SENATE BILL 132

Revises provisions relating to insurance coverage for living organ donors.

(BDR 57-551)

Senate Bill 132 prohibits discrimination against a living organ donor with regard to any policy or contract of life insurance, life annuity, or health insurance on the basis of that person's status as a living organ donor alone, and without any additional actuarial risk.

In addition, the bill authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to investigate unfair trade practices that might violate the prohibition of discriminating against a living organ donor. If the Commissioner determines a person has engaged in an unfair method of competition or a deceptive trade practice, he or she may impose an administrative fine of up to \$5,000 for each violation or up to \$500 for certain licensed professionals, as well as suspending or revoking a person's license.
