► Overview

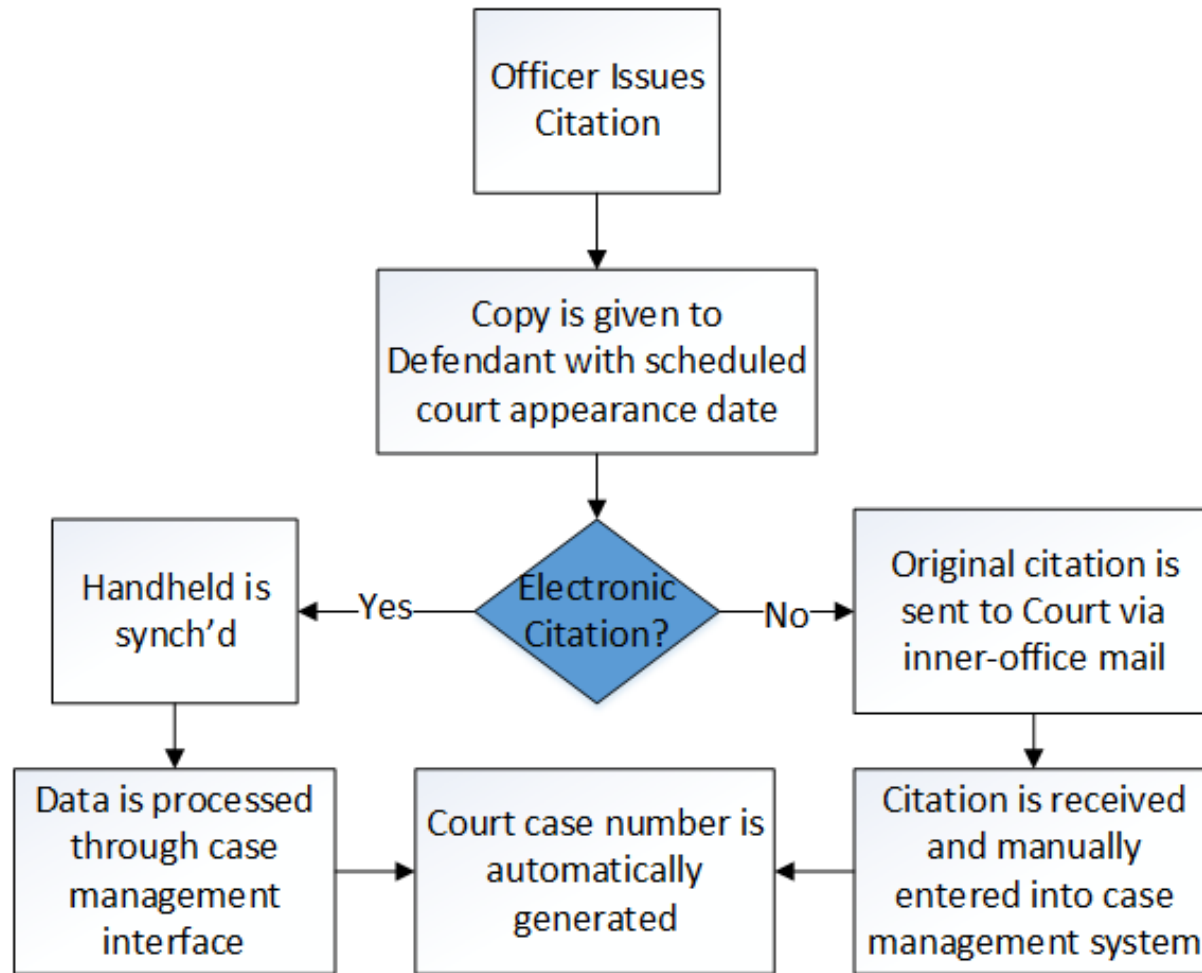
Henderson Municipal Court received over 18,600 traffic/parking citations in FY17

Approximately 70% of citations are received electronically and 30% are manually entered by court staff

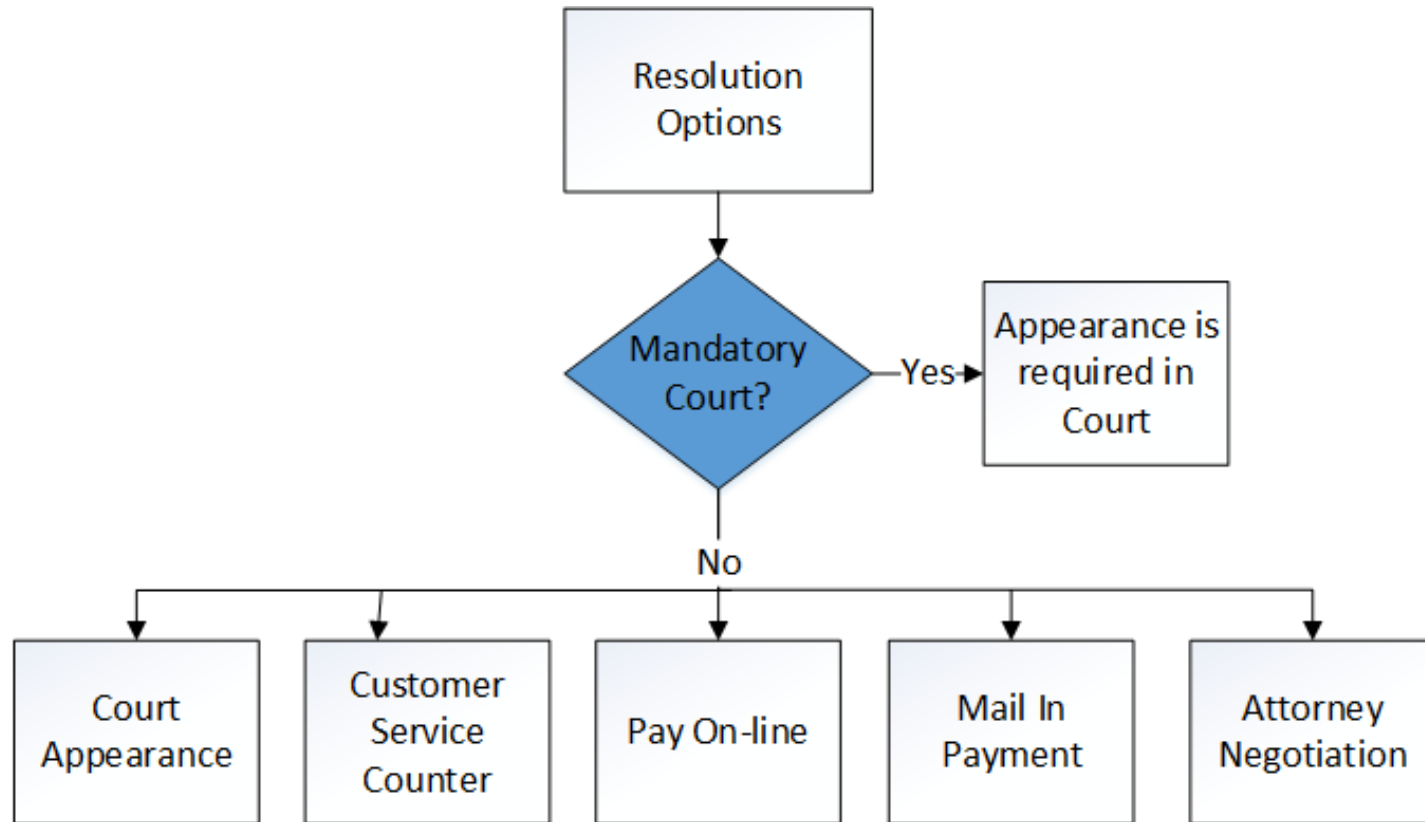
Henderson Police Department files over 95% of the citations received by the Court

