SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing college savings plans. (BDR 31-360)

AN ACT relating to college savings plans; authorizing the Board of Trustees of the College Savings Plans of Nevada to delegate certain powers and duties relating to the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Program to the State Treasurer; authorizing certain qualified beneficiaries to apply unused prepaid tuition benefits toward graduatelevel studies; transferring the duty to adopt regulations governing the Nevada College Savings Program from the State Treasurer to the Board; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

The Board of Trustees of the College Savings Plans of Nevada was created 1 23456789 under existing law to oversee the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Program and the Nevada College Savings Program. (NRS 353B.001-353B.370) Under existing law, the Board is required to develop and maintain the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Program for the prepayment of the tuition of the beneficiary of a prepaid tuition contract at an eligible in-state or out-of-state public or private university, college or community college. The tuition paid under the contract is at a guaranteed rate based on an annual actuarial study for undergraduate studies at a university, state college or community college that is a member of the Nevada System of Higher Education. (NRS 353B.090) Existing law also: (1) creates the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund for deposit of 10 11 12 payments under prepaid tuition contracts and other sources of money for the 13 Program and requires the State Treasurer to administer the Trust Fund; and 14 (2) sets forth certain powers and duties of the Board relating to promotion, 15 investment and contracting services for the Program and the Trust Fund. (NRS 16 353B.010-353B.190)

17 Section 1 of this bill authorizes the Board to delegate to the State Treasurer 18 those powers and duties necessary for the efficient and effective administration of





19 the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Program and the Trust Fund. Under 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 existing law, the Board is authorized to make such a delegation to the State Treasurer with respect to the Nevada College Savings Program and the Nevada College Savings Program Trust Fund. (NRS 353B.320) Sections 3 and 4 of this bill expand the authorized use of benefits under a prepaid tuition contract to allow a qualified beneficiary to apply any unused prepaid tuition benefits after his or her graduation with an undergraduate degree toward his or her graduate-level studies. Section 3 also specifically requires the Board to adopt requirements for a master agreement for the Program by regulation. Section 7 of this bill requires the Board to amend the master agreement for the Program to make the expanded authorization for graduate-level studies applicable to existing prepaid tuition contracts. (NAC 353B.140)

Existing law requires the State Treasurer to adopt regulations to establish and carry out the Nevada College Savings Program, which offers tax-free investment plans for saving money for the costs of higher education. (NRS 353B.310) Section 6 of this bill transfers the duty to adopt regulations for the Nevada College Savings Program from the State Treasurer to the Board. The Board has the authority under existing law to adopt regulations to implement the Nevada Higher Education 37 Prepaid Tuition Program. (NRS 353B.090)

> THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 353B of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 The Board may delegate to the State Treasurer any of its administrative powers and duties specified in NRS 353B.010 to 4 353B.190, inclusive, if the Board determines that such delegation 5 is necessary for the efficient and effective administration of the 6 Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Program and the Trust 7 Fund.

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Sec. 2. NRS 353B.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

353B.010 As used in NRS 353B.010 to 353B.190, and section 10 1 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and 11 terms defined in NRS 353B.030 to 353B.070, inclusive, have the 12 13 meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

Sec. 3. NRS 353B.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:

353B.090 1. The Board shall develop the Nevada Higher 15 Education Prepaid Tuition Program for the prepayment of tuition for 16 17 a qualified beneficiary for:

(a) Undergraduate studies at:

(1) A university, state college or community college that is a 19 20 *member of the System;*

(2) An accredited college or university in this State that is 21 22 not a member of the System; or

23 (3) An accredited community college, college or university 24 in another state.





(b) If any money paid into the Trust Fund under a prepaid 1 2 tuition contract is remaining after a qualified beneficiary has graduated with an undergraduate degree, for graduate-level 3 4 studies at: 5 (1) A university, state college or community college that is a 6 *member of the System;* 7 (2) An accredited college or university in this State that is 8 not a member of the System; or (3) An accredited community college, college or university 9 10 in another state. 2. The amount of the tuition under a prepaid tuition contract 11 *must be* at a guaranteed rate which is established based on the 12 13 annual actuarial study required pursuant to NRS 353B.190 for 14 undergraduate studies at a university, state college or community 15 college that is a member of the System. 16 [2.] 3. The Board shall adopt regulations for the implementation of the Program, including, without limitation, 17 18 regulations setting forth requirements for: 19 (a) Residency: 20 (b) A limit on the number of qualified beneficiaries; 21 (c) The termination, withdrawal and transfer of money paid into 22 the Trust Fund; (d) A payment received by the Trust Fund as a matching 23 contribution made as described in NRS 363A.137 or 363B.117 to be 24 25 credited to the qualified beneficiary on whose behalf the matching 26 contribution was made: 27 (e) The time within which the money paid into the Trust Fund 28 must be used; [and] 29 (f) Payment schedules **[]**; and (g) A master agreement for the Program. 30 31 Sec. 4. NRS 353B.100 is hereby amended to read as follows: 32 353B.100 1. The Board may enter into a prepaid tuition 33 contract with a purchaser. 2. The Board shall create a prepaid tuition contract in 34 accordance with the provisions of this section. 35 36 The prepaid tuition contract must include, without 3. 37 limitation: (a) The terms and conditions under which the purchaser shall 38 39 remit payment, including, without limitation: (1) The amount and number of payments that are required 40 41 from the purchaser on behalf of the qualified beneficiary; (2) The date upon which each payment is due; and 42 43 (3) A provision for a reasonable penalty for a delinquent 44 payment or default.

