

School Board Selection



- Vast majority of states elect local school board members.
- Florida, Indiana and Ohio are explicitly nonpartisan.
- At least 9 states have a combination of appointments and elections.

School Board Compensation



- Majority of board members are volunteers.
- Those compensated earn <\$5,000.
- State policies vary widely.
 - Mandated Base Salary
 - Permit Boards to Set Compensation
 - Limits
 - Pay Per Meeting