- Fail to Obey Police Officer Re: Traffic Laws

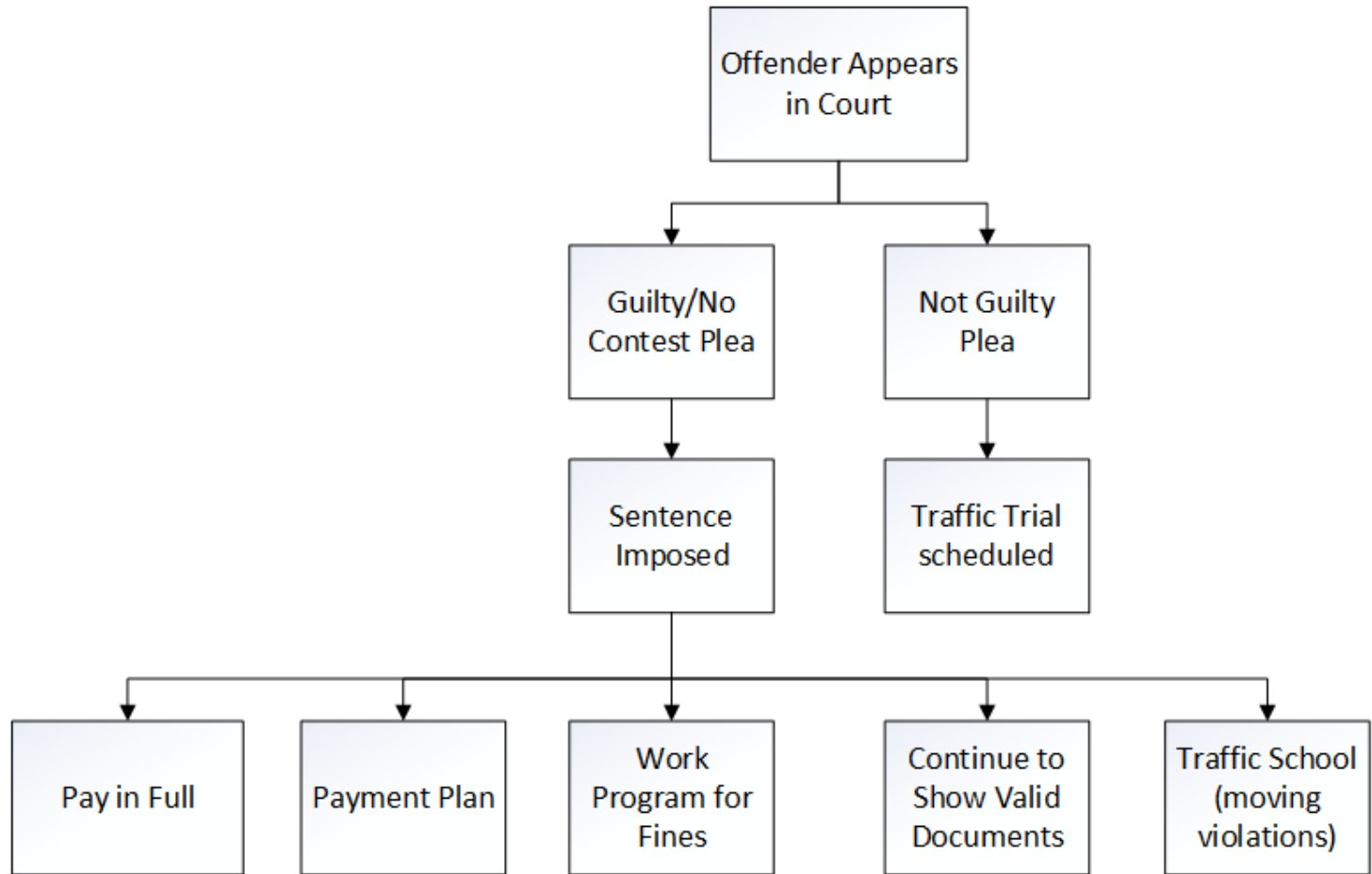


▶ Appearance in Court

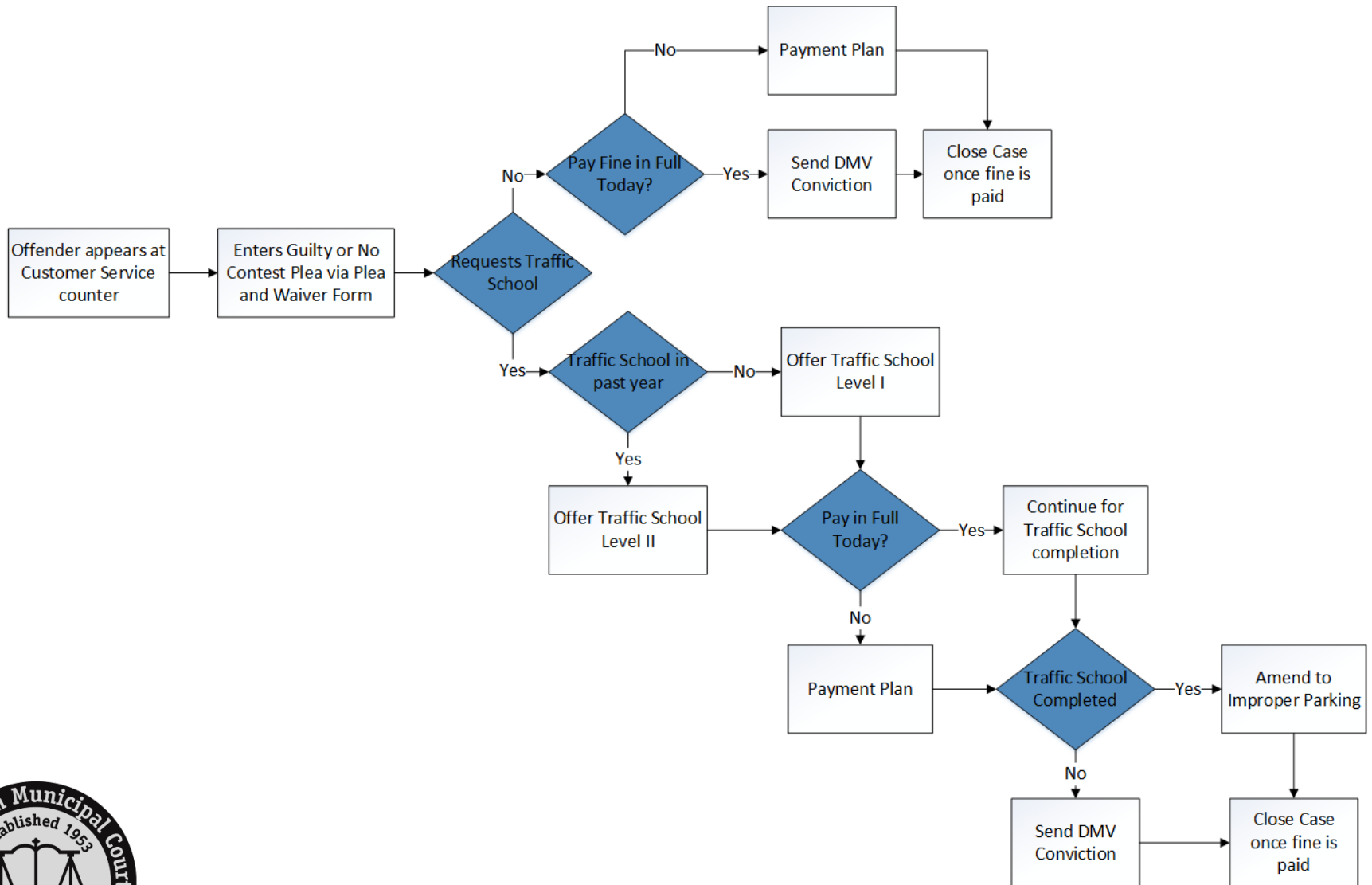
- Offender may request a one-time court hearing continuance via the Customer Service counter or telephone
- Payment options: pay in full, request time payments or work program (requires Judge's approval)
- Fines may be reduced for insurance, registration or driver's license violations if the offender provides proof of compliance to the Court



