

MINUTES OF MEETING - ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY, 54th Session, March 2, 1967

Meeting was called to order at 11:20

SB 203: Provides for transfer of supervision of trusts to other judicial districts.

Mr. Hilbrecht moved to approve amendment put in by Mr. Ray Knisley
Miss Dungan seconded
Motion passed unanimously

AB 316: Adds glue or cement containing toluene to schedule of poisons and regulates sale and labeling of such poisons.

MR. SCHOUWEILER: The bill includes in the list of poisons "glue" that is used for sniffing. It would preclude sales to persons under 18 years of age.

MR. SWACKHAMER: The problem for the clerks is to tell whether the customer is 18 or not.

MISS DUNGAN: Is there any way to make airplane glue without this particular poison?

MR. TORVINEN: Not now, with the new plastic models. At some stores in Reno they put the stuff in a drawer. After you have picked out your model, you have to find a clerk to get the glue for you.

MR. WOOSTER: What is the penalty?

MR. SCHOUWEILER: It would automatically be a misdemeanor.

Mr. Lowman moved Do Pass AB 316

MR. KEAN: I wonder about the garden varieties of poisons that are all over the place.

MR. TORVINEN: They are all labeled.

MR. HILBRECHT: Why don't we just take out section 5?

MR. SCHOUWEILER: The State Board of Pharmacy is concerned with this stuff being in airplane glue and not being labeled properly. This is just a labeling law.

MR. WOOSTER: Under section 4: What are those provisions?

MR. SCHOUWEILER: Sets out what has to be set out on label.

MR. HILBRECHT: (After reading the provisions referred to) Isn't that rather cumbersome for a tube of glue?

MR. SCHOUWEILER: Let's just make it subject to this one provisions, the labeling one.

MR. WOOSTER: How about making it subject only to the labeling section, then deleting section 5?

MR. SWACKHAMER: A question I have always wondered about: How are these people who sell this stuff going to know that we have passed this bill? This is something I have always wondered about.

MISS DUNGAN: The manufacturers are the ones that have to get the label.

MR. SCHOUWEILER: Maybe we should hold the bill until Monday so we can look into some of these things.

MR. WOOSTER: We will hold the bill, subject to a subcommittee of Mr. Schouweiler.

AB 318: Prohibits inhaling and ingesting of dangerous drugs.

MISS DUNGAN: How about that word "drug" in section 1?

MR. KEAN: Did the lawyers agree that there absolutely has to be intent proved here?

MISS DUNGAN: I am talking about the word "use" on line 3. The penalty is a misdemeanor. Is this going to reduce some other penalties?

MR. HILBRECHT: We are passing a prohibition bill here.

MR. WOOSTER: We will assign AB 318 to a subcommittee of Mr. Schouweiler so he can re-consider these points.
