A Note About the Statistics in This Document

With the exception of summary age data on page 2, median household income data, and voter registration data on page 29, the statistical information displayed in this document was extracted from the United States Bureau of the Census's 2017–2021 5-Year American Community Survey (ACS), which became available on December 8, 2022. The ACS provides estimates of demographic, economic, housing, and social characteristics for numerous geographies every year, including five-year period estimates that describe the characteristics of an area over a specific period of time, rather than for a specific point in time. Therefore, these data may not be comparable with point-in-time estimates. Additional information about the ACS is available at: https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/acs.

In this document, we have used estimates that the Bureau of the Census has compiled at the block group and tract levels, as well as the state level for Nevada and corresponding national data. While the Bureau of the Census typically compiles ACS data at the legislative district level, the 2017–2021 5-Year ACS data was not available for the new legislative district boundaries resulting from the 2021 redistricting cycle. Therefore, we have used geographic information system (GIS) software to aggregate data at the block group or tract level to the new legislative district level. It should be noted that this is an imperfect method, as some block groups and tracts reside in multiple legislative districts and their data values must be allocated across such districts using a method that assumes even distribution of population types throughout a block group or tract, which may not necessarily be the case.

Because certain information was unavailable from the ACS, median household income data and summary age data—including median age and certain dependency ratios—were obtained from the 2022 Updated Demographics data set prepared by Esri, a GIS software provider. Figures for active voters were obtained from the website of Nevada's Secretary of State on January 3, 2023. The Secretary of State updates these figures on a regular basis. 



Chart 1—Population Distribution by Age






Chart 3—Child Dependency

Chart 4—Old-Age Dependency Ratio***



Chart 5—Population by Race



Chart 6—Population by Hispanic or Latino Origin



Chart 8—Labor Force Participation Rate*





Chart 9—Labor Force Participation Rate* by Gender







Chart 11—Class of Workers*





Chart 12—Percentage of Households at Various Income Levels





Chart 13—Monthly Housing Costs as a Percentage of Household Income**





Chart 14—Percentage of Households Receiving Food Stamps/SNAP





Chart 15—Percentage of the Population With Incomes Below 100% of the Poverty Level



Chart 16—Poverty Level by Age Group





Chart 18—Poverty Level by Hispanic or Latino Origin



Chart 20—Methods of Travel to Work





Chart 21—Percentage of Car, Truck, or Van Commuters Who Drove Alone Versus Carpooled





Chart 24—Percent Uninsured




Chart 25—Uninsured Population by Age Group







Chart 29—Home Occupancy





Chart 30—Tenancy of Occupied Housing Units