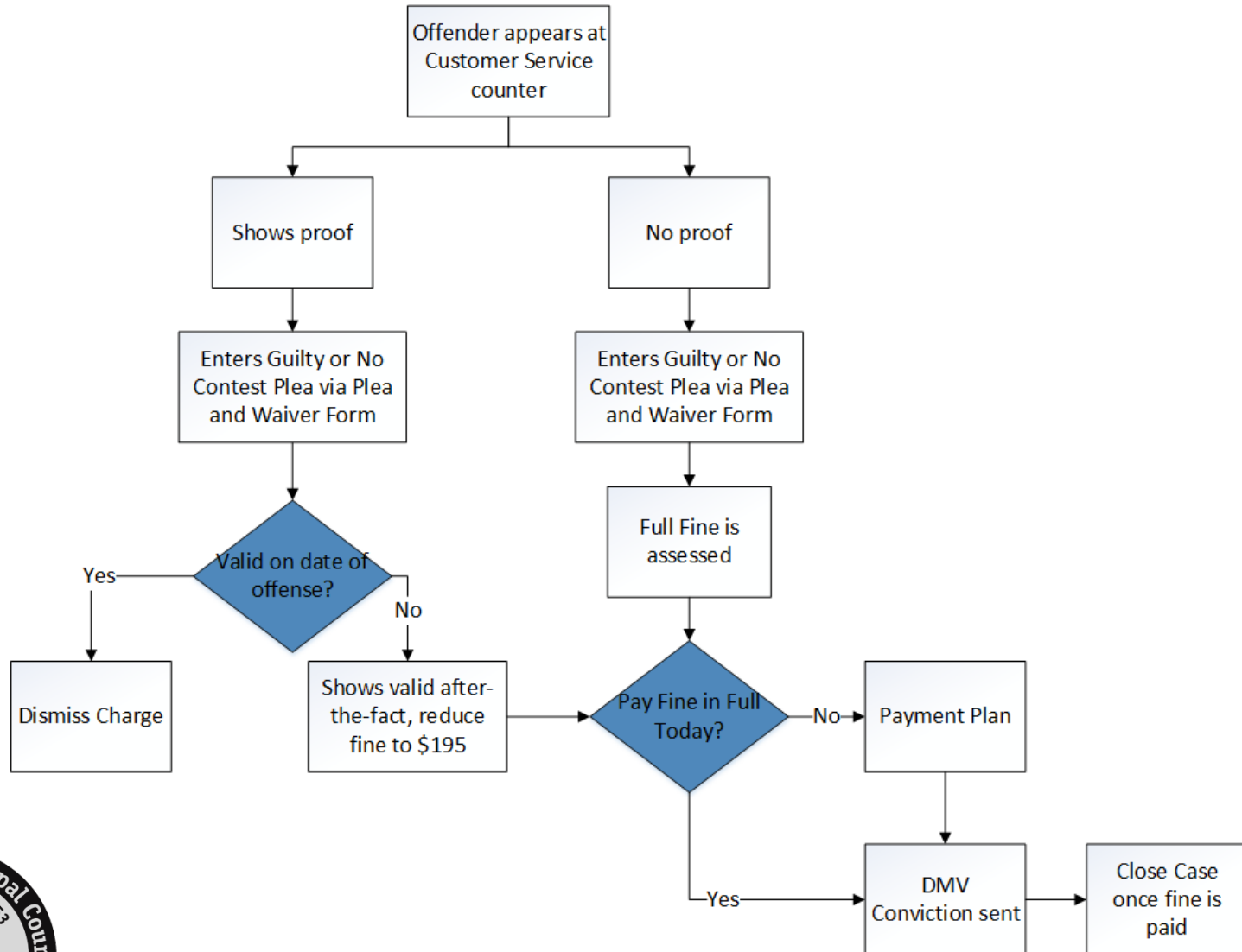

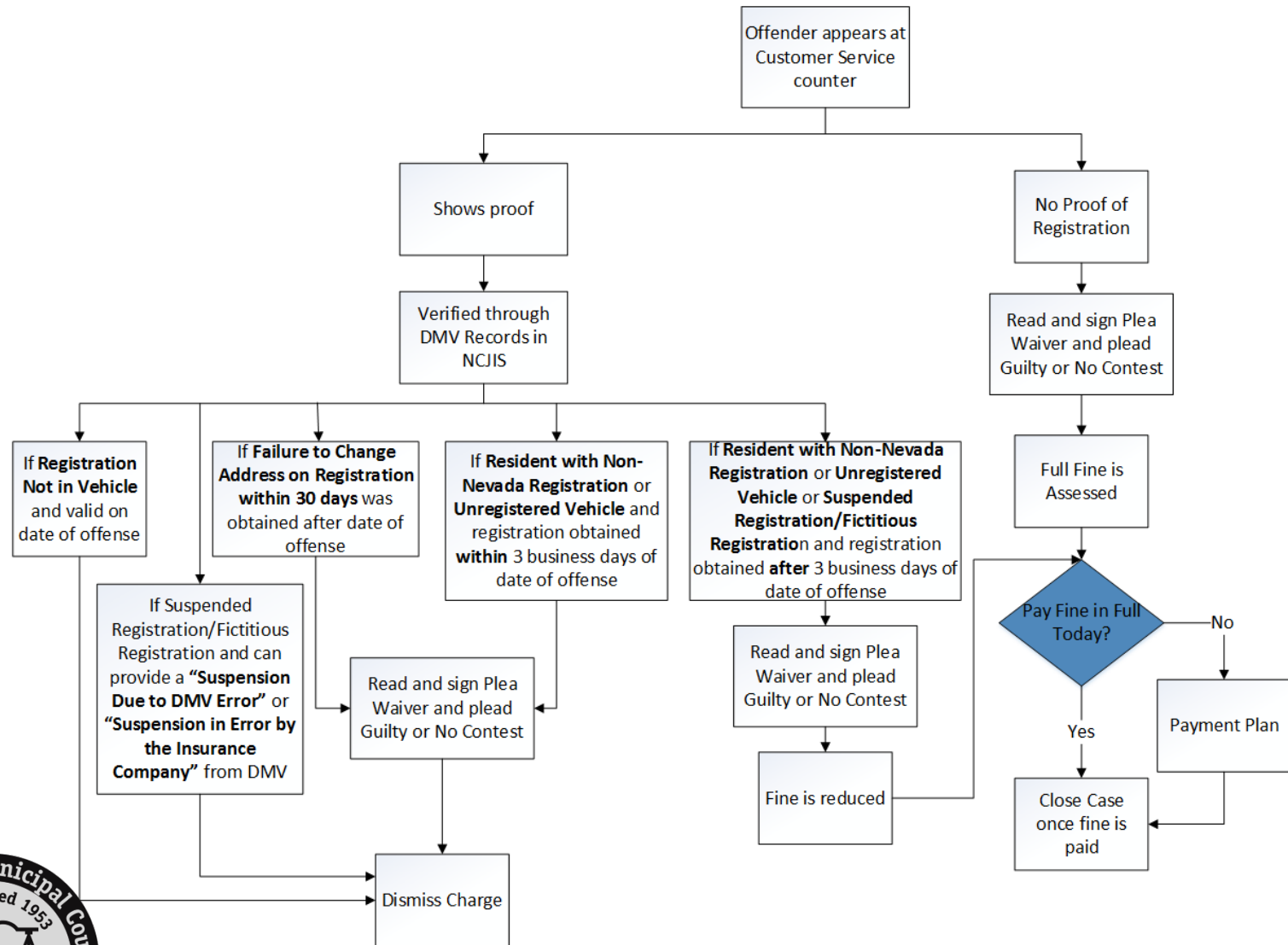
► Resolution: Customer Service Counter (Moving Violations)



