**Section 1.** NAC 501.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:

501.200 1. A person who is convicted of a wildlife violation will be assessed demerit points pursuant to the following schedule:

- 2. A person who is convicted of committing a wildlife violation that does not appear in the schedule set forth in subsection 1 will be assessed 3 demerit points.
- 3. A person who is convicted of committing a wildlife violation within 60 months after a conviction for the same violation will be assessed double the amount of demerit points listed in the schedule set forth in subsection 1.
- 4. A person who is convicted of committing any four wildlife violations within a 60-month period will be assessed an extra 12 demerit points.
- **Sec. 2.** Chapter 503 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections **3** and 4 of this regulation.
- Sec. 3. As used in NAC 503.142 to 503.195, inclusive, and sections 3 and 4 of this regulation, "longbow" means any recurved bow or compound bow.
- Sec. 4. The Board of Wildlife Commissioners hereby establishes the following exception to paragraph (f) of subsection 1 of NRS 503.150. A sight attached to a firearm or longbow that is used to hunt a game mammal or game bird may be illuminated or powered by:
  - 1. A battery contained within the sight;

- 2. Light gathering fiber optics;
- 3. A radioactive isotopes such as tritium; or
- 4. Iridescent or fluorescent paint.

→ It is unlawful for a person to hunt a game mammal or a game bird with a weapon that is equipped with a sight that is capable of casting or projecting a beam of light from the sight to the animal.

**Section 5.** NAC 503.142 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 503.142 The Board of Wildlife Commissioners hereby establishes the following exceptions to paragraph (b) of subsection 1 of NRS 503.150:
- 1. During a type of hunt that is restricted to muzzle-loading firearms, a person may hunt a big game mammal only with a muzzle-loading rifle or muzzle-loading musket, and may use only a lead ball, a lead bullet, a semijacketed bullet or a metal alloy bullet that expands. *The use of smokeless powder is prohibited. Only black powder or a black powder substitute such as Pyrodex or Triple 7 may be used as a propellant.* A sabot round may be used. The muzzle-loading rifle or muzzle-loading musket must have the following characteristics:
- (a) A wheel lock, matchlock or flintlock ignition system, or a percussion ignition system [if the percussion system] that uses a primer or percussion cap; [that fits on the nipple;]
  - (b) A single barrel of caliber .45 or larger; and
- (c) Open sights, [or] peep sights [.] or rifle scopes with a fixed magnification of one power.

  The use of a sight that is operated or powered by a battery, electronics or a radioactive isotope such as tritium is prohibited.

- → The muzzle-loading rifle or the muzzle-loading musket is deemed to be not loaded if the priming compound or element, such as the priming powder or the unfired primer or percussion cap, is removed.
- 2. During a type of hunt that is restricted to muzzle-loading firearms, it is unlawful for a person hunting under the authority of a tag for such a hunt to carry in the field a firearm or longbow and arrow except for:
- (a) A muzzle-loading rifle or a muzzle-loading musket with the characteristics set forth in subsection 1; or
- (b) A flintlock or percussion handgun. However, it is unlawful to use such a handgun to hunt a big game mammal.
- 3. During a type of hunt in which the use of any legal weapon is authorized by a regulation of the Commission, a person may hunt a big game mammal with a muzzle-loading rifle or muzzle-loading musket only if:
  - (a) The muzzle-loading rifle or muzzle-loading musket has:
    - (1) A single barrel of caliber .45 or larger; and
    - (2) Open sights, peep sights or a rifle scope.
- (b) The person uses a lead ball, a lead bullet, a semijacketed bullet or a metal alloy bullet that expands. A sabot round may be used.
- → The muzzle-loading rifle or muzzle-loading musket is deemed to be not loaded if the priming compound or element, such as the priming powder or the unfired primer or percussion cap, is removed.
- 4. A person may hunt big game mammals with a rifle if the rifle uses a centerfire cartridge of caliber .22 or larger.

