"Provides that criminal prosecutions for embezzlement, A.B. 508 fraudulent issue of stock by officers, employees of corporation may be commenced within 5 years after commission of offense."

> Senator Christensen said he is worried about the man they keep hounding, it gives them two more years to do so. Senator Dodge said Mr. Fitz of the First National Bank had called him on it and he would only go for it if they put an amendment in exempting employees of financial institutions so they won't have to go through bonding and licensing procedure.

Disposition: ON MOTION of Senator Christensen, it was agreed to hold A.B. 508.

A.B. 443 "Adopts 1964 amendments to Uniform State Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act."

> Frank Daykin in to discuss -It conforms Chapter 585. When originally drafted, it was based on the Federal Pure Food and Drug Law. It picks out all the points on which the present Federal Food and Drug Law differs from our law and conforms our law to it - inter-state and intra-state. Frank was asked what department had asked for it. He thought Health and Welfare, checked and found this to be true. Senator Young said he had talked to Druggist Frank Titus, who knew nothing about the bill. He left the committee to call Mr. Titus, who said he had not found the bill yet and had not read it. is not sponsored by the drug industry. Mrs. Tyson picked it up. Senator Young said he would be in favor of holding it until someone in the profession is affected by it.

Senator Dodge, it was agreed to hold A.B. 443.

Chairman Monroe said amendments are coming on A.B. 298 and A.B. 438. They took Nevada State Police out of A.B. 298.
