The Future is NIBRS



“The safety of Nevadans and visitors to our state is a priority. The NIBRS system will offer law enforcement agencies more comprehensive and timely data for operations, analysis and management.”

-Governor Brian Sandoval

- While there is a perception that NIBRS reporting will show an increase in Nevada’s crime rates, in fact only 2% of Nevada crimes comprise more than one incident
- The NIBRS program has the support of the Governor and DPS Director who will inform state media of the benefits of NIBRS
- Sheriffs and Chiefs will be provided with a communications toolkit to make available on local websites and for local media distribution
- Leverage learnings from other states



The NIBRS Journey

- Today, agencies report crime data in the Summary Reporting System (SRS)
- Beginning January 1, 2021, the FBI UCR Program will move to an electronic-only NIBRS methodology
- State must transition from submitting crime statistics to the FBI via SRS methodology to using the NIBRS methodology
- All law enforcement agencies submitting crime statistics will be impacted by this initiative including business process changes and upgrades to their electronic submission process.
- The transition is necessary to remain in compliance with both Nevada Revised Statute [179A.075](#) and the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting requirements.

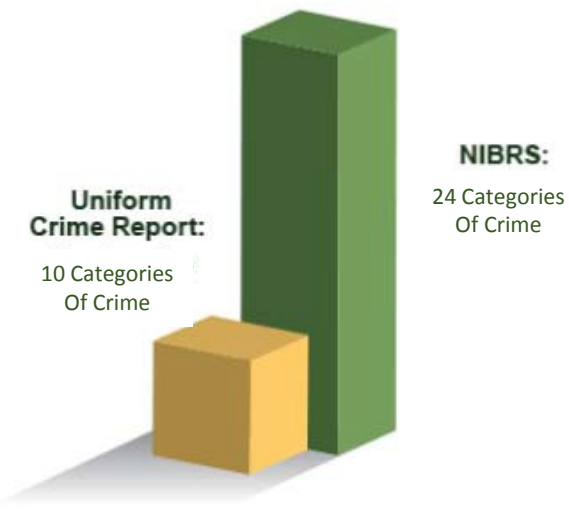


What is NIBRS?

National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

- System for recording crimes known to law enforcement and arrests
- Differs from the traditional Summary Reporting System (SRS) in the following significant ways:

Reported Crime Incident Data

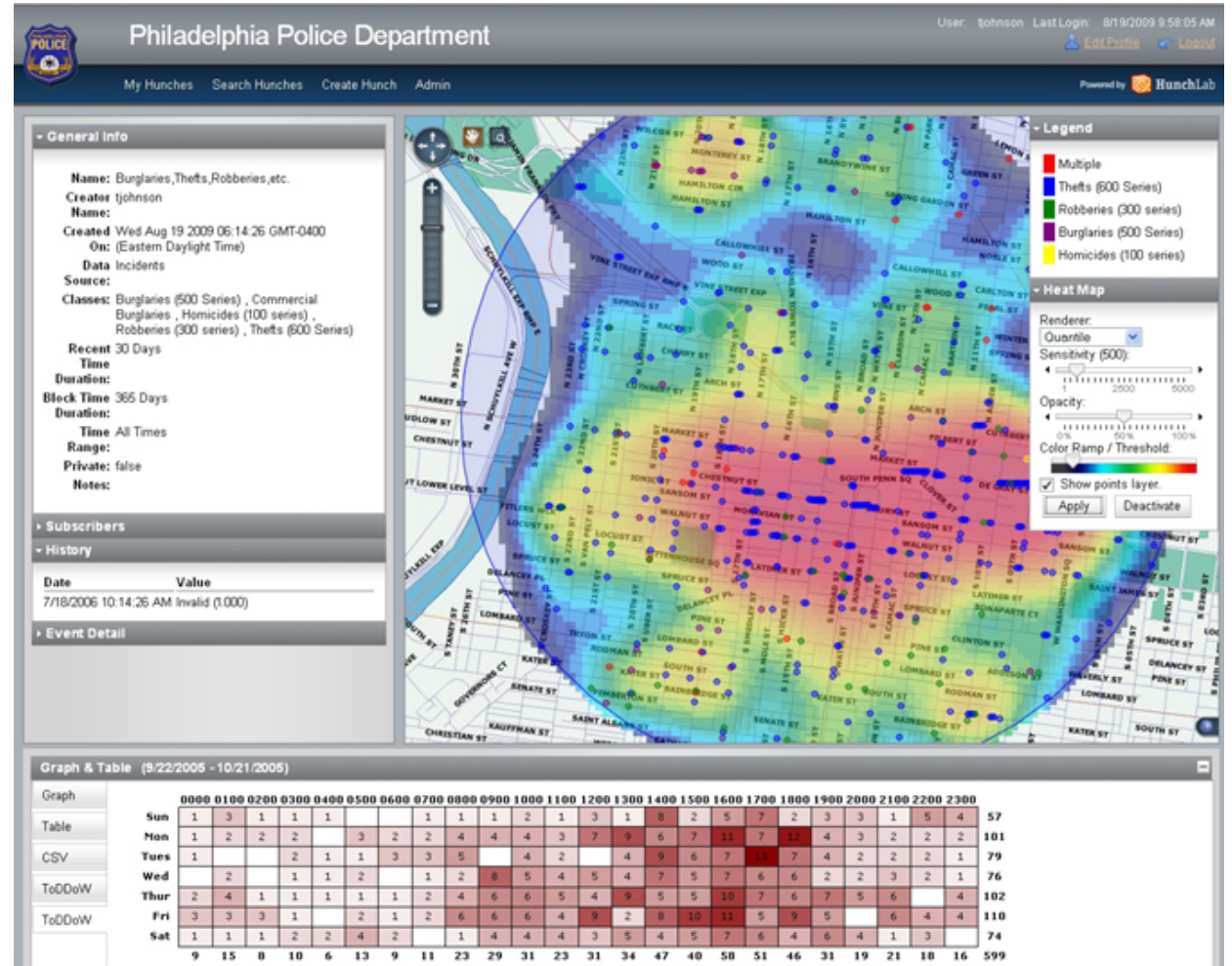


- SRS collects monthly counts by 10 categories
- NIBRS expands the 10 Index Crimes to 24 Group A categories of (52) offenses
- NIBRS was designed to collect detailed information in addition to counts of crimes and arrests
- LEAs will also report arrest information for 10 additional crimes via the Group B arrest report



Overview of Summary UCR & NIBRS

NIBRS collects offense, victim, offender, property, and arrestee information on 52 offenses and up to 10 offenses per incident and eliminates the hierarchy rule

