I am very much concerned about the effect of SB 391 on the noon siren here in Fallon. This town's siren blows at noon each day, not because of any racial reason but to alert the citizenry as a reminder of the volunteers at the fire department. It has also alerted generations of children that it's lunchtime! There is no history of any racial or otherwise concerning issues with the Fallon noon siren. The bills, as written, would eliminate a long standing tradition in Fallon. If "sundown town" is the reason for this bill, then every town in Nevada is guilty. I have researched thoroughly the history of "sundown town" in Nevada and find that not one had an ordinance or anything "formal" but nearly all Nevada towns were "unofficially" sundown towns. Only Minden had the siren to signify this.