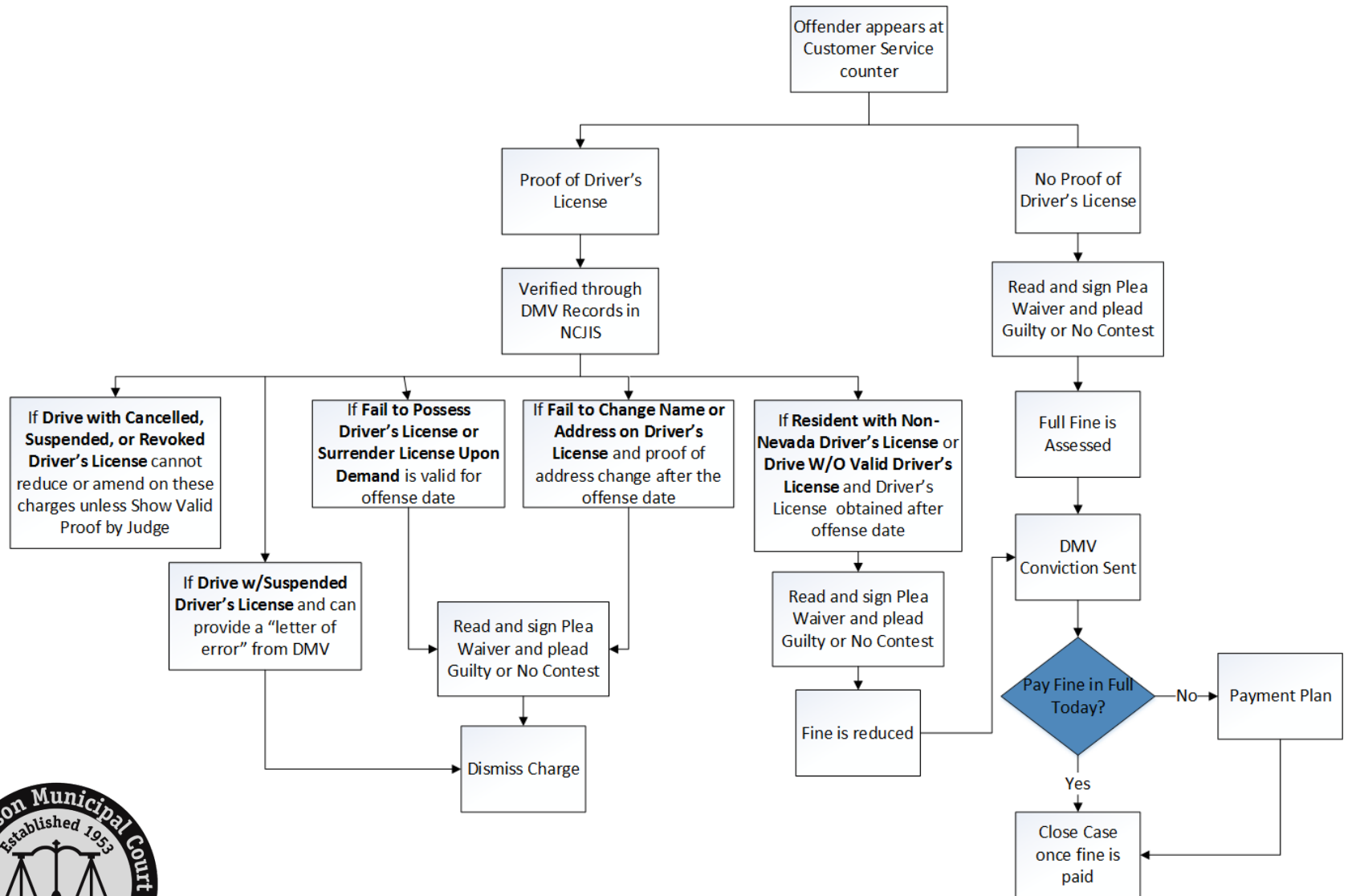
▶ Resolution: Customer Service Counter (Insurance)

