SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 10–COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE OPERATIONS AND ELECTIONS

JUNE 1, 2017

Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections

SUMMARY—Directs the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study concerning transportation and transportation infrastructure in this State. (BDR R-1239)

EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study concerning matters relating to transportation and transportation infrastructure in this State.

WHEREAS, The Nevada Department of Transportation, created in 1917, celebrates its 100th Anniversary this year; and

WHEREAS, The Department maintains and operates more than 13,000 lane miles of state roads and over 1,100 bridges as part of the state highway system; and

WHEREAS, The Department supports not only roads but also train, aviation and bus transportation and pedestrian travel throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, The overall costs of the Capital Program of the Department for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 exceed a total of \$1.1 billion; and

WHEREAS, The Legislature hereby recognizes the need for increased understanding and participation in transportation-related decisions, policy development and oversight of transportation issues in this State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to appoint as soon as practicable after July 1, 2017, a committee to conduct an interim study as described herein, which is composed of:

- 1. One member of the Senate who was the chair of the standing committee with primary jurisdiction over transportation issues during the preceding regular session of the Legislature, and who shall serve as Chair of the committee;
- 2. Two other members of the Senate, one appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate and one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate:
- 3. One member of the Assembly who was the chair of the standing committee with primary jurisdiction over transportation issues during the preceding regular session of the Legislature, and who shall serve as Vice Chair of the committee; and
- 4. Two other members of the Assembly, one appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly and one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee shall conduct an interim study of matters relating to transportation and transportation infrastructure in this State and may:

- 1. Evaluate, review and comment upon issues related to transportation and transportation infrastructure within this State, including, without limitation:
- (a) Mechanisms to defray the costs of transportation projects and transportation infrastructure;
- (b) The condition of the transportation infrastructure in this State and the need for money to maintain and improve that infrastructure:
- (c) The impact of emerging technologies on the roadways and transit systems in this State:
- (d) Options for funding the development of high-capacity transit systems within urban areas of this State; and
- (e) Any other matters that, as determined by the committee, concern transportation or transportation infrastructure in this State;
- 2. Review the methods by which and the manner in which transportation or transportation infrastructure in this State may be improved;
- 3. Consult with the members of the Nevada Congressional Delegation regarding the ability to defray the costs of transportation projects and transportation infrastructure on a long-term basis;
- 4. Consult with and solicit comments and information from persons and organizations with expertise in best practices regarding defraying the costs of transportation projects and transportation infrastructure; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Legislative Counsel Bureau shall provide administrative support to the committee; and be it further





RESOLVED, That the committee may accept gifts, grants and donations to pay for the expenses of the work of the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of the results of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the 80th Session of the Nevada Legislature.
