QUARTERLY DISCIPLINARY REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL BUREAU

July 1, 2007-September 30, 2007

Truckee Meadows Animal Hospital April 19, 2007 TN01-011907-H217
The Board filed a complaint on January 19, 2007 following a hospital inspection. It was determined that the veterinarian in charge was allowing non-licensed personnel to perform tasks restricted to licensed veterinary technicians and there was failure to maintain adequate medical records.

The Board Order stated: 1) Truckee Meadows Veterinary Hospital shall be subject to random inspections at staff's discretion and at Licensee's expense; and 2) Pay attorney fees, investigative costs and Board costs, totaling \$400.00 and pay an administrative fine of \$1000.00.

Kristen Clark, DVM March 23, 2007

That on or about January 19, 2007, information had come to the attention of the Board that Dr. Clark had allegedly violated provisions of Chapter 638 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) regarding allegations including, but not limited to acquiring a controlled substance from a pharmacy or other source by misrepresentation, fraud, deception, or subterfuge. Dr. Clark voluntarily surrendered her license to practice veterinary medicine.

James McKasson, DVM July 12, 2007 MR-01040407-1582

A consumer complaint was filed with the Board on April 4, 2007. The complaint was investigated and it was determined that the License had violated Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 638.045 (1), Negligence, a departure from the standard of practice of veterinary medicine, in that the Licensee did not inform the owner of the condition of her horse or the potential for euthanasia; and 2) NAC 638.0475 (i), in that there was insufficient information in the medical record to justify the diagnosis or determination of the medical status of the animal and to warrant any treatment recommended for or administered to the animal.

The Board Order stated that the Licensee must pay attorney fees, investigative costs and Board costs, totaling \$400.00.

Lisa Hayden, DVM June 22, 2007 HR-01-062007-596

A consumer complaint was filed with the Board on June 22, 2007. The complaint was investigated and it was determined that the License had violated NRS 638.140 (6) negligence in the surgery performed. Specifically, during a routine ovariohysterectomy the colon was transected and the right ureter was ligated. The colon dehisced resulting in peritonitis and the ligation of the ureter resulted in the removal of a kidney; and 2) acquiring a controlled substance from a pharmacy or other source by misrepresentation, fraud, deception, or subterfuge and having an addiction to a controlled substance. Dr. Hayden voluntarily surrendered her license to practice veterinary medicine.
