrator of, or the person licensed

2 section, the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal  
3 History shall determine whether the employee , *employee of the*  
4 *temporary employment service* or independent contractor has been  
5 convicted of a crime listed in NRS 449.174 and immediately inform  
6 the Health Division and the administrator of, or the person licensed  
7 to operate, the ~~{agency,}~~ facility , *hospital, agency, program* or  
8 home at which the person works whether the employee , *employee*  
9 *of the temporary employment service* or independent contractor has  
10 been convicted of such a crime.

11 6. The Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal  
12 History may impose a fee upon ~~{an agency, a facility or a}~~ *a facility,*  
13 *hospital, agency, program or* home that submits fingerprints  
14 pursuant to this section for the reasonable cost of the investigation.  
15 The ~~{agency,}~~ facility , *hospital, agency, program* or home may  
16 recover from the employee or independent contractor *whose*  
17 *fingerprints are submitted* not more than one-half of the fee  
18 imposed by the Central Repository. If the ~~{agency,}~~ facility ,  
19 *hospital, agency, program* or home requires the employee or  
20 independent contractor to pay for any part of the fee imposed by the  
21 Central Repository, it shall allow the employee or independent  
22 contractor to pay the amount through periodic payments. *The*  
23 *facility, hospital, agency, program or home may require a*  
24 *temporary employment service which employs a temporary*  
25 *employee whose fingerprints are submitted to pay the fee imposed*  
26 *by the Central Repository. A facility, hospital, agency, program or*  
27 *home shall notify a temporary employment service if a person*  
28 *employed by the temporary employment service is determined to be*  
29 *ineligible to provide services at the facility, hospital, agency,*  
30 *program or home based upon the results of investigation*  
31 *conducted pursuant to this section.*

32 7. *Unless a greater penalty is provided by law, a person who*  
33 *willfully provides a false statement or information in connection*  
34 *with an investigation of the background and personal history of*  
35 *the person pursuant to this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.*