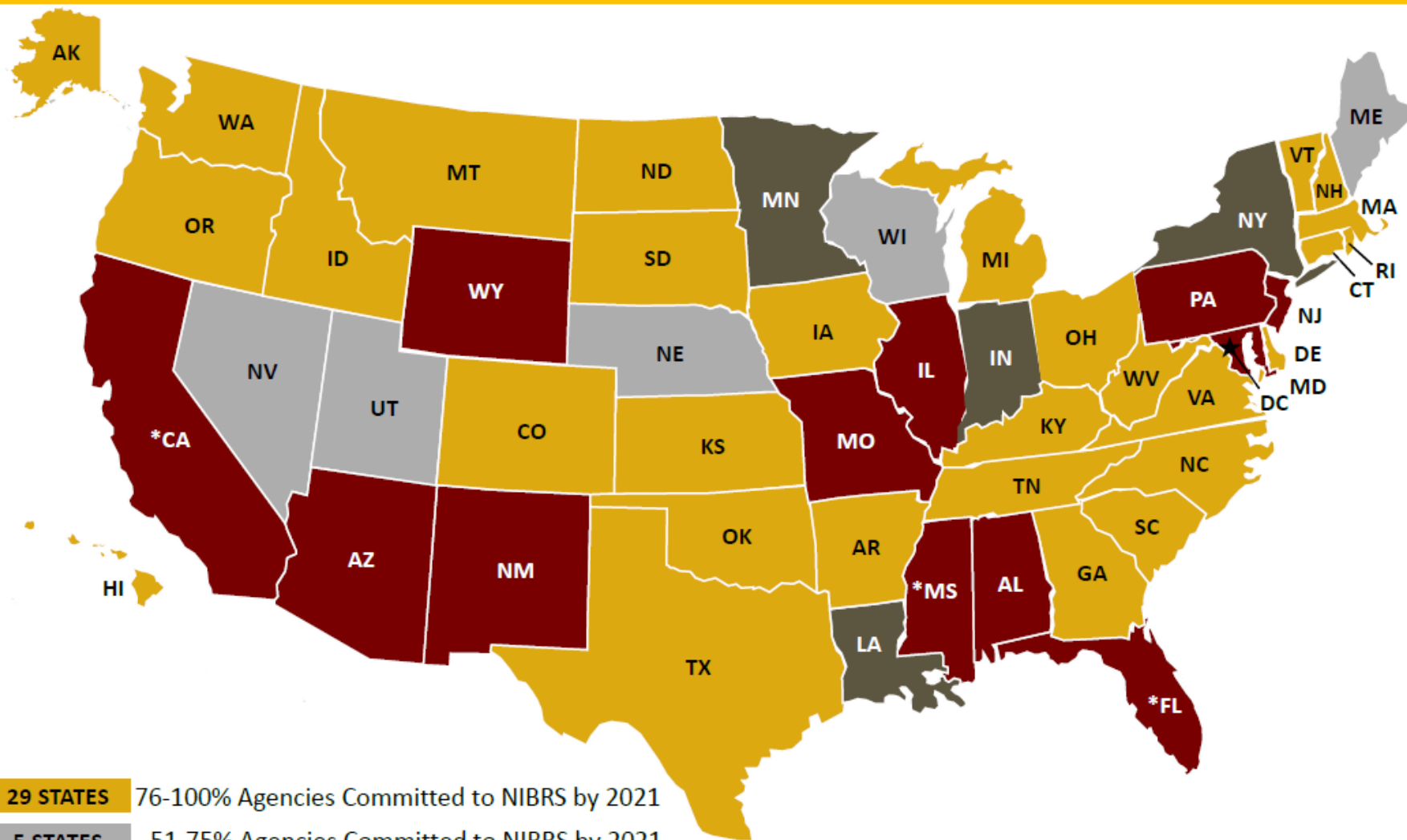




Why are we Changing to NIBRS?

- ✓ Offers law enforcement more comprehensive data than ever before for planning, training, management, and operations
- ✓ Enhances quantity, quality, and timeliness of crime data collected by law enforcement
- ✓ Improves the methodology used for compiling, analyzing, auditing, and publishing the collected crime data
- ✓ A major advantage of NIBRS, beyond the increase in data collected, is the capability to break down and combine crime offense data into specific information