- 5. A person may hunt big game mammals with a handgun if the handgun uses a centerfire cartridge, has a barrel length of 4 inches or more and:
- (a) Uses a cartridge of caliber .22 or larger with an overall loaded length of 2 inches or more; or
- (b) Uses a cartridge of caliber .24 or larger with a case of length no less than the length of the case of a cartridge for a Remington magnum of caliber .44.
- 6. A person may hunt deer and mountain lion with a shotgun no larger than 10 gauge and no smaller than 20 gauge. Rifled slugs must be used when hunting deer.
  - **Sec. 6.** NAC 503.144 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 503.144 1. [A] The bowstring of a longbow used in hunting must be moved or held entirely by the muscle power of the shooter through all points of the draw cycle until release and may only be released by direct and conscious action of the shooter, either by relaxing the tension of the fingers or by triggering the release action of a handheld release aid.
- 2. A longbow used in hunting a big game mammal must, in the hands of the user, be capable of throwing a 400 grain arrow 150 yards over level terrain. Arrows used in hunting big game mammals must [have hunting tips at least 3/4-inch wide.
- 2.1 be at least 24 inches long and have:
  - (a) Fixed broadheads that are at least 7/8-inch wide at the widest point; or
- (b) Expandable, mechanical broadheads that are at least 7/8-inch wide at the widest point when the broadhead is in the open position.
  - 3. It is unlawful for any person to [carry]:
  - (a) Carry any firearm in the field while hunting under archery regulations.
  - [3. As used in this section, "longbow" includes any recurved bow or compound bow.]

- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, carry a longbow with an arrow nocked on the bowstring while in or on any motorized vehicle while such vehicle is on a public highway or other public right-of-way. The provisions of this paragraph do not apply to a person that cannot walk because of a severe physical handicap, such as full or partial paralysis or amputation of one or both legs, if the motorized vehicle is not in motion.
- (c) Hunt any game mammal or game bird with a longbow that uses any mechanical device that can anchor a nocked arrow at full draw or partial draw.
- (d) Hunt any wildlife with an arrow that has any chemical, explosive or electronic device attached.
  - **Sec. 7.** NAC 503.173 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 503.173 1. Except as otherwise provided in NAC 502.403, any person who kills a deer, elk, mountain goat, antelope or bighorn sheep shall [, until the carcass is frozen, smoked, dried, consumed or accepted by a commercial processing plant for processing, maintain possession of both the cape extending above the eyes and the ears and any antlers or horns. The cape and any antlers or horns from the animal must be possessed in such a manner that they remain or are kept together with the carcass] maintain evidence of the sex of the animal. The evidence of the sex of the animal must be kept with the meat of the animal while in the field, in transit from the field and until the meat is delivered to:
  - (a) The residence of the holder of the tag;
- (b) The final place of storage, as indicated on a transportation permit issued by the Department or an agent of the Department pursuant to NRS 503.040; or
  - (c) A commercial facility for the processing of meat.

- 2. If the transportation of the animal from the place where the animal was killed to the camp of the holder of the tag or to the means of transportation of the holder of the tag will require multiple trips, evidence of the sex of the animal must accompany the first load of meat transported.
  - 3. As used in this section, "evidence of the sex of the animal" means:
  - (a) For a male animal:
- (1) The head of the animal remains naturally attached to the carcass or to a front quarter with any antlers or horns still intact; or
- (2) Any antlers or horns of the animal remain naturally attached to the skull plate, and the testicles, scrotum or penis of the animal remain naturally attached to a hindquarter or to a piece of the meat of the thigh that has been cut from a hindquarter; or
  - (b) For a female animal:
- (1) The head of the animal remains naturally attached to the carcass or to a front quarter; or
- (2) The vulva or the udders of the animal remain naturally attached to a hindquarter or to a piece of the meat of the thigh that has been cut from a hindquarter.
