AN ACT relating to the Public Employees' Retirement Board; revising provisions governing the size and composition of the Board; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Public Employees' Retirement System to be governed 1 by the Public Employees' Retirement Board, consisting of seven persons appointed by the Governor. (NRS 286.120) Section 1 of this bill increases the size of the Board to nine persons.

23456789 Existing law requires one member of the Board to be a person who: (1) is an employee of the State of Nevada or its political subdivisions with at least 10 years of service; (2) is serving in a position at least equivalent to the manager of a department or division; (3) is not an elected officer of the State of Nevada or its political subdivisions; and (4) is an active member of the System. (NRS 286.130) 10 Section 2 of this bill removes this requirement and instead requires three members of the Board to be persons who: (1) have specified experiences relating to the design or management of retirement plans; (2) are not employees of the State or its 11 12 13 political subdivisions; (3) are not elected officers of the State or its political 14 subdivisions; and (4) have never been active members of the System. Section 3 of 15 this bill ends the present term of the member of the Board who was appointed pursuant to the existing provisions of the statute and establishes staggered terms for 16 17 the three newly-appointed members.