4 STATES 26-50% Agencies Committed to NIBRS by 2021

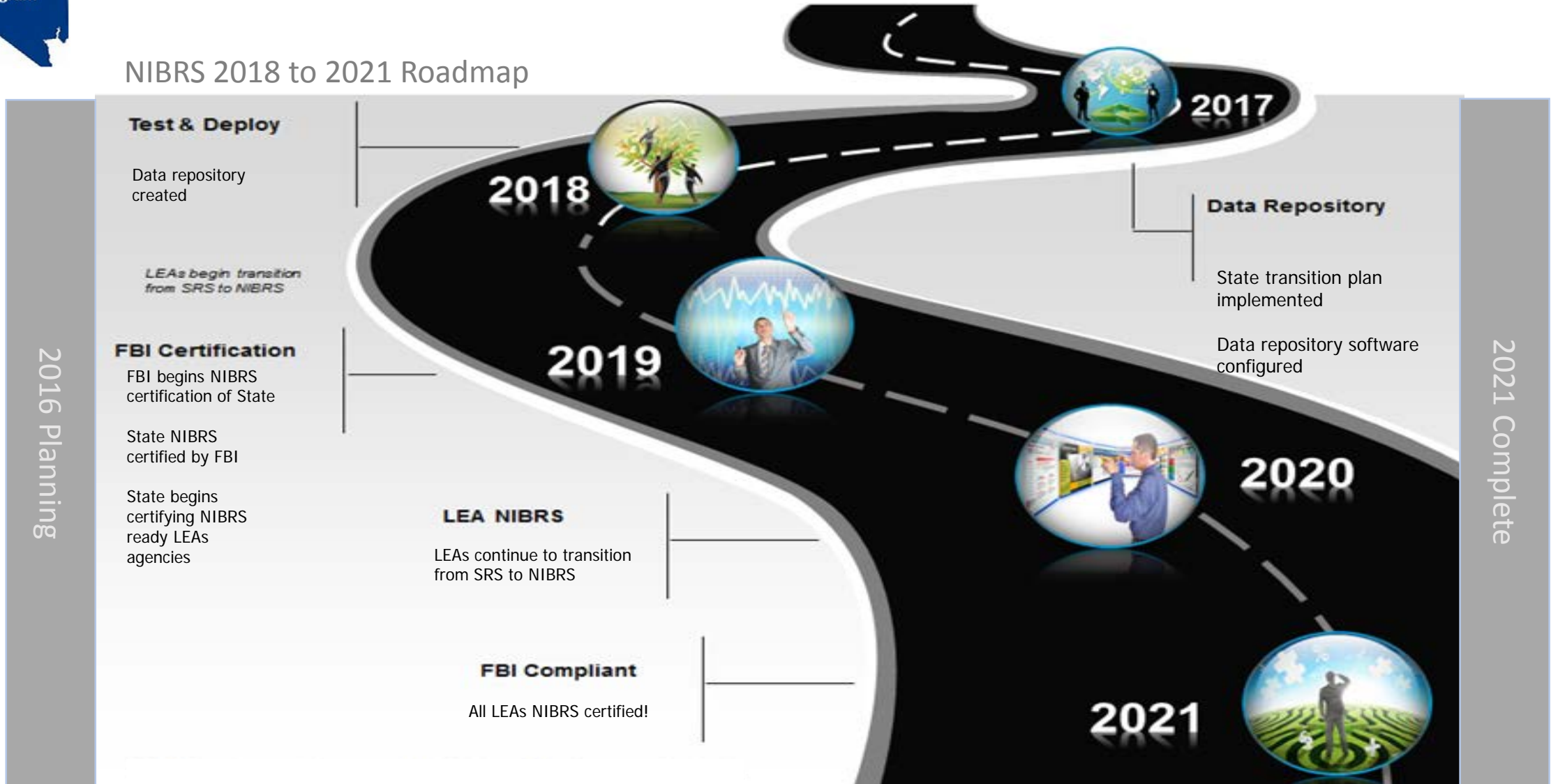

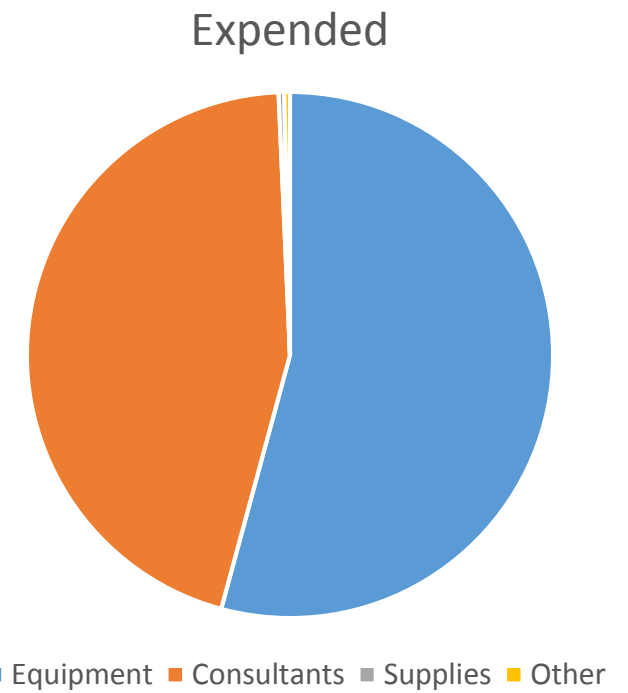

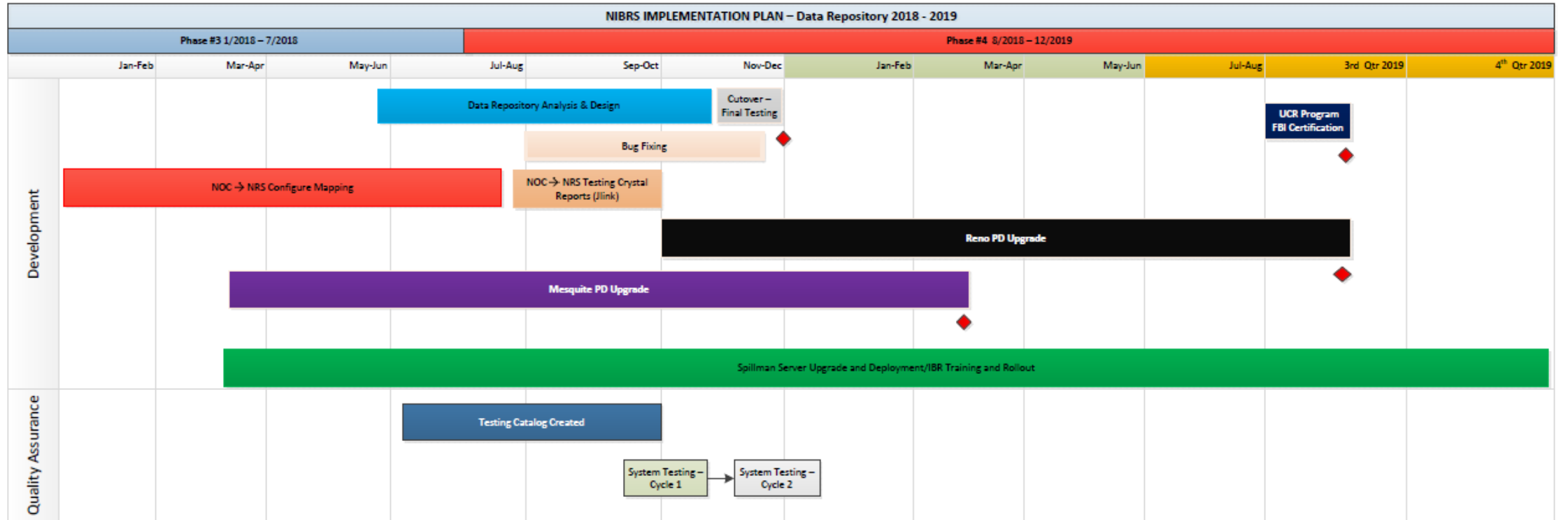

Project Update

The project is currently under budget:

- As of 08/31/18 **\$1,303,203** of **\$3,409, 064** has been expended, which is approximately **38%** of the total NCS-X Implementation grant budget *for all recipients combined*.

The project is currently on schedule:

- As of 08/31/18, we were 52% of the way through the time allocated for the project and **39%** of the project tasks have been completed which is the average *of all recipients reported schedules*.

Pilot Agencies Have Been Identified

- Mesquite PD, Reno PD, *Las Vegas Metro PD (separate grant)*

A Master Implementation Schedule is in process of development

Successfully passed FBI Audit with NO findings

Online Computer Based NIBRS Training available via NVeLearn



Funding Availability

- Limited funding will be made available to Nevada agencies through a set aside of JAG funding for federal fiscal year 2018 & potential future years
- Agencies will follow fund application process that is TBD by Office of Criminal Justice Assistance (OCJA)