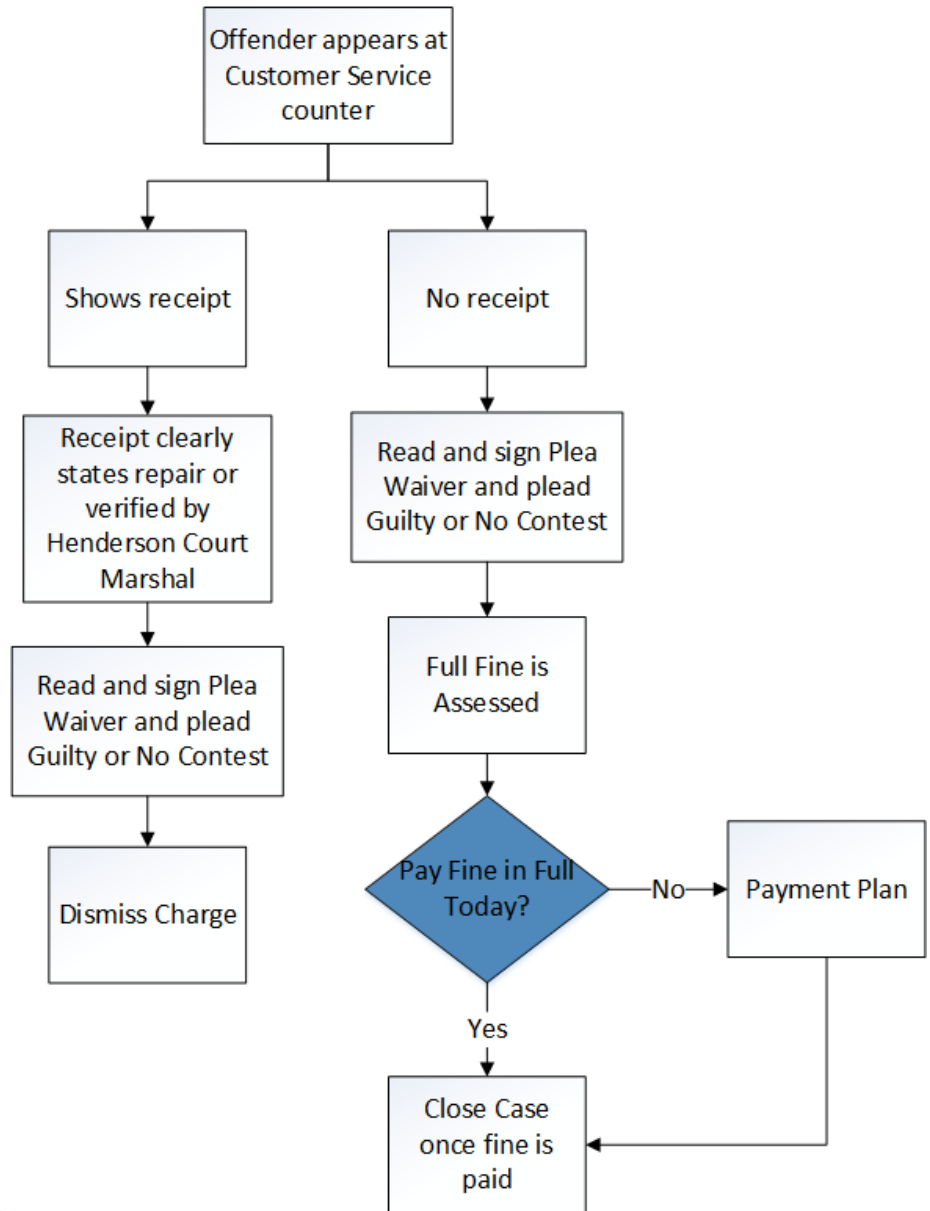

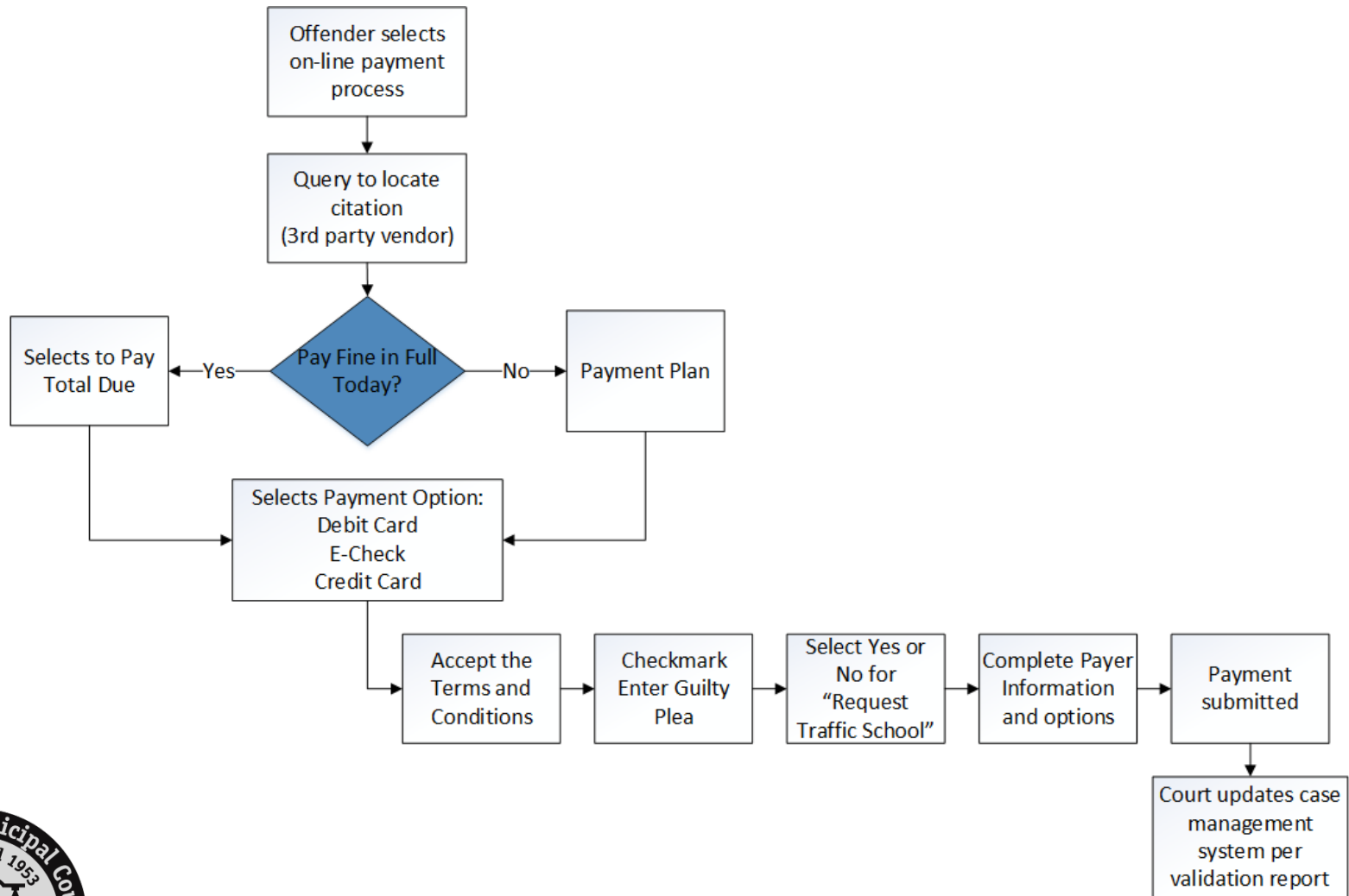

