CONTAINS UNFUNDED MANDATE

Assembly Bill 339 adds requirements for certain annual accountability reports on pupil achievement to include information on pupils who have accrued ten or more absences within the school year, and pupils who received at least four weeks of instruction in a core academic subject by someone other than a certified teacher, unless certain prohibitions relating to the data apply. Additionally, this information should be disaggregated by gender and other groups identified in the statewide system of accountability for public schools.

Amendments: One amendment was proposed for this measure.

1. Assembly Members Miller and Torres proposed an amendment indicating that the four weeks of instruction by a person other than a certified teacher, as referenced in the bill, be specified as four consecutive weeks that occur anytime during that school year.

Conceptual Amendment for Assembly Bills 339

Submitted by Assemblywomen Brittney Miller and Selena Torres

Clarify: This bill does not enact new or additional testing or data collection. Rather, it refers to existing student achievement results in core subjects from exams administered pursuant to NRS 390.105 and college and career readiness assessments administered pursuant to NRS 390.610. It pertains only to the data that is currently reported.

Clarify: The four weeks of instruction by a person other than a certified teacher, as referenced in the bill, is specified as four consecutive weeks that occur anytime during that perspective school year.
