

<u>MR. TORVINEN</u>: Sometimes the D.A., even before he gets the name of the case, will want to preserve a witness and he can't do it without this bill. That is the issue.

<u>MR. HILBRECHT:</u> In Franklin's office, the pressure is no more than for a man handling two or three cases. The deputies handle the cases.

MR. KEAN: I talked to Franklin in the hall and he said he did not care if we gave it to both.

Mr. White moved Do Pass <u>SB 515</u> Mr. Torvinen seconded The Motion carried, with Wooster, Lowman, White, Torvinen, and Schouweiler voting Aye and Kean, Hilbrecht, and Dungan voting No

SB 499: Clarifies law relating to liens of trailer park keeper.

Mr. Kean moved Do Pass <u>SB 499</u> Mr. Lowman seconded Motion passed unanimously

SB 385: Expands and clarifies municipal court duties, power, and jurisdiction.

<u>MR. WOOSTER</u>: This was introduced March 7th and we just got it today. I talked to George Ogilvie and he says the meat of the bill is section 8 "Trial and proceedings before the Aunicipal court shall be summary and without a jury."

<u>MR. TORVINEN</u>: I have read the bill a couple of times. At the top of page 4, an amendment is necessary.

MR. WOOSTER: We will hold it until tomorrow, as requested by Mr. Hilbrecht.

Mr. Lowman asked the members of the committee to look over the Senate amendments to <u>AB 438</u>, the CATV bill. He said he had studied them and they are all right. He suggested the committee concur.

There were no objections.
