ASSEMBLY BILL No. 383–ASSEMBLYMAN OHRENSCHALL

SUMMARY—Requires peace officers to be trained in the constitutional and lawful use of force. (BDR 23-1077)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

AN ACT relating to peace officers; requiring peace officers to be trained in the constitutional and lawful use of force; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to provide for and encourage the training and education of persons whose primary duty is law enforcement to ensure the safety of the residents of and visitors to this State. (NRS 289.510) This bill mandates the Commission to require, as a condition of the certification of each peace officer, that the peace officer be trained in the constitutional and lawful use of force. This bill also requires the Commission to make available legal and practical training and informational materials regarding the use of force and sets forth certain subjects which such training and materials must include. Finally, this bill requires the Commission to work with state and local agencies to ensure the most effective use of resources in providing the required training.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 289 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. As a condition of the certification of a peace officer, the Commission shall require the peace officer to be trained in the constitutional and lawful use of force, including, without limitation:

- (a) Technology which integrates legal training on the constitutional and lawful use of force by peace officers;
- (b) Best practices regarding responses by peace officers to threatening situations;
- (c) Tactical training of peace officers, including, without limitation, training conducted by means of a simulator;

(d) For the investigation of an incident involving the use of force by a peace officer; and

(e) Legal documentation of an incident involving the use of force by a peace officer.

- 3. The Commission shall make available legal and practical training for peace officers in this State and informational materials regarding the constitutional and lawful use of force by peace officers and related subjects. The training and materials must include, without limitation, programs and information which are specifically designed to address:
- (a) The recognition of potential resistance to law enforcement and options for responses by peace officers that do not involve the use of force;
 - (b) Decision-making skills regarding the use of force;
- 27 (c) The management of stress experienced by peace officers 28 during threatening situations; 29
 - (d) Tactical disengagement;
 - (e) The sanctity and preservation of life;
 - (f) The investigation and critique of an incident involving the use of force by a peace officer; and
- 33 (g) The legal foundations and limitations on the authority of a peace officer under the Constitution and laws of the United States 34 35 and the Constitution and laws of this State.
- 36 The Commission shall work with state and local agencies 37 to ensure the most effective use of resources in providing training 38 for peace officers throughout the State.
 - Sec. 2. NRS 289.450 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 289.450 As used in NRS 289.450 to 289.600, inclusive, and section 1 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 289.460 to 289.490, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.
 - **Sec. 3.** NRS 289.510 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 289 510 1 The Commission:





- (a) Shall meet at the call of the Chair, who must be elected by a majority vote of the members of the Commission.
- (b) Shall provide for and encourage the training and education of persons whose primary duty is law enforcement to ensure the safety of the residents of and visitors to this State.
- (c) Shall adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. The regulations must establish:
- (1) Requirements for basic training for category I, category II and category III peace officers and reserve peace officers;
- (2) Standards for programs for the continuing education of peace officers, including minimum courses of study and requirements concerning attendance;
 - (3) Qualifications for instructors of peace officers; and
 - (4) Requirements for the certification of a course of training.
- (d) Shall, when necessary, present courses of training and continuing education courses for category I, category II and category III peace officers and reserve peace officers.
- (e) May make necessary inquiries to determine whether the agencies of this State and of the local governments are complying with standards set forth in its regulations.
- (f) Shall carry out the duties required of the Commission pursuant to NRS 432B.610 and 432B.620.
- (g) May perform any other acts that may be necessary and appropriate to the functions of the Commission as set forth in NRS 289.450 to 289.600, inclusive [...], and section 1 of this act.
- (h) May enter into an interlocal agreement with an Indian tribe to provide training to and certification of persons employed as police officers by that Indian tribe.
 - 2. Regulations adopted by the Commission:
- (a) Apply to all agencies of this State and of local governments in this State that employ persons as peace officers;
- (b) Must require that all peace officers receive training in the handling of cases involving abuse or neglect of children or missing children:
- (c) Must require that all peace officers receive training in the handling of cases involving abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation and abandonment of older persons; and
- (d) May require that training be carried on at institutions which it approves in those regulations.
