ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE

STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 639.070.

Section 1. Chapter 639 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. The president, secretary or general counsel of the board may waive any of the requirements set forth in any regulation adopted by the board governing the practice of pharmacy if a federal, state or local official authorized to issue a declaration of emergency concerning the health and welfare of the general public submits a notice of such declaration of emergency to the board.
- 2. If the president, secretary or general counsel of the board issues a waiver pursuant to subsection 1, he shall:
- (a) Provide written notification of the waiver, identifying the requirements of the applicable regulations that have been waived, any conditions of the waiver and the period of the waiver, to each pharmacy, pharmacist or other person to whom the board deems necessary to effectuate the waiver; and
- (b) Provide written notification of the termination of the waiver, by the most accessible and efficient means, to the same persons that were provided a written notification of the waiver pursuant to paragraph (a).

Comments were solicited from affected businesses through posting of public notices in the county courthouses, by direct mailings to all interested persons who have requested notices of board of pharmacy meeting agendas and by direct mailings to professional and trade associations.

There was no response from affected businesses relative to this proposed regulation.

4. IF THE REGULATION WAS ADOPTED WITHOUT CHANGING ANY PART OF THE PROPOSED REGULATION, A SUMMARY OF THE REASONS FOR ADOPTING THE REGULATION WITHOUT CHANGE.

The proposed regulation was adopted without change as no testimony was offered.

The Board of Pharmacy is not aware of any similar regulations of other state or government agencies that the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates.

8. IF THE REGULATION INCLUDES PROVISIONS WHICH ARE MORE STRINGENT THAN A FEDERAL REGULATION WHICH REGULATES THE SAME ACTIVITY, A SUMMARY OF SUCH PROVISIONS.

The Board of Pharmacy is not aware of any similar regulations of the same activity in which the federal regulation is more stringent.

9. IF THE REGULATION PROVIDES A NEW FEE OR INCREASES AN EXISTING FEE, THE TOTAL ANNUAL AMOUNT THE AGENCY EXPECTS TO COLLECT AND THE MANNER IN WHICH THE MONEY WILL BE USED.

This regulation does not provide a new or increase of fees.