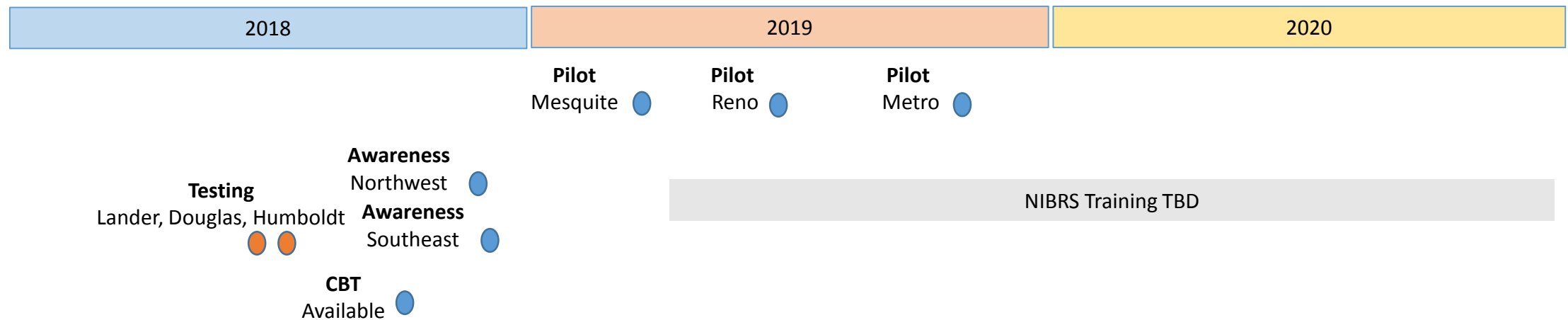




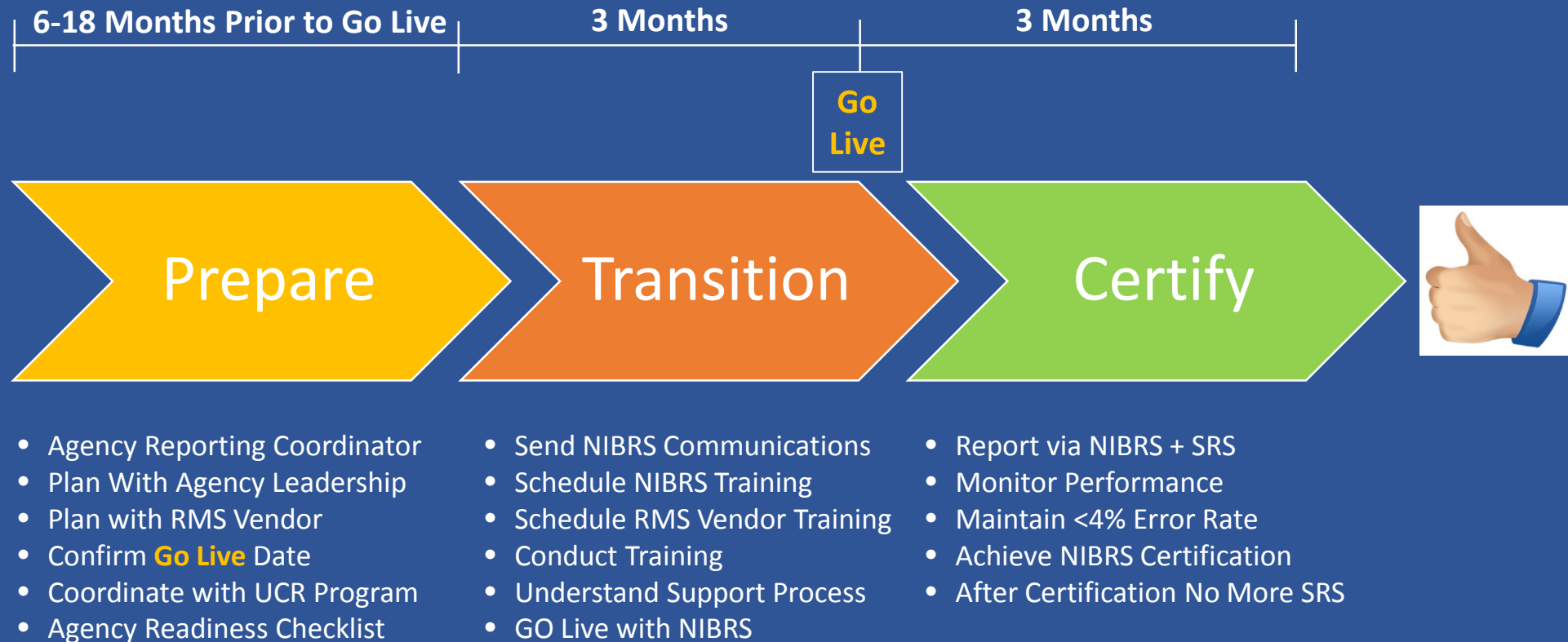
NIBRS Training

The NIBRS Program will provide training to Nevada officers and administrators over the coming 1.5 years

