SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

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At 1:30 p.m. on January 27, 1969, Chairman Monroe called the meeting to order.

Chairman Monroe advised he had several bills presented to him by Senator Pozzi to be introduced by the Committee. They are recommendations from the Association of County Clerks and are pertaining to election laws.

- 1. Provides flexibility for designating candidates, by party or otherwise, on ballot labels.
- 2. Provides for posting of voting results.
- 3. Changes date for primary election.
- 4. Provides deadlines for submission of local questions to county clerks prior to elections.

Senator Dodge submitted an amendment for SB #9, as requested, relative to permitting an out of state ordained minister to perform marriages in the State, providing he was a relative of one of the persons he was marrying or if it was a member of his congregation. There was a general discussion directed to Senator Dodge and it was the opinion of the committee members the amendment as presented was not limited enough and should be rewritten. Senator Dodge agreed to do so.

Senator Helen Herr was presented to explain the amendments to SB #24.

Senator Herr stated she had been contacted by several teachers in the Las Vegas area, particularly athletic teachers regarding the problem of hiring uniformed officers for the various athletic functions. In the past the athletic departments found it advantageous to have uniformed officers on duty, however the District Attorney of Clark County found that this was illegal as the officers were not covered by insurance when acting in that capacity. They were off duty so not covered under the county or city policy and were not regular employees of the schools so were not included in that coverage. The officers were being paid by the schools and were "moonlighting".

Senator Dodge suggested both the schools and the city or county be contacted and their insurance coverages reviewed to see if either policy could be extended to cover the officers. There is also a possibility of duplication of coverage and that should also be investigated.

Senator Monroe advised he would contact Frank Daykin and discuss the matter with him prior to the next meeting.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 1:45 p. m.