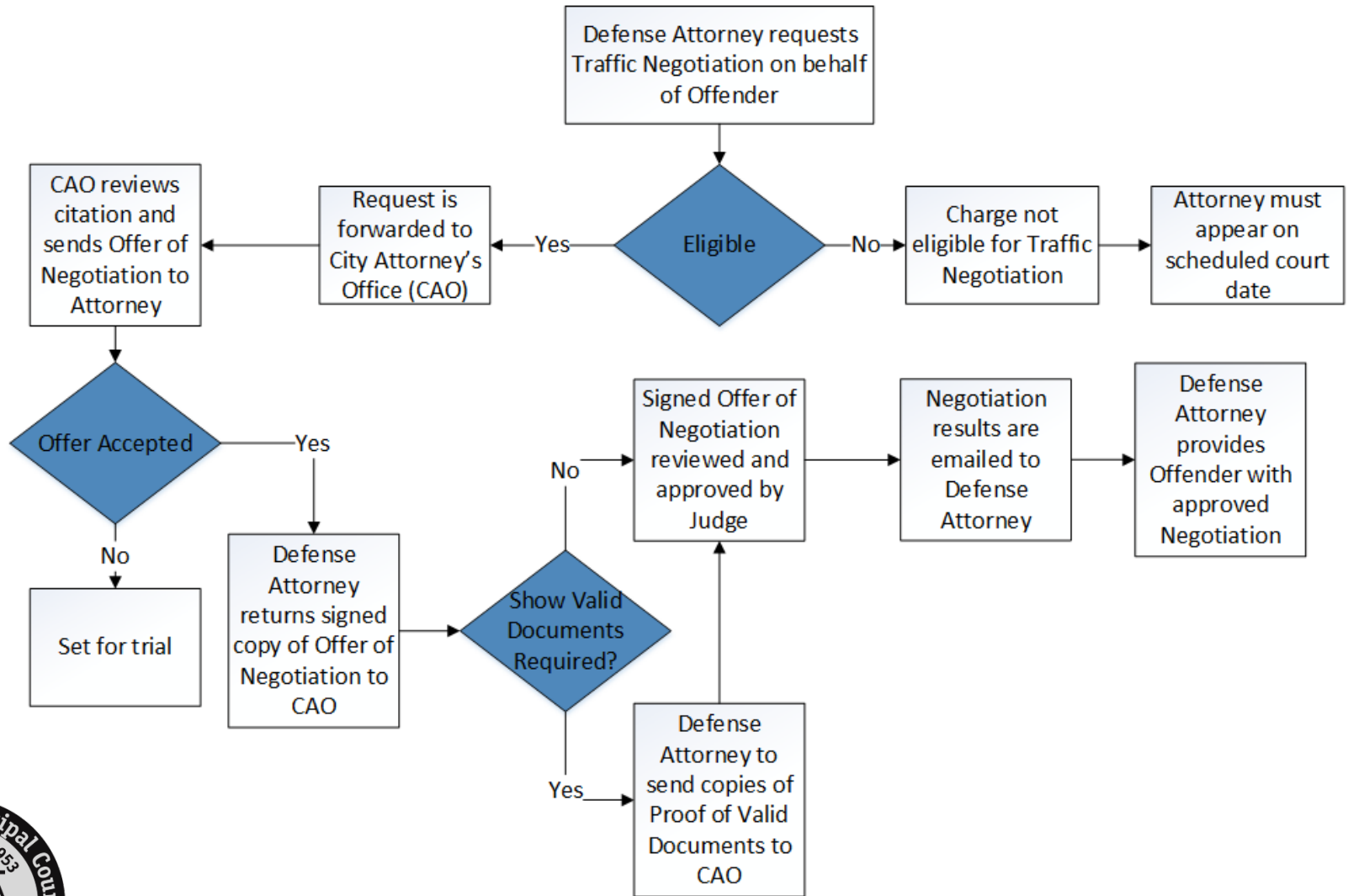
- Windshield or Window Tinting Violation