- Agency training provided for Pilot and Test sites (Reno, Metro, Mesquite, Lander, Douglas, Humboldt)
- Online Computer Based Training (CBT) available October 2018
- NIBRS Awareness Training in Reno and Las Vegas November 2018
- Local agency transition training available upon request

Announcements

- All agencies must be in compliance by Jan 1, 2021 deadline. Summary Data will no longer be accepted. Agencies have the option to use the portal if their software systems are not NIBRS ready by the Jan 1, 2021 date.
- Agencies that are not in compliance will NOT have their statistics included in the FBI book
- Agencies will also be out of compliance with Nevada Statute
- NIBRS Training dates in Nov (5/6 Reno & 8/9 Las Vegas)
- Nevada Agency Talkback scheduled for November 13th

Why do we have to report so much now?

- When an officer is dispatched to an address, wouldn't it be good to know how many times officers had been called to that location?
- And, if you knew that, wouldn't you like to know whether prior calls had involved a landlord-tenant dispute or a domestic violence incident?
- Wouldn't it be good to know if there were drugs involved, or a gun?
- This information has always been in the department's records, but until NIBRS created the possibility, it could not be cross-referenced and linked to display a pattern.
- And it could not be made instantly available to every officer, who could use it to make the job **safer** and more **efficient**.

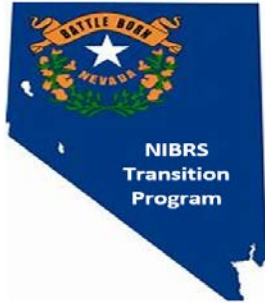

NIBRS Agency Transition to Certification

Agency Activities – Summary Only

- Assign Point Person and Conduct Assessment
- Identify Business, Technical and System Requirements
- Identify Integration & Resource Requirements
- Determine Training Requirements
- Determine Future Process and Vendor Requirements
- Determine Agency Costs (System, Installation, Conversion, Training, Operational, etc..)
- Decide on Go Live Dates – Communicate with UCR Program
- 3 Consecutive Months of Reporting with Less Than 4% Error Rate to Receive Certification

What is Nevada's transition about?	Nevada Revised Statute 179A.075 requires that local law enforcement agencies submit data to our Uniform Crime Reporting office within the Central Repository. This data is in turn submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation in alignment with their requirements. To remain in compliance with Nevada State Law and with the FBI's NIBRS standards we must transition to the new format mandated by the FBI.

What is the benefit to the local agency?

- NIBRS reflects how most law enforcement agencies currently collect information about crime and enables agencies to provide more detail about the context of crime
- NIBRS creates a level of standardization and enables agencies to more easily share and analyze information, and examine crime problems across jurisdictions
- NIBRS will enable agencies to perform advanced crime analysis for strategic and tactical purposes, and research for planning and budgeting purposes at the state level



Very slight increase in crime

The following are the effects of NIBRS on Part I crimes based on FBI research:

- Rape: No effect
- Robbery: Increased 0.6 percent
- Aggravated Assault: Increased 0.6 percent
- Burglary: Increased 1.0 percent
- Larceny: Increased 2.6 percent
- Motor Vehicle Theft: Increased 2.7 percent