1 (b) The name and date of birth of the qualified beneficiary on 2 whose behalf the prepaid tuition contract is drawn.

3 (c) The terms and conditions under which another person may 4 be substituted as the qualified beneficiary.

5 (d) The terms and conditions under which the purchaser, or 6 another person designated by the purchaser, may terminate the 7 prepaid tuition contract, receive a refund of money that he or she has 8 paid into the Trust Fund or withdraw money that he or she has paid 9 into the Trust Fund, including, without limitation, a provision 10 allowing the Board to impose a fee that amounts to more than a de 11 minimis penalty.

12 (e) A provision that the Board shall, after making a reasonable 13 effort to contact the purchaser, report any money that has been 14 deposited under a prepaid tuition contract that has not been 15 terminated and has not been used within a specified period to the 16 State Treasurer for proper disposition.

17 (f) The number of semesters for which the purchaser is 18 contracting.

19 (g) A provision that money paid into the Trust Fund under a 20 prepaid tuition contract may be applied toward tuition *for an* 21 *undergraduate degree* at:

(1) A university, state college or community college that is a
member of the System;

(2) An accredited college or university in this State that is nota member of the System; or

26 (3) An accredited community college, college or university27 in another state.

Payments authorized pursuant to subparagraph (2) or (3) must not
exceed the projected highest payment for tuition for the current
academic year at a university that is a member of the System.

31 (h) A provision that any money under a prepaid tuition 32 contract that is remaining after a qualified beneficiary has 33 graduated with an undergraduate degree may be applied toward 34 tuition for graduate-level studies at:

(1) A university, state college or community college that is a
member of the System;

37 (2) An accredited college or university in this State that is
38 not a member of the System; or

39 (3) An accredited community college, college or university 40 in another state.

41 Payments authorized pursuant to this paragraph may not
42 exceed the total amount payable under the prepaid tuition contract
43 of the qualified beneficiary.

44 (i) Any other term or condition that the Board considers 45 necessary or proper.





Sec. 5. NRS 353B.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

353B.110 The Board:

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3 May modify the regulations for the implementation of the 1. Program adopted pursuant to subsection [2] 3 of NRS 353B.090. 4

2. May establish agreements to fulfill its obligations under the 5 6 prepaid tuition contracts.

May contract for any necessary good or service, including, 7 3. without limitation, the power to engage financial consultants, 8 9 actuaries or legal counsel.

May procure insurance against any loss in connection with 10 4. the property, assets or activities of the Trust Fund, the State 11 12 Treasurer or the Board.

May solicit and accept a gift, including, without limitation, a 13 5. 14 bequeathment or other testamentary gift, grant, loan or aid from any 15 source.

16 6. Shall solicit answers to requests for rulings from the Internal 17 Revenue Service regarding the tax status of fees paid to or on behalf 18 of a purchaser or a qualified beneficiary pursuant to a prepaid tuition 19 contract. 20

Sec. 6. NRS 353B.310 is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. The [State Treasurer] Board shall adopt 21 353B.310 regulations to establish and carry out the Nevada College Savings 22 Program, which must comply with the requirements of a qualified 23 state tuition program pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 529. 24

25 The regulations must be consistent with the provisions of the 2. Internal Revenue Code set forth in Title 26 of the United States 26 27 Code, and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto, to ensure that the Nevada College Savings Program meets all criteria for federal 28 29 tax-deferred or tax-exempt benefits, or both.

30 The regulations must provide for the use of savings trust 3. 31 agreements and savings trust accounts to apply distributions toward qualified higher education expenses at eligible educational 32 institutions in accordance with 26 U.S.C. § 529. 33

The regulations must set forth requirements for a payment 34 4. received by the Trust Fund as a matching contribution made as 35 described in NRS 363A.137 or 363B.117 to be credited to the 36 37 savings trust account to which the contribution was made.

The regulations may include any other provisions not 38 5. inconsistent with federal law that the [State Treasurer] Board 39 necessary for the efficient and effective 40 determines are 41 administration of the Nevada College Savings Program and the 42 Trust Fund.

43 Sec. 7. 1. On or before October 1, 2017, the Board of 44 Trustees of the College Savings Plans of Nevada created by NRS 45 353B.005 shall amend the master agreement for the Nevada Higher





Education Prepaid Tuition Program created in accordance with 1 regulations adopted pursuant to NRS 353B.090, as amended by 2 3 section 3 of this act, to authorize, pursuant to NRS 353B.090, as amended by section 3 of this act, the application of any money paid 4 into the Nevada Higher Education Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund 5 6 created pursuant to NRS 353B.140 under a prepaid tuition contract that is remaining after a qualified beneficiary has graduated with an 7 undergraduate degree toward tuition for graduate-level studies by 8 9 the qualified beneficiary at:

10 (a) A university, state college or community college that is a 11 member of the System;

12 (b) An accredited college or university in this State that is not a 13 member of the System; or

14 (c) An accredited community college, college or university in 15 another state.

16 2. As used in this section:

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(a) "Prepaid tuition contract" has the meaning ascribed to it inNRS 353B.030.

19 (b) "Qualified beneficiary" has the meaning ascribed to it in 20 NRS 353B.050.

(c) "System" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 353B.004.

Sec. 8. Notwithstanding the amendatory provisions of this act transferring authority to adopt regulations from the State Treasurer to the Board of Trustees of the College Savings Plans of Nevada, any regulations adopted by the State Treasurer pursuant to NRS 353B.310 before July 1, 2017, remain in effect and may be enforced by the Board or the State Treasurer, as applicable, until the Board adopts regulations to repeal or replace those regulations.

29 Sec. 9. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
