JUDICIARY CONTITTEE

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD FEBRUARY 21, 1957

A meeting of the Judiciary Committee was held at 2:50 P.M. Tuesday, February, 21, 1967, in Committee Room 56, State Capitol, Chairman Monroe presiding.

Chairman Monroe read the summaries of certain Bills that the Committee had been asked to introduce by the Board of Governors, State Bar Association. The Committee gave unanimous consent to the introduction of the Bills.

Chairman Monroe reminded the Committee of the Joint Meeting scheduled for March 1st, relative to the insurance legislation.

S.B. 118 "Limits peace officers in divulging information concerning juvenile cases."

Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Young, seconded by Senator Swobe, it was unanimously agreed to "Hold over S.B. 118."

S.B. 121 "Requires coroners to be physicians in certain townships."

The difficulty in obtaining the services of licensed physicians to perform the duties of a coroner was discussed.

Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Swobe, seconded by Senator Young, it was unanimously agreed to "Hold over <u>S.B. 121</u>."

S.B. 163 "Provides construction standards for mobile homes and travel traile

Senator Swobe commented that he had had an amendment prepared, however, the Bill is being studied by interested trailer manufacturing people.

Disposition: It was agreed, by consent, to Hold over S.B. 163.

S.B. 171 "Clarifies procedure on appeal from Municipal Court to District Court."

> Senator Swobe read a letter address to Senator Farr from District Attorney Mm. Raggio which urged passage. Chairman Monroe will consult with Mr. Daykin.

Disposition: It was agreed, by consent, to Hold over S.B. 171.

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S.B. 180 "Prohibits solicitation of automobile repairs and towing service on highways."

> Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Swobe, seconded by Senator Christensen, it was unanimously agreed to "Do Pass S.B. 180."

S.B. 200 "Permits general improvement districts to issue revenue bonds for construction of and regulate use of recreation facilities."

Senator Dodge commented that he anticipated the submission of a Master Improvement District Bill and suggested that this Bill be considered at the same time.

Disposition: ON NOTION of Senator Dodge, seconded by Senator Symbe, it was unanimously agreed to "Hold over S.B. 200."

S.J.R. 12 "Proposes to gmend Nevada Constitution by authorizing sessions of Supreme Court outside Carson City."

> Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Dodge, seconded by Senator Swobe, it was unanimously agreed to "Hold over <u>S.J.R.</u> 12."

5.J.R.13 "Proposes to gmend Nevada Constitution by broadening provision for designation of pro tempore justices in case of temporary absence of regular justices."

Disposition: It was agreed, by consent, to "Heid over S.J.R. 13."

S.B. 203 "Provides for transfer of supervision of trusts to other judicial districts."

Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Subbe, seconded by Senator Dodge, it was unanimously agreed to "Do Pass S.B. 203."

Chairman Monroe mentioned that <u>S.B.</u> 209 and <u>S.B.</u> 211 which have been intoduced by the Education Committee had been referred for consideration. However, it was agreed to give the Bills more study before consideration.

S.B. 7 "Extends preference for in-state contractors and suppliers."

Senator Dodge stated that he preferred consideration of a sliding scale rather than the flat 5%. After discussion it was agreed to amend the Bill as follows: 5% preference on amounts up to \$50,000.00; 2½% preference on amounts over \$50,000.00 to \$500,000.; 1½% on amounts over \$500,000.00.

Disposition: Chairman Monroe to ask Mr. Daykin to prepare the amendment.

Chairman Monroe requested Senator Young to make a list of the Bills to be considered at the Joint Meeting on March 1, 1967.

The meeting adjourned at 3:35 P.M.

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