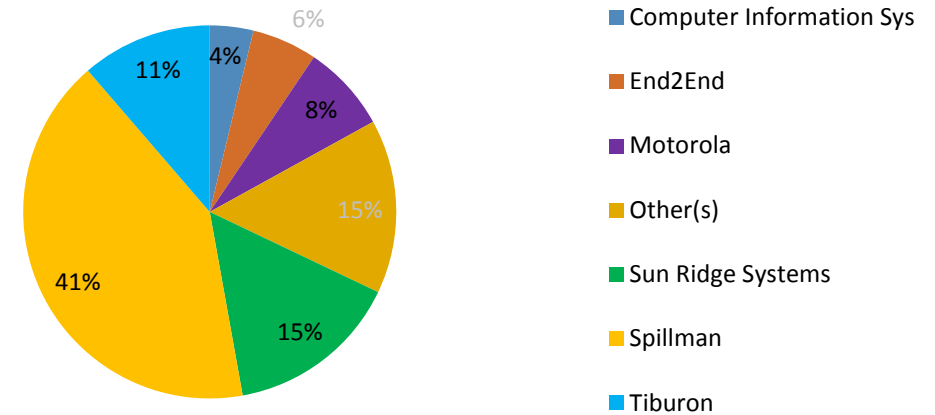

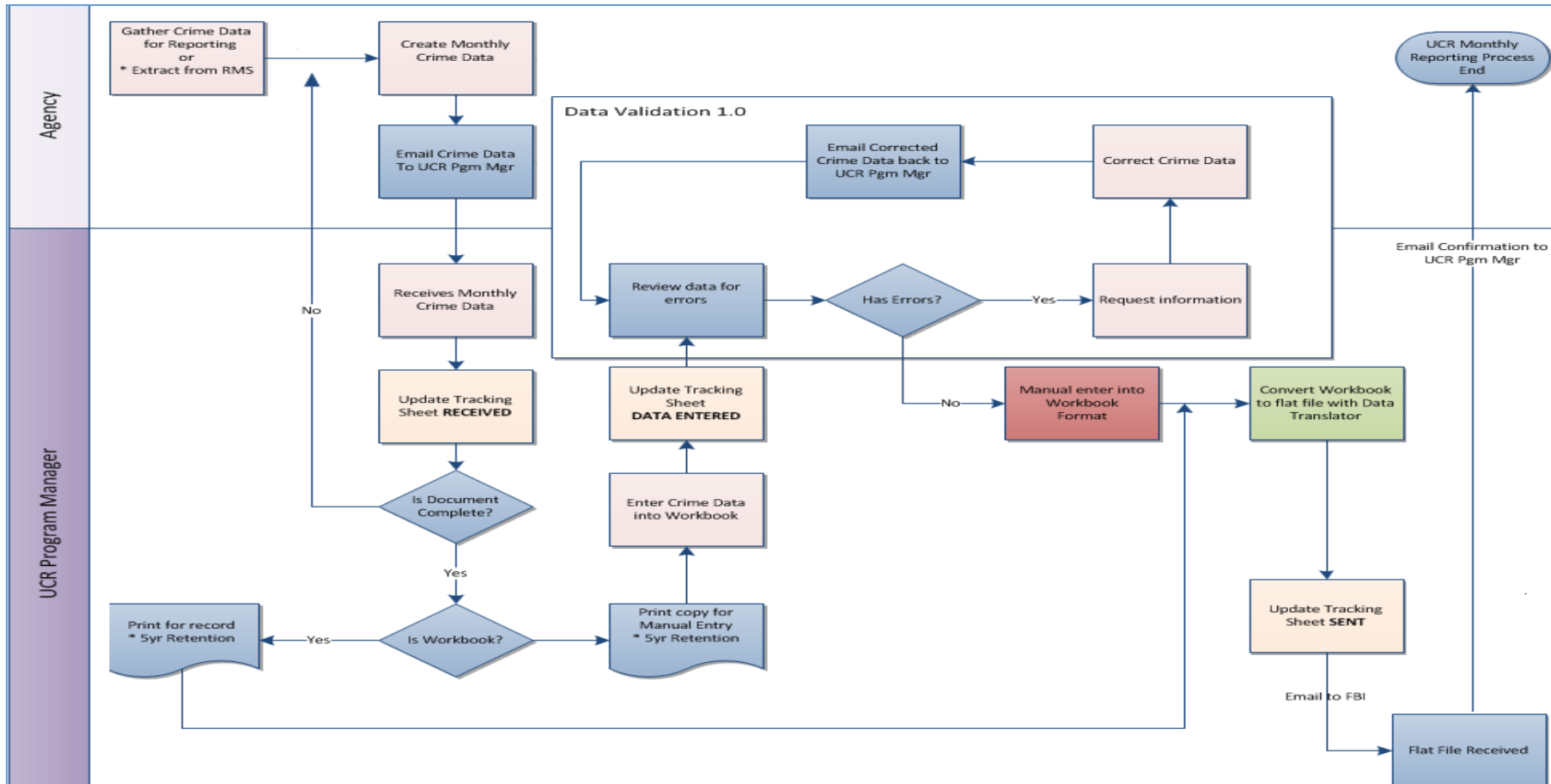


- ❖ 6 Tiburon users in Nevada representing **11%** of all our agencies
