A REGULATION relating to educational personnel; revising the provisions governing the qualifications for teaching pupils who have autism; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. Section 6 of LCB File No. R103-03, which was adopted by the Commission on Professional Standards in Education and was filed with the Secretary of State on September 24, 2003, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 6. 1. This section and sections 1 [, 2 and 3] to 4, inclusive, of this regulation become effective on September 24, 2003.
 - 2. [Section 4 of this regulation becomes effective on September 24, 2003.
- 3.] Section 5 of this regulation becomes effective on July 1, [2005.] 2008.

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations was sent to approximately 100 individuals and educational organizations. One workshop was held on September 22, 2005. There was one public comment.

The Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation for public hearing and adoption of the proposed revisions to NAC 391.350, 391.356, 391.360 and 391.378 were sent to approximately 100 individuals and educational organizations. The public hearing was conducted on September 22, 2005, to provide the opportunity for comments by affected parties and the public. There were comments from the public. The Commission adopted the proposed regulation.

Comments were solicited through the workshop notice of August 13, 2005, and the public hearing notice of August 13, 2005. At the September 22, 2005 Workshop to Solicit Comments, there were public comments to the proposed language. At the

September 22, 2005 Public Hearing there were no public comments to the proposed language.

Summary of Comments: Workshop/Public Hearing Comments:

Mary Ann Gibbs, Clark County School District, indicated that there is a shortage of autism teachers and the Autism Option Program will sunset on June 30, 2005 and encouraged the Commission to extend the date for the Autism Option Program to 2008. Ms. Gibbs stated that there is high need for the Autism Option Program.

The Commission on Professional Standards in Public Education adopted the proposed regulation language at the public hearing held September 22, 2005. The reason for adopting the amendment to the regulation was to extend the sunset date to June 30, 2008 to continue the Option Program for Autism.

The beneficial economic effect allows school districts to continue to hire teachers and place them in a Option Program for Autism and this allows licensed teachers to remain in those classrooms. There is <u>no</u> estimated economic effect on the public, either adversely or beneficially, nor immediate or long term.

There is no additional cost to the agency for enforcement of this regulation.
