Notice of Hearing of The Amendment of Regulations of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. on September 11, 1999, at the Humboldt County Convention Center, 50 West Winnemucca, Winnemucca, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 275 pertaining to Chapter 488 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 275

EXPLANATION: Amends NAC 488.455, by establishing a flat-wake zone outside of the

designated mooring area of Glenbrook Bay.

Section 1. NAC 488.455 is hereby amended to read as follows:

488.455 1. On the following waters, a vessel must be operated at a speed that leaves a flat wake, but in no case may a vessel be operated at a speed in excess of 5 nautical miles per hour:
