# EMERGENCY REGULATION OF THE DIVISION OF STATE PARKS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

#### **LCB File No. E002-10**

#### (Effective for 120 days from April 1, 2010)

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [comitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-18, NRS 407.0475 and 407.065.

- **Section 1**. Chapter 407 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto the provision set forth as Sections 2-4, inclusive, of this regulation.
- **Section 2.** Chapter 407.050 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows: Permits for senior citizens and commercial photography; miscellaneous fees. (NRS 407.0475, 407.065)
- 1. The Division will issue a permit for senior citizens to a resident of Nevada who applies for such a permit if the resident:
  - (a) Is 65 years of age or older;
- (b) Has continuously resided in this State for the 5 years immediately preceding the date on which the resident submits the application;
  - (c) Pays a [\$15] \$30 administrative fee;
  - (d) Provides proof of age and residence in Nevada to the Division; and
- (e) Possesses a Nevada driver's license or an identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

- 3. For commercial bus tours, the Division will charge and collect the established entrance fee or [\$1] \$2 per person, whichever is greater, or the fee established by a special use permit. A special use permit may provide for monthly billings.
- 4. For each day or partial day that a person engages in commercial photography in a park, the Division will charge and collect the following fee according to the total number of vehicles or the total number of persons, whichever results in a higher fee:

2 to 5 vehicles or 6 to 25 persons.

6 to 10 vehicles or 26 to 50 persons.

11 to 15 vehicles or 51 to 75 persons.

The Division will waive the entrance fee for the park upon payment of the fee for a commercial use permit for photography.

- 5. A person who has obtained a commercial use permit for photography may request that the Division reserve an area within the park for use in accordance with the terms of the permit. Upon receipt of such a request, the Division will charge and collect a reservation fee of \$100. The reservation fee is in addition to any fee charged and collected pursuant to subsection 4.
  - 6. The Division will not charge a fee pursuant to this section for:
  - (a) Commercial photography engaged in by one to five persons in a single vehicle; or
- (b) Photography engaged in for noncommercial, educational purposes, to promote the park or to report news in any form of media, including, without limitation, newspapers and television.
- 7. If a user of a park does not deposit the required fee in the available self-service devices, the Division:
  - (a) Will charge the user a fee of \$2 for collection service, in addition to other fees; and
  - (b) May file criminal charges against the user for theft as defined in NRS 205.0832.
- 8. For each special use permit or commercial use permit, the Division will charge a processing fee of \$25 in addition to any other fee charged for the permit.
- 9. The Division will reduce by \$1 any entrance fee established pursuant to this chapter charged to a person who holds a disability placard and presents it upon entrance to a park.
- **Sec. 3.** NAC 407.052 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 407.052 1. A person who applies for a multipurpose annual permit for the use of:
- (a) Lahontan State Recreation Area will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$175] \$200.
- (b) South Fork State Recreation Area, Rye Patch State Recreation Area or Wild Horse State Recreation Area will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$125] \$150.
- 2. A person who applies for a multipurpose annual boating permit for the use of:
- (a) Lake Tahoe Nevada State Park will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$175] \$200.
- (b) Rye Patch State Recreation Area or Washoe Lake State Park will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$90] \$100.
- (c) Wild Horse or South Fork State Recreation Areas will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$90] \$100.
- (d) Big Bend of the Colorado State Recreation Area will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$100] \$125.
- 3. A permit issued pursuant to subsection 1 authorizes the holder of the permit to enter, camp in and boat in the park for which it is issued without paying the entrance, camping and boating fees imposed by NAC 407.055.
- 4. A permit issued pursuant to subsection 2 authorizes the holder of the permit to enter and boat in the park or parks for which it is issued without paying the entrance and boating fees imposed by NAC 407.055.
- **Sec. 4.** NAC 407.055 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 2. A person who pays an entrance fee pursuant to subsection 1 is not authorized to use the facilities of the park from 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. unless the person also pays the camping fee for the park.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Division will charge and collect from each person who rides a bicycle or horse, walks or enters by vessel into a park an entrance fee of \$1. The Division will charge and collect from each person who rides a bicycle into Spooner Management Area an entrance fee of \$2.

- 4. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Division will not charge a fee for any vehicle that is towed into a park to provide transportation within the park.
- 5. The Division will charge, in addition to any other fee imposed pursuant to this chapter, a fee of \$2 for each watercraft in excess of two that is transported into the park by a single vehicle.
- 6. If a person purchases an annual permit to a park for a vehicle, the person may purchase at the same time a second annual permit to the same park at a discounted price equal to one-half of the price of the annual permit. The annual permit purchased at a discounted price must be for a vehicle registered to the same owner at the same residence as the owner of the vehicle for which the permit was purchased at regular price.

The total annual amount collected as a result of these changes will be approximately \$1,086,000 annually. Provisions in Section 6 and 9 of Assembly Bill 6 from the 2010 Special Sessions set forth that a \$1,086,000 reduction will be made from the general fund appropriation that supports Sate Parks, to be replaced with additional money collected through an adjustment in fees. The additional fees will be collected by way of the existing park collection system.

#### **Statement of Emergency**

As the Administrator of the Division of State Parks I am responsible for implementing the budgets that have been submitted and approved by the Governor and the Legislature. Assembly Bill No. 6, Chapter 10, was passed in the 26'h Special Session of the Legislature. The Governor signed the bill on March 12,2010.

Section 6 of the bill makes a \$1,086,000 reduction in the appropriation from the State General Fund to the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources-Division of State Parks for the fiscal year beginning July 1,2010, and ending June 30, 2011. Section 9 authorizes the expenditure of \$1,086,000 of fees collected beginning July I, 2010, and ending June 30, 20 II. Assembly Bill 6 did not take into consideration the seasonal nature of State Parks fee collection on a calendar versus fiscal year basis. The primary visitor season for State Parks begins April I, with the highest sales of season and senior passes taking place at that time. Experience has shown that fee adjustments in State Parks are most successful and cause the fewest disruptions and misunderstandings with the general public when put in place at the beginning of the season. A July I implementation would be mid-season for most parks statewide and would, thereby, require park patrons to adjust the amount to which they had already become accustomed earlier in the same season. Additionally, three and a half months of potential revenue generation will be lost. With the recent special session and the accompanying discussions, the state fiscal issues are still fresh in minds of the public and the highest acceptance to change is possible. The further from the special session that change is made, the more likely it becomes for a negative reaction against all parties involved in the change.

It is unlikely that State Parks can collect \$1,086,000 as authorized by the Legislature due to the fact that fees are accounted for on a calendar rather than a fiscal year basis (i.e. six months in advance, which would only leave six months to collect the required fees, unless emergency action is taken so that the fee increase goes into effect on April I). Given the passage of AB 6 during the 26th Special Session of the Legislature and the clear intent to decrease the general fund appropriation to State Parks and allow the funds to be replaced with additional funds to be collected in the same amount, I hereby declare an emergency exists pursuant to NRS 233B.0163.

Therefore, I request the Governor of the State of Nevada endorse this Statement of Emergency so that State Parks can adjust fees effective April 1,2010, so as to be able to better replace the reduction in its general fund appropriation.
