Proposed Study: State "Case Studies"

- · 5-7 State case studies
 - States that are generally comparable to Nevada demographically
 - States with small and remote districts and schools
 - Detailed case study descriptions
 - · How schools are funded
 - · How ELL and at risk students are funded
 - Seek approaches that are likely to work in Nevada



Proposed Study: Improving the Existing School Funding Model

- Approach is to estimate additional costs of services for ELL, at-risk, gifted and special education – over and above the base program
- For ELL and at-risk, 3 categories:
 - Effective teachers need for salary incentive for bilingual, poverty schools, math and science
 - Extra instructional services tutoring, very small group, extended day, summer school, ESL classes
 - Additional pupil support
- Dr. Darline Robles will update the research on services for ELL and At-risk.

Proposed Study: Approach for Extra Needs

- Special education
 - · Census for mild and moderate
 - State funding for severe and profound
 - Incidence for mild and moderate can drop by 50% if services for at risk and ELL are effectively provided
- Gifted
 - Most services no extra cost
- We add \$25 per pupil for an internet enrichment approach

Proposed Study: Integrating the Evidence-Based Model

- This approach assumes existing base funding is adequate
 - If desired we can provide Evidence-Based estimates of base funding
 - Critical elements of the base funding for ELL, atrisk, gifted and special education include recommendations on class size, professional development and pupil support

Proposed Study: Cost Model

- Estimate costs of recommendations for all 17 districts
- Simulate alternative resource levels with:
 - Current base funding
 - EB base funding (if desired)
- Estimate district-by-district costs
