Chairman Monroe announced that he planned to have an agenda form drafted to be used for future meetings.

Mr. Russell McDonald was introduced and presented the following recommendations for technical corrections for various Senate Bills.

1. Prohibits fees for recording Federal Tax Liens by Internal Revenue Service.

2. Corrects statutory reference requiring written notice of liens to Motor Vehicle Registration Division.

3. Clarifies Notary Public acknowledgment for instruments of conveyance.

4. Permits military Chaplain to perform marriages.

5. Conforms language regarding borrowing for estate of deceased persons to Uniform Commercial Code.

6. Clarifies language concerning declarations by Grand Jurors.

7. Corrects good time credit for convicts to twelve months.

Clarifies language in certain criminal procedure 8. act.

Permits females to be employed in sales of alcoholic 9. beverages.

10. Corrects obsolete reference of Supreme Court Judges, increases number of Judges from three to five.

11. Corrects Federal law reference relating to interstate compacts for supervision of parolees and probationers.

12. Corrects reference relating to revocation of a Dealers work permit.

It was unanimously agreed that the Judiciary Committee would introduce bills making the corrections.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 a. m.
