ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION ON PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS IN EDUCATION

Statutory Authority: NRS 391.019

NAC 391.0535 Denial of license to certain person licensed or certified in another state. (NRS 391.019, 391.032)

- 1. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall not issue a license pursuant to this chapter to a person who holds a license or certificate to teach issued by another state that is suspended, revoked or otherwise restricted pursuant to a disciplinary action in the other state.
- 2. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may suspend, pending a hearing before the State Board of Education, in accordance with NRS 391, any standard license that has been suspended, revoked or otherwise restricted pursuant to a disciplinary action in the another state in accordance with the regulations outlined in NRS 391.330.
- 3. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may invalidate any non-renewable license that has been suspended, revoked or otherwise restricted pursuant to a disciplinary action in another state.

The Commission on Professional Standards in Public Education adopted the regulation language with amendments at the public hearing held January 13, 2005. The reason for adopting the proposed regulation is to add language that allows the Superintendent of Public Instruction to suspend, pending a hearing before the State Board of Education, any standard license that has been suspended, revoked or otherwise restricted pursuant to a disciplinary action in another state and allow the Superintendent of Public Instruction to invalidate any non-renewable license that has been suspended, revoked or otherwise restricted pursuant to a disciplinary action in another state.