- License Plates Improperly Displayed



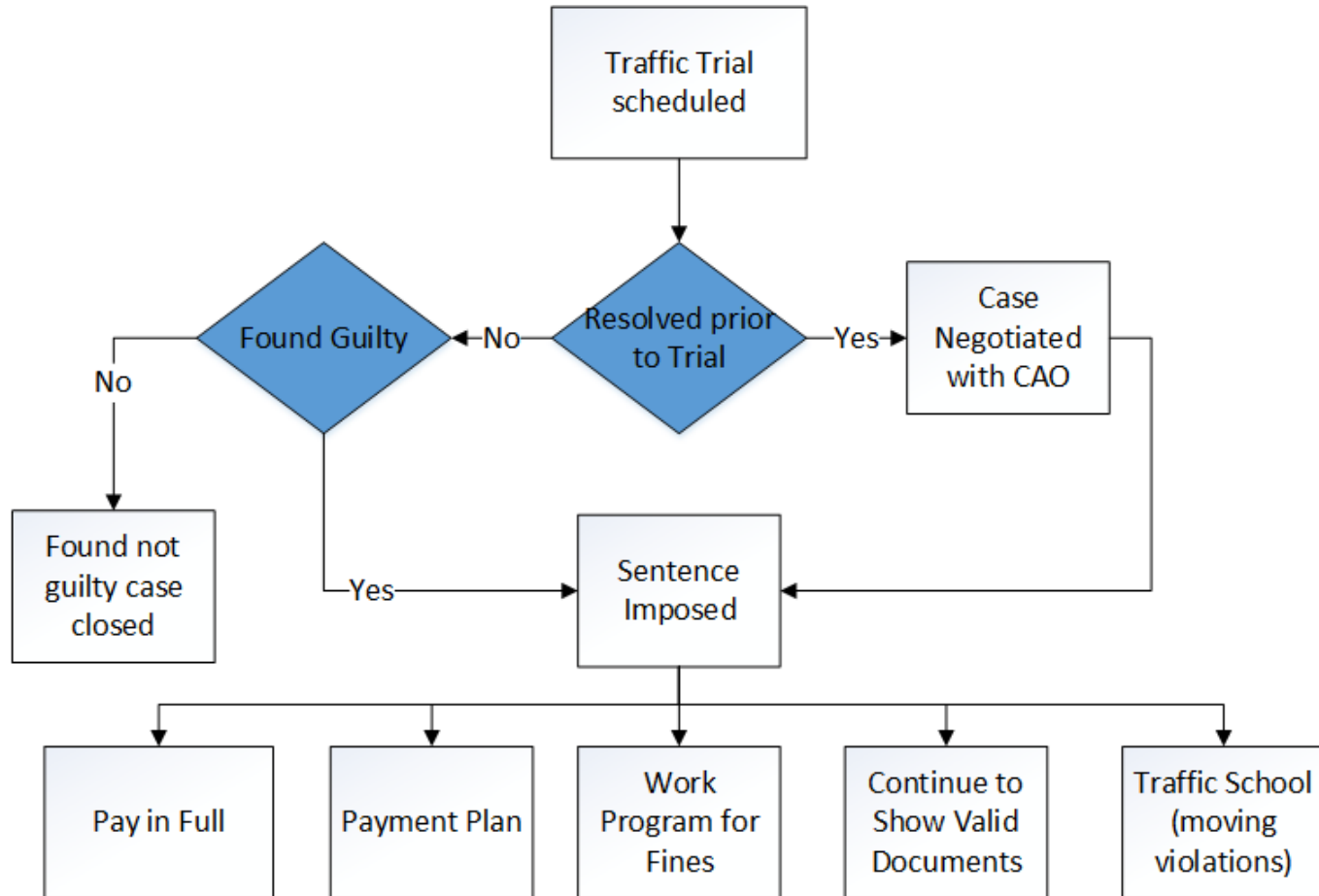

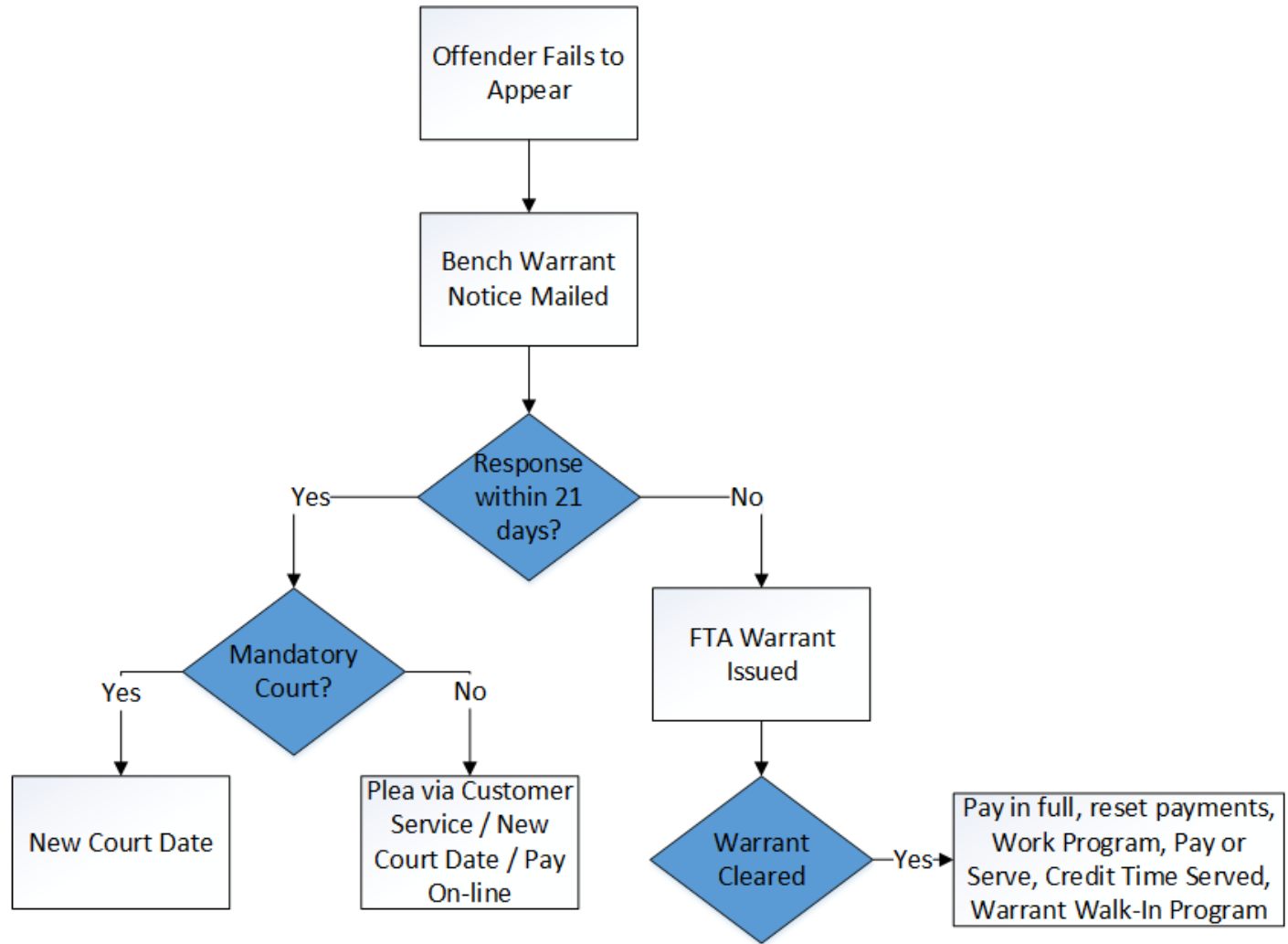
